MEMORANDUM TO: Mr. John Stahl

Camouflage Factory

This letter will authorize you to make payments to the camouflage workers on the following bases: After deductions for subsistence, victory tax, social security, and other expenses are subtracted, you are to pay the individual worker 65% of the net proceeds. The remaining 35% of the worker's wages are to be paid to the Community Council by certified check.

The above mentioned division of the worker's wages was presented in a regularly held assemblage of the councilmen. It was unanimously approved.

Roy Nakadegawa, 35-5-C, a weaver, is leaving this project immediately to go outside. I understand that he will leave tomorrow evening. Will you kindly see to it that his wages reach him before he leaves?
