



[Weaver Job description]

Weaver

Under direct supervision a foreman weaves five foot burlap strips, two inches wide into fish nets suspended on counter balanced rigs dropped from the ceiling of the garnishing shed. Strips are woven into the net as per the sample which is suspended on the same rig and flush with the net to be garnished. Perfound related work. Weavers work in crews of 6 to 8.

Examples of related work.

1. Ascertaining that the net to be garnished and the sample net correspond as to size and mesh count.
2. Placing the net on the rig.
3. Taking the completed net to the inspection grounds and making required corrections as indicates by the government inspectors. (one-half the crew may do this while the other half is rigging the new net preparatory to commencing weaving)
4. Assuring that there is no waste of material

Minimum requirements; Male or female; 18 years or over. Reasonable manual dexterity; ability to stand on feet majority of working time.
