Dear Mr. Finney

This will call your attention to the following equipment necessary for efficient operation of the camouflage project.

1. The racks used for holding the burlap strips are inadequate in number and unsatisfactory in style. At the present time only two racks 12' long are available to cover the 40' required for each rig. We suggest that a saw horse type rack, approximately 20' long, be constructed and two issued to each crew so that complete coverage of the working area is had.
2. At the present time, only four cutting knives are on hand. This means that only four cutting crews can operate at one time. Consequently, we are unable to employ additional cutters to cut strips ahead in anticipation of opening Unit II, The present crew being able to supply present needs only.
3. A lag bolt has pulled loose from the floor in shed two and we are unable to utilize that rig.
4. Suitable containers are needed for the disposal of burlap and paper scrap which accumulates in considerable quantity during the day.
5. It is believed the cutting reels should be grounded.
6. Some provision should be made to clear the debris from in front of the ontrance gate. Workers walking over these scrap boards and other material are being subjected to an unnecessary hazard.
7. The inspection yard should be evened off and the large gravel removed. Reefing nets over this surface is extremely difficult and materially increases the time of the operation.

Will you please advise us by memorandum, at the earliest possible moment, as to your reception and entertainment of these items.
