My dear Sir:

On receipt of your favor of March 4th I referred the matter to Mr. J.H. Wallace, Assistant Chief Engineer, who writes me that they have no maps or plats of this tunnel, but that the fault crossed the tunnel practically at right-angles. The difference in horizontal displacement was five feet with no appreciable vertical movement.

As a matter which may be of some interest he enclosed drawing showing displacement of piers of the Pajaro River bridge near Chittenden which was also in line of fault and which I also enclose for your information.

If any of the information given is made use of please give Mr. Wallace credit for it.
