1. **AB 271—Brathwaite, Roberti.** Provides employment shall not be terminated for garnishment prior to final judgment of a court. Passed 46-19; May 14.
2. **AB 487—Brown, Burton.** Extends prohibition against discrimination against older workers to small employers. Passed 43-21; June 30.
3. **AB 555—Cullen.** Allows an employer to not immediately pay a discharged or laid-off employee. Passage refused 35-29; May 21.
4. **AB 837—Miller, Waxman, Burton, Vasconcellos, Brathwaite, Crown, Dunlap, Fong, Garcia, B. Greene, Knox, McCarthy, Roberti, Sieroty, Warren, Z'berg.** Extends FEP coverage for agricultural workers. Passed 41-11; May 28.
5. **AB 1766—Warren.** Makes it unlawful not to comply with specified provisions of law regarding employee health, welfare and safety. Passed 41-31; July 17.
6. **AB 1123—Wilson.** To permit use of tax-supported school bands at private profit promotional events. Passed 41-14; June 24.
7. **SB 273—Cologne.** Deletes mandatory requirement employees receive copies of employment applications, making them available only on request. Passed 43-25; July 24.
8. **AB 2218—Lewis.** For concurrence in Senate amendments. Deletes coverage summary on face of medical/health insurance policies. Concur: 42-20; Aug. 6.
9. **AB 75—Collier.** Tuition for state colleges and university, with deferred payments at high interest. Adopted 41-23; July 14.
10. **SB 1192—Coombs.** "Economic productivity." To impose government into collective bargaining on behalf of management. Vote on Unruh's motion to re-refer bill and Powers' amendments to Labor Relations Committee. Adopted 41-23 (Badham served notice of reconsideration); Aug. 5.
11. **SB 1192—Coombs.** Badham's motion to reconsider re-referral of SB 1192 to Labor Relations Committee. Failed 24-32. Aug. 7.

1. SCA 2—Moscone, Marks, Dymally. Resolution to propose to the people of the State of California an amendment to the Constitution of the state, reducing the minimum voting age to 18. Passage refused 22-18 (27 aye votes needed for a Constitutional amendment); April 9.
2. SB 770—Bradley. Makes it a misdemeanor for unemployed parent receiving welfare to refuse to participate in public work training or work incentive program. Could require parent to "accept employment" by crossing a picket line. Passed 21-6; June 4.
3. SB 1008—Deukmejian. Changes closing time of polls from 8 p.m. to 7 p.m. Passage refused 18-16; June 30.
4. SB 1213—Burgener. Head of family denied public assistance if he refuses to cross picket line. Passage refused 23-18. July 16.
5. SB 1192—Coombs. "Economic productivity." To impose government into collective bargaining on the side of management. Passed 22-15; July 16.
6. SB 342—Rodda. Relating to education. Role of labor to be included in textbooks. Passed 26-3; July 17.
7. SB 382—Bradley. Deprives certificated and academic employees of tenure and tenure credits for going on strike. Passed 21-15; July 23.
8. AB 271—Brathwaite. Exempts wages from attachment for an indebtedness prior to judgment. Passed 21-6; Aug. 7.
9. AB 837—Miller. Extends FEP coverage for agricultural workers. Passed 22-8; Aug. 7.
10. AB 1123—Wilson. Permits use of school bands at privately promoted, profit making events. Passed 21-14; Aug. 8.
