Dear Sir:

I write to ask whether it would be agreeable to you that the State Earthquake Investigation Commission should have the privilege of getting an edition struck off of several of the California atlas sheets for the purpose of illustrating its report upon the recent earthquake. We should like to have an edition of probably 1,000 or 1200 of several of the atlas sheets upon which we would like to print certain data in red. Will you kindly tell me if it is agreeable to you that we should get such an edition struck off and what the cost would be and whether or not there would be any objection to our printing on the face of the sheets the fact that they are issued by the Earthquake Commission as part of their report? If we can secure from you this privilege, I will later indicate the particular sheets from which we desire editions printed. It will be desirable to state for us the cost of an edition of 1,000 or 1200 per sheet or per quadrangle.
