MINUTES

Committee for Responsible University Government, October 4, 1950.

The meeting was called by Chairman Jacoby at 4:00 p.m.

Present: Jacoby, Rolfe, Crouch, Kinsey, Ramsey, Hussey, Longueil, Appleman, Epling, Robbins, Durrell.

Minutes of September 6 and September 23 meeting were approved, after some amendments were made to the September 6 draft.

The treasurer reported that 170 contributors had pledged \$12,614. to date. Cash pledges paid in equaled \$5,286.90. Payments to date had been \$878.12; and cash on hand in the bank equaled \$4,408.78.

The chairman presented a draft of a follow-up letter to be sent to all members of the faculty. Several amendments were offered and agreed to. Consensus of opinion was that such letters should be sent to all members of the faculty, and that it should be made plain that no one was being singled out and "pressured."

The chairman reported on an interview with a Daily Bruin reporter. The committee members expressed satisfaction with the quality of the article and directed that a copy of it be incorporated in the minutes.

A motion was offered and carried authorizing the payment of the outstanding debts of the former Steering and Policy Committees, and of the Non-signers' Group.

A second motion authorizing the treasurer to pay Professor Caughey full salary from July 1 to October 1 and to pay Professor Saxon full salary from July 1 to September 15. Interpretation of "full salary" agreed upon was: normal contract salary, less income tax withholding, less two per cent contribution. Payment would include an amount normally deducted by the University for retirement.

The committee discussed appropriate means for distributing the various communications that have been received by the vice-chairman of the senate from other faculties. It was the consensus of the group that the chairman should request the vice-chairman of the senate to distribute copies of these communications to members of the Academic Senate, Southern Section.
