MEMORANDUM TO: Mr. W. Empie

FROM: Franklyn S. Sugiyama

SUBJECT: Subsistence of 4 hour camouflage workers

Perhaps you have been informed by Mr. Kennedy that there are about a dozen or so project workers who have put in their full 8 hours time on various jobs authorized by the administration; and then, after the evening meal, these people have put in an additional 4 hour time at the camouflage factory in private employment.

Mr. Kennedy has informed me that since these people have put in their required time on their regular jobs, no deductions for subsistence will be made by your department. I understand that he has talked the matter over with you but you are awaiting the final decision from Washington. Will you kindly let me know by a memorandum what the reply to your inquiry is when it arrives.
