SEE TIGHTENING OF CONTROL

Individual Initiative Keynote of Plan, Says Domei Dispatches

TOKYO, Dec. 7 — The cabinet approved today a new economic plan tightening control of industry in the interests of national defense.

The plan was based primarily on military considerations but it was relaxed somewhat from the original wording due to the protests of industrialists.

Translations from the Japanese were vague, since the wording was couched in Japanese ideology, but the trend seemed to be a continuation of the state socialist tendencies manifest under the present cabinet.

The new economic structure will include Japan, Manchukuo and China as one with a chain of common prosperity, self-supply and self-sufficiency being extended to treat East Asia, according to the outline released Saturday.

Autonomy in national defense economy will be safeguarded by falling back on the natural resources available within the proposed sphere of common prosperity.

New Japanese Fleet Commander For Central China

TOKYO, Dec. 7 — (Domest) — Vice-Admiral Boshio Hosogaya was appointed supreme commander of the Japanese fleet in Central China. His command will include all Japanese naval forces now engaged in patrol duty on the Yangtze river and other waterways and units on the advance outposts against Chungking forces.

According to the American consulate at Yokohama, exports of raw silk from Japan in the first 10 months of the current year declined to about 239,500 bales from 317,093 bales in the corresponding period of 1939 and 384,809 bales in January, October 1938. (In Japan one bale of silk weighs 132.27 pounds.)

Many Articles Restricted by Japan Customs

Travellers Warned To Refrain From Taking Barred Goods

Following receipt of advice here from the Japanese finance ministry through the Tokyo foreign office, Japanese residents and travelers planning trips to Japan were advised to refrain from taking too large quantities of the articles listed below as part of their personal effects.

Wool materials, katches, clocks, or other timepieces, kodak films, cigarettes, wines and liquors, sewing machines, kodak lenses, golf balls, coffee, typewriters, black tea, sugar, gakes and confections, leather materials and cocoa are listed as some of the goods in the restricted category.

California Growers Protest Cut in Sugar Beet Acreage Allotments

Reduction Affects Other Farmers, Too, Asserts Anderson

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7 — Protests from California growers have prompted Representative Anderson (R., Calif.), he says, to complain to the agricultural department against a cut in the state's sugar beet acreage allotments for 1941.

Asserting that the reduction affected the welfare of other types of farmers as well, Anderson wrote Secretary Claude R. Wickard that the cut—from 182,000 acres this year to 140,000 for the next—not only was a "discouraging blow" to the sugar beet industry but promised to exert a far-reaching influence on California agriculture in general.

Purse Seiner Hit By Ferry in Bay; Nisei in Accident

Heavy fog continued to menace San Francisco bay ship traffic at night and during the early morning hours and reports of accidents both on water and on land were many times the normal number.

The Japanese operated fishing fleet, based at present in San Francisco, was involved in two of the numerous accidents which have been reported on the waterfront during the past week.

The most serious was the collision between the purse seiner Robert B. piloted by Captain Ryuko Shimono, and bay ferry boat. The Robert B. sustained considerable damage and is now being repaired at the South San Francisco dry-docks. The vessel will be laid up for two or three weeks more.

The Key West of Captain T. Ryoko also had a slight collision in the bay off Pier 45 Wednesday. It was damaged. She underwent minor repairs at South San Francisco and was scheduled to return to the city wharf Saturday.

Another Japanese-operated purse-seiner Lena B. of Captain Hamachi also had had a close shave with disaster as visibility in the bay was cut off to very low limits.

On the highway, police reported many minor automobile accidents although auto traffic was cut down by the fog. Two cars piloted by nisei Bayshore highway near Brisbane in which seven persons, none seriously hurt, were sent to hospitals after 12 to 14 cars became entangled.

Masaru Nakamoto of San Francisco operated the second car in line, but escaped with only slight damages to the car, but Lefty Adachi and Mas Fujii of San Mateo in another car were slightly cut by flying glass. All the cars were travelling at snail's pace at the time of the accident.

The fog was so thick along the Bay Bridge routes that highway patrol officers set out flares to guide motorists into the toll gates. Flares also were used to mark the traffic lanes.

It was so thick Friday afternoon that the last car at Bay Meadows had to be called off. No one could see the horizon.

The reason for the unusual fog, according to the weatherman, is a current of warm air coming to the coast from the southwest. It piles up over the water along the ocean, cools and forms fog.

And, said the weatherman, the condition will prevail through tomorrow, probably to be followed by rain.

HT'S USE OF SPECIAL FUND

Friction Seen in Debate Over Loans To Argentine

WASHINGTON, Dec. 7 — Four senators—two of them staunch isolationists—denounced today the use of the Treasury's two-million-dollar currency stabilization fund to aid "a foreign nation."

Their denunciations were directed ostensibly at the Treasury plan to stabilize Argentine currency with a 50-million-dollar loan but they came as reports circulated that the Treasury should legally lend money to Great Britain from the fund despite the Johnson and the Neutrality acts.

In opposing the Treasury's plans to aid Argentina, Senators Bennett (R., Conn.), Alva B. Adams (D., Colo.), and Clyde Herring (D., Ia.) said that they also opposed further "foreign manipulations" with the stabilization fund.

Senator Taft's specific complaint was against the Treasury's 50-million-dollar currency stabilization loan to China.

The denunciations came while an Argentine mission was completing details of the proposed loan with Treasury officials and a British financial mission prepared an "imperial balance sheet" for Secretary Morgenthau in order to give him "an accurate picture" of Britain's financial position.

The China loan was announced by President Roosevelt last Saturday in conjunction with another \$50,000,000 in credits from the Export-Import bank for the Chungking government. The Senate and House banking committees have given their approval of the plans, but other Washington leaders have voiced their opposition to the use of the currency stabilization fund in this manner.

6 Hitler Youths Reach Peking On Return Trip

PEKING, Dec. 7 — (Domest) — A party of six Hitler youths arrived in Peking Saturday afternoon from Tientsin en route to Berlin on their return journey from Tokyo.

The Hitler Jugend sent the party to Japan to attend the ceremony celebrating the 2600th anniversary of the founding of the Japanese empire.

The party after making courtesy calls at the Japanese and German embassies in Peking immediately registered at the Peking hotel.

It is expected that they will leave the city next Thursday after seeing many historic sites.

Japan Leading Exporter From Port of S. F.

Japan was far in the lead as an exporter through the San Francisco Customs district for September, 1940, according to the Marine Exchange analysis of state and federal records released Friday.

Imports from Japan were valued at \$2,714,014 for the month as compared with \$1,949,868 for the preceding month and \$2,717,617 for September, 1939.

Other heavy export nations to this area were: India, \$898,399; Philippines, \$679,235 and China \$667,614. They were followed by the Netherlands East Indies, Colombia, the United Kingdom, Brazil, Malaysia and Canada.

Border Cities In Indo-China Machine-Gunned

HANOI, French Indo-China, Dec. 7 — The government said today two Indo-China border cities were machine-gunned by Thailanders Friday.

A low-flying Thai plane sprayed the waterfront of Vientiane, important border city, with machine gun bullets, and Polpet was fired upon from across the Mekong river, the government said. No casualties were reported.

The French did not retaliate, the government added. It said "many hundreds" of communists had been arrested, meanwhile, in a drive against subversive elements in Indo-China.

A joint meeting of the new and retiring cabinets will be held Dec. 13 at a dinner at Manabu Low cafe.

Retiring Rumania Envoy Decorated

TOKYO, Dec. 7 — (Domest) — The retiring Rumanian minister, Georges Parachevico, was presented with the first class order of the sacred treasure by the Emperor Saturday in recognition for his services in drawing closer the ties of friendship between Japan and Rumania.

New Envoy to China

HONDA TO BE SENT TO NANKING

Chu Min-I Chosen Sino Ambassador For Tokyo Embassy

TOKYO, Dec. 7 — (Domest) — Kunitomo Honda, former ambassador to Germany, was appointed ambassador to the national Chinese government at Nanking, it was announced.

Investiture ceremonies for the newly-appointed envoy were held at the palace Saturday with Prince Konoye in attendance.

With the appointment of Honda, formal relations which have been broken off with a national government in Nanking since the return of Ambassador Shigeru Kawagoe in 1937 were resumed when the Nanking government sent word of their agreement to the choice.

Honda is 68 years of age, a native of Wakayama prefecture. He is returning to active service for the first time since his retirement 15 years ago.

Honda succeeds General Nobuyuki Abe as the ranking Japanese diplomat in China. General Abe headed the Japanese mission which recently completed negotiations with the Wang Ching-wei government and a treaty was signed by Japan and China Saturday outlining the basic principles for relations between the two countries.

Wang Ching-wei Appoints First Envoy to Tokyo

NANKING, Dec. 7 — (Domest) — Chu Min-I, foreign minister of the Nanking Chinese national government, was appointed the first ambassador of the new regime to Tokyo Saturday by the Wang Ching-wei government.

The new envoy took a prominent part in the negotiations between the two countries at Nanking which culminated in the new treaty last week.

German 'Prison Ship' Reported Near Japan Port

KOBE, Dec. 7 — A Norwegian ship, apparently being used as a "German prison vessel," left port today, according to waterfront informants.

Movements of the vessel were carefully guarded, and its name and other details could not be learned. The ship was in port about 12 hours taking on provisions and supplies. Shipping circles believe it might be working with a German commerce raider which has been operating in the South Pacific.

The skeleton program will be as follows: 8 a.m.—Registration 9—formal opening 11:30—Introduction of speakers 1:40—5 p.m.—discussion period 4:30—5 p.m.—closing address 6—banquet—Kinka Low

A new innovation that is expected to be popular with the delegates is the idea of having the six resource leaders revolving around the six discussion groups, spending ample time with each group. This new feature will undoubtedly prove interesting and valuable as it will serve to knit the groups together as a unit, inasmuch as all the discussion topics are interrelated.

It was announced that there will be no registration fee and the sole assessment will be for the banquet. Interested issues may attend the meet.

NEGOTIATE FOR ALLIANCE MOVE

Chiang Kai-shek, Kerr Reported to Be Conferring

SHANGHAI, Dec. 7 — (Domest) — Reliable Chinese sources revealed that negotiations for a secret Anglo-Chinese military alliance has been going on in Chungking between Chiang Kai-shek and the British Ambassador Sir Archibald Clark Kerr.

It was said that provisions for a military alliance would include the following points:

1. Britain shall assist China in transporting war materials and other goods from India, Burma and Singapore bases and transportation of those goods to China.

2. Aircraft assembly plants will be set up in India, Burma and Singapore to supply airplanes to Chungking.

3. Chinese in South Sea region and natives of British possessions will be induced to support military cooperation between Britain and China while their man power will be mobilized in case of emergency.

4. Land and air forces under Chiang Kai-shek shall fall under the command of Air Chief Marshal Sir Robert Popham, commander-in-chief of British forces in the Far East in case Britain declares war on Japan.

Observers, however, are skeptical whether the British government and people in British possessions in East Asia would support a military alliance as planned in view of the fact that it would make all British possessions in the Far East "enemy land of Japan."

Japanese Make New Demands On Indo-China

Seek Representation In All Departments Of Government, Report

CHUNGKING, Dec. 7 — A dispatch from Kunning to the Chungking newspaper Ta Kung Pao said today the Japanese were reported to have made new major demands to the government of French Indo-China. The dispatch declared it was learned authoritatively these demands included immediate Japanese representation in all departments of the Indo-China government and a voice for the Japanese army in the Indo-China police system.

The colonial government was reported to have forwarded the demands to the French government at Vichy.

British Arouse French Ire in Thailand Dispute

Support to Siam Demands Given by Sir Crosby, Report

HANOI, French Indo-China, Dec. 7 — (Domest) — French Indo-China authorities were angered over reports indicating that England is purposely fomenting trouble between Thai and French Indo-China.

It was said that when Sir Josiah Crosby, British minister to Thai, recently visited the Thai foreign office he gave indirect support to shipping points in French Indo-China and also expressed sympathy to Thai demands for the return of territory from Indo-China.

Informed observers believe Crosby's actions which reflected a new situation in Europe are intended to foment trouble in the Far East for the purpose of preserving England's present position in the Orient.
