January 1, 1943

a new year already! - I  
wonder what it holds in store  
for us?? - I'm hoping & praying  
it will see the day of peace on  
earth; a just and lasting peace! -

Breakfast was at 10:00 today -  
oh beautiful sleep! - Wad we had  
Zoni for breakfast - just like we used  
to have in L.A. - Those were the days! -  
Had to check in our time at school -  
then visited Yoshiko, went to P.D. & to Ad  
Bldg to answer the NSRC's telegram  
about the Mission Hills School Plan -  
I told them I'd prefer to wait for Smith -  
— oh I hope is hard I can go there this  
year!!!! — I was a beautiful day -  
just like a spring day in California.  
no wind, lots of sun, really perfect! -  
It really was a nice New Years - all in all.  
Had oushi omame - (to stay omame -), chicken  
no teriyaki & cider. Yummy - Mom & Pop  
went to Adachi's engagement party - K & I  
played hop ching & cards at Yonagatos. Had  
lots of fun - Had to come home when Ernie  
Bill came over - later so later -

Jan. 2, 1943 -  
Sat morning meeting - boring! - Wrote  
letter & cleaned house etc - in the aft -  
Did an omochirai pig saw puzzle at site -  
also pancakes - yummy! Sophie came -

Oh yes - Dec. 31 - got the next  
letter & handky from Cathy L. - &  
the sweetest note from Margaret  
Osborne (P. Tahoe Conference) - also  
a letter of explanation from Miss H.  
Griffith. - It's funny how this  
war - brings you closer to your  
true friends. — & don't know  
what this life would be like  
without friends - it's something  
to be so thankful for! - NSCC's  
we've had me worried —

January 3, 1943

Surprised mom & Daddy after  
breakfast - with a paper bride & groom  
 made of pipe cleaners, & a  
sort of scrap book - full of poems,  
& cut out pictures of the banquet &  
gifts we'd like to have given them  
for their 26th Wedding anniversary - Had  
3 silver \$'s for health, happiness, luck - at  
the end. They seemed to like it -  
George also gave a good sermon at  
church - at 3:00 we had the Janaks,  
Mary MacMillan, Mrs Yamashita &  
(Mr Dohi - Mr Iida - unexpectedly -) over

Jan. 3 - 2

for a tea - of tuna sandwiches,  
fruit cake, cookies, candy, ice cream etc.  
I was awfully nice - Pop elaborated  
on his Montana talk - Mary told  
about Japan, her visit there, & all in  
all t'was awfully nice, Mary stayed  
for dinner with us - it was  
curry stew! — any way t'was  
a nice day for mom & Pop! -

Decided today - I should study  
more - if I'm to stay here for more  
months - I may as well spend the  
time learning something. — So be it  
resolved!

Was talking at nite with a  
visitor - Jimmy H - & got to discussing  
this & that - how utterly unfair it  
is to keep Nisei here - treating us like  
slaves - & then relaxing the curfew  
on the Germans — Then talk of  
charging lite, rent, etc - of the people's  
coop - how utterly stupid - .

Jellee - I hope this Camp will  
continue to run smoothly thru out '43!

He was saying that the Bible  
saying "Man does not live by bread  
alone" - meant so much to him now -  
How true -

January 4, 1943

Pop got to go out to Tellmore today — as one of the Judicial Commissioners - to see some dope who stabbed some one on New Years Day \* was bro't there to the County jail. He didn't come home till around 9:30 P.M. - \* came back loaded with shopping & looking so happy - (first time in 1 yr. that he shopped, saw neon litter etc) - He bro't back butter (5 $\frac{1}{2}$  lb), eggs (50¢ doz.), bacon (4 $\frac{1}{2}$  lb) cups & saucers (35¢ a pair - whew!) - Lots of stuff! - While he was gone 6 awful-looking men (Kibei) - came to see pop - Was I glad he wasn't home yet - Practiced some kihongos - starting today - Wonder how long it'll keep up? ?? -

January 5, 1943 -

Post office unit at school is going well - Miss Robertson seems to like our class — Had tales: Mrs. K. quite sick in the hospital - also Mrs. Sakurai (badly in need of blood - & so few donors) - the poor

dace at the hospital - so terribly  
busy, so little cooperation or  
appreciation. People here have  
become so selfish + self-centered.  
It's a pity. The tuberous are turning  
into such awful people - Canteen  
receipts were turned in for rebates 'had  
says - several tried to smuggle in  
Delta receipts — then there were those  
who shop-lifted when the big goods store  
opened - etc etc etc ..... Mrs T. was  
telling us that some man with whisky  
in his breath tried to grab her as she was  
crossing the hi school lot one nite - gosh -  
there're so many stupidly idiotic people  
in this world! — Went to see a show  
tonite — & walked well out of the Hi S. lot!!!

January 6, 1943.

Our neighbors the Y's are so cute -  
today was Satoru's birthday - only 16 today!  
still a *kyoko*! —

More goons came at site to break  
about th Coop - for 2 hrs - oh h - !  
I went with Lee as a lousy talent show -  
We heard of more young people getting  
sick - Hiro for one, Anna Dai (Kidney trouble)  
etc etc etc .... Ernest is going to have a  
sanitarium for a camp - if something

isn't done! -

Funny incident at m.p. port!

Car : - there coming to the gate -

"There are seven - including  
the Caucasians"

M.P. - where? - Where? Is Mr.  
Caucasian?!!!

Ha ha ha! + they're  
guarding us! - for protection?!!

January 7, 1943.

Alack aday - our 2nd fish -  
Twinkle passed on today - We  
gave it a funeral service with his  
God as the minister, 2 undertakers, &  
even a wooden cross with T's name on  
it - The kids sang "Twinkle, Twinkle -  
little fish" - It was so cute, but  
was a scream too!

It's sick again! - Back ache &  
fever - sad case!

Got sick a nice letter from Mrs  
Bryson! - She's really sweet! -  
& one from NSRC - advising me to  
reconsider H.H. School - think I could  
go there & is Smith from there - Gee - that  
would be swell! - I'm rivering tomorrow  
Sure hope I can go to Smith in Sept!!!!

January 8, 1943

4

Had more fun with the kids  
playing post office - writing letters  
to each other - I nearly had a fit  
laughing over one - which forgot the  
name & wrote "Dear, how are you?" Golly -  
I have no self control - or dignity!  
Poor lil' Yoshinobus in the hospital with  
a possible appendix, so we all wrote  
to him. — He's still laid up -  
bad woman — visitors all P.M. - Billy  
Gooke, Mr Kawai .....

January 9, 1943

Was I lucky today! - Dropped into  
Dental Clinic for an appointment for next  
Sat. to tack on my loose front tooth - +  
since they're all kids I knew I got one  
for 11:00 - Then went to P.O. + arranged  
for a tip thru' the p.o. on Tues - Went  
to my at #8, then to Identist - home by  
12:00. Good ruff! - I helped mom  
wash. — Washed my hair in

the afternoon, then fussed around -  
Typed Ray's speech for the coop party  
tonite - what a kick listening to  
him practice - I was a good  
speech! - They both looked so cute

all dressed up - & we couldn't get over seeing Pop in a white shirt. Golly - what habbit can't do, even in 7 short months.

Heard such a sad story - Mrs. Monier of S.F. passed away after an operation, father interred in Louisiana - came by train, with 2 guards escorting him - for the funeral. Gee, the poor kids! Heard they stuck him in the guard house for awhile - but Comm'y Welfare arr. to get him in camp - still he has to stay in Bl #1 - his guards sleep in the next room. I don't see how he can take it - poor man -

January 10, 1943

Caught my cold all over again -  
out my d - blanket full off - my  
bed! Zowie! My nose runs & runs  
again - so stayed home from church.  
Was it cold today! Brrr! -

Mom & pop had such a swell  
time last nite - Pa sang Nicandra  
Buckie & all! - They went to Oleg's  
prayer meeting - so I & I stayed home.  
Had company all evening -  
the F.B.I. are here again - questioning  
all those who signed Repatriation papers -  
what rats!!!

January 11, 1943

5

Stayed home from school  
with a lousy cold - Dace my  
nose RUN! - Didn't do much, just  
pattered 'round - + read "Jr. Miss"  
by Sally Seuron. I was cute!


Pap had to go to a Coop meeting.


2 sick gals. alas - alack !

Jan. 16, 1943 -

went to get a dis rate for my  
sick leave - felt so silly - wasting  
his good time on that rate. . . .  
Washed - studied - . . . Pop went to  
hear Mike Macaska - here on a visit.  
Heard that Calif. is going to demand that  
citizenship rights of J's be revoked - how  
disgusting! - also exclusion of J. from  
Calif. - + repatriation for all at end  
of the war . . . if that doesn't sound  
un-democratic, I don't know what  
does!! - so h with Warren!  
IC. finished her ski sweater -  
Eureka! — We were a  
part of a touching human drama

write - altho' I suppose it's  
going on day & night all over the world -  
for people live - but they must  
die . . . . just as God caused  
\* was ready for bed at 11:30 - a  
call came to him from the hospital -  
Mrs. Sakurai was sinking fast -  
Poor thing - she told her children to  
study hard, to grow strong - & said  
she'd go alone . . . . She hung to life  
by oxygen . . . . slipping slowly . . . .  
such a sad history - esp. from  
father - 7 children , . . . . youngest

Sunday - Jan. 17, 1943 -

Geo. Aki's last sermon here -  
went with Yoshiko who came jumping

out - Such rumors!!!! - She & Bill T. -  
came for lunch - fooling around with  
G. - Took a bath - actually? -  
It was freezing cold - as couldn't go  
to Mrs. Savakas (she asked me to a  
get together for meals Turuta) -

4° below Monday - Jan. 18, 1943

Felt good to go to school again -  
Nearly froze to & from school - no wonder  
it was 4° below - ... brrr ... wore  
gloves to school - dignity or no dignity -  
was asked to see Mr. Dwochey - regarding  
my 126 leave form. + it's still sitting  
there - supposed to take 1 mo. to go thru' -  
Disgusting! - Glad to fill in some  
blanks.

Tuesday - Jan. 19, 1943

Nothing much of news ~

A group of "Dixie" (including  
Pop) met with the Spanish Consul -  
who came in last nite. What a sorry  
for representatives, for items to tell him de-  
Jee - at least the Dixie can register  
their gripe - but the Dixie - have no  
country to gripe to - since our very own  
country put us behind barbed wire.  
What a sorry state we're in!!!

Went to J.O.A. Board mtg - as I'm  
supposed to be Block Rep. - what a  
waste of time -

Wednesday - Jan. 20, 1943



Dust Storm !!!

The air was close + muggy -  
the sky cloudy + gray - we  
hadn't seen or a dust storm  
today - It was the dust storm -  
in its full fury --

The trip to the P.O. had  
to be postponed --- poor kids --  
It was a pathetic site to see  
the little children huddle in  
groups scarcely able to go home  
in the blinding dust.

News of more sickness -  
of pneumonia cases --- lack of  
equipment - trouble, trouble,  
trouble - !

Thursday - Jan. 21, 1943 9

Dust Storm continues!

Worse than yesterday -

t'was simply horrible - Our porch railing at school broke from the force of the door which banged against it so much. — Our door was completely off! - Bro't my lunch + ate at school to save energy....  
Mom's cof. was awful all night.

Tu - Jan. 22, 1943

Mom's birthday - + she's sicker than sick with an awful cough + cold! Poor thing!

Mrs. He To - is so sweet - she sent a box full of fresh flowers - rose, orange blossom, vine, coral bells - + a box full of cup cakes + home made candy. -

The flowers seemed so green + refreshing  
S.O. came over - so had - a "party" -



Jan. 23, 1943

Did the wash by myself this  
A.M. Cut the aft. meeting + washed  
my hair - (shave on me!) -  
Knitted - etc ....

Sunday. Jan. 24, 1943

Went to church with Eiko - I was  
pretty good. - Laundry lunch -  
potatoe salad, rice, bread, rhubarb, +  
colonies. Ugh. -

Billy got another leg. 'Bout  
going to Westminster. Rich Hayashida's  
now included - I'm so glad for him.  
They've got to go by Feb 2. nd tho' -  
whatta rush - + is B. excited!!!

Went to see what Sue got in  
L.R.C. - then went to Yamauchi's  
to return their thermos bottle + stayed  
till 6:01 playing Trioli - more fun!!

Monday - January 25, 1973

Finally took the kids to the P.O. & they got such a kick from it — I got tuckered out tho' — Cain't take it no moah!

Whatta nite — Pop goes off to Coop meeting - 12:00 no pa, 1:00 no pa, 2:00 no pa - 2:30 no pa! — we thought he was lapped & gagged somewhere - but in he comes at 3:00 A.M. — He had gone to ~~settle~~ a meeting about the Hospital problem. — The 3 drs said if Dr G. comes in, they quit — Bay - whatta nees!

Gosh - is Pop busy - he was nominated for City Manager now - but refused - whee - he's out every nite.

Tuesday - Jan. 26, 1973

Nothing much doing today - Faculty mtg - Dr Chapman spoke on resettlement - but nothing new - so vague - foo! — Kay had a temper tantrum again, gosh - something sure is wrong with her -

Domi still in bed -  
tak tak —

Wednesday - Jan. 27, 1943.

Ma + Kay went to the Clinic -  
K. got heck - by the Doc. + had to  
crawl back into bed for 3 days.  
Mom got disgusted + came home  
without seeing a Dr. - since no  
one paid any attention to her.  
Hops a mere now. any way. -  
got my \$19<sup>00</sup> today!

Thursday - Jan. 28, 1943.

Went to see "Citizen Kane"  
with Lee + Ed. Sure was a weird  
picture. So diff - but remarkable  
photography! - B. was over-sad  
tale - poor fella.

Friday - Jan. 29, 1943.

Met with Miss Robertson after  
school (2-3 grade teachers) -  
had a nice discussion - she seems  
to like what Shiga + I are doing.  
She knew of the H.H. School. Wonder  
when I'll hear from them ?? -  
lost my bandana on the way  
home.

Sat. January 30, 1943 -"

School staff mtg in the A.M. -  
Jo Suzuki - Tad Shikada came to  
demonstrate toy making. - Did the  
laundry in the aft. - nuthin' much.

Sun. January 31, 1943

Church was good - Rev. Jenkins  
said to look for the Truth - no pseudo stuff.

Kay Y. dragged me to the Stud.  
Acc'n Steering Comm. mtg. at which  
Mrs Marian Reith - Rat'l Yards Rep. tried  
to help us organize a TSA. - Talk about  
lack of enthusiasm - + 'was a new high  
in a low! + I was one of the bumpers  
on the log. Zor - I don't give a hang -  
but K. Y. seems to think I'm stagnating  
in a rut, + makes as bonee 'bout telling  
me. - Mrs Reith was feeling so awful  
about this new army supervision  
of from 200 - 300 colleges. all fellas w/  
get 13 weeks of basic training - then 3  
months of technical training + boom  
cannon fodder. She was saying  
the liberal arts college is gone -  
+ none of the Coll. Presidents stood  
up for them or the humanities -

They didn't care about post  
war reconstruction - but only  
wanted to win the war. What a  
bunch of educators! - Sad! -  
Waited whole after! H - !

P.M. - Left as grumbly - + Kay  
to be, + Martha N. came to call me  
since they wanted a get together  
for Martha who's leaving for Wash.D.  
Lucky bum. Alice is going to Kansas U.  
Too! me. I want to go!!!

Went after Alice too - Then the  
<sup>5</sup> of us went to Kays, played dipoli,  
ate + gabbled - about the whole  
world mess! - Gosh this new  
business of drafting kids for a  
kid combat unit for over seas action  
makes me so sick! Gosh - the  
poor fellas - being forced here in there -  
Talk about discrimination! - This  
whole war is so d - futile, + the  
best youth of all nations being murdered  
off. It's the greatest tragedy that's ever  
happened. - & the kids in here are  
sure stagnating too - - - an - cruel world!  
got home after 12:00 - Sleepy!

Monday - ~~January~~ February 1, 1943 <sup>12</sup>

It's I'd be in a school by now - last year. I'm the saddest case of any body! - Eiko Y. got her permit today & she's leaving on Wed. lucky bum! Mary Yamashiro goes to Boston U. - Gah, this camp's going to the dogs before long.

Finally - went to ohara tonite. Bout time - ! It was fun & Siegfried etc were there.

Tuesday - Feb. 2, 1943 -

Came home for lunch to learn that Billy got his permit to go to SJC - lucky bum! Gee - just by chance & luck - a word to Rev. Warren from Pop, & bingo! - off to school. & me - waiting since Sept. Sniff sniff!

Yoshiko came over at site to gab - more fun! - Go Matsumura sent me a calendar from Sila - nice! - ~~her~~

Wednesday - Feb. 3, 1943 -

Eiko - next door - left for Chicago - Conservatory of Music - just I feel like a left out creumb! -

Ran tea at the School like with Mrs. Konderich yesterday aft - she just

got back from S.F. - the said  
it was cold, wet, windy & dark!  
all the U.S. seems to be having a  
cold streak - except Utah - which  
is having an exceptionally warm  
winter! Ha ha! -

Pap - appointed to Bd of  
Commissioners (Arbitration Bd or  
something!) - Wheew! - Corp Comm'r Bd,  
Judicial Commissioner Arb. Bd, Church  
Financial Comm. Church - AND -  
ominated for City Mgr, Chief - Police, etc.  
asked to preside at Block party at 27  
for wedding feast - Sabahachi + Kobaya-  
naji! Golly! Don't see how  
he does it!!!

Kay's bitter - but still in  
bed. I a.d. case!

Thursday - Feb. 4, 1943.

Had some unexpected  
visitors in class today -  
Mr. & Mrs. Gibson (WRA Ed. Head)  
Mr. Nuttall - Miss Robertson -  
& visitors all at once was nearly  
too much for the children -

They were sooooo excited, had to show them the movies, etc....

\* ran after them after they left to get their names in the Guest Book.

They seemed sooo pleased & were so complimentary. Dr. G. was surprised that I had never been to a Teachers College \* Miss R. just said I was "born with it" - ((S.O.B.)) ! whee! -

P.M. - Went with Sue + pap to a Citizen Mass Mtg to discuss Stinson's new decks. v the formation of a new N.C. Combat Unit. OH 32 was jammed - with an overflow at the doors !! It was such an interesting meeting - \* pathetic too - Cornwall + Ernst said a few words about the importance of this event as a turning point - but heck - what could they say.

One fella started out with some very good outline - 1) some influential person, the Pres. or Stinson should tell the public that the N.C. are not dangerous 2) some provision should be made for the families left behind 3) - why racial segregation etc....

In fact, he covered most of the  
document, gives + questions - The  
main objections being #2 + #3 - were  
mentioned by nearly everyone. - It  
seems so tragic - it is so tragic, so  
unjust - to put the kids in such a spot.  
Saying now is their chance to show their  
loyalty + yet trying to put them in a  
"yellow" unit - for cannon fodder most  
likely. If they don't volunteer + I  
suppose we'll all be called disloyal-  
gu - such a mess - + such an  
awful predicament. I couldn't  
sleep for a long time when I thought  
of this whole tragically confused world.  
all the best youth of the whole world  
dying left + right, education going  
to the dogs - It's as horrible - I  
hate to think, because it gets me  
so depressed. —

Look the class to visit the B. Scout  
Lodge + learn about diff. signals. They  
were so nice to us + showed us everything  
flag, whistle, hand signals, knots, tricks. Every  
plays the drums for us + showed us some tracks

Fri. Feb. 5, 1943.

Spent such a busy P.M. - writing  
3 thank you letters to the beauties -  
Writing the story of our visit etc....

Aft. - had a school naming program -  
We are now officially - Sweet View School.  
It was such a cute program - with members  
of the stud. council preside than peach -  
being usher, chairman, yell leader etc.. The  
yell leader in white with a red + white pom  
pom - shouting "2, 4, 6, 8 - who do we  
appreciate" etc was so cute. The children  
were so "iho heme" - It gave me a thrill  
to watch them. Gosh - I hope they get  
the break they deserve - when they go  
out from Topaz. — .

Sat. Feb. 6, 1943 -

Staff Mtg in P.M. - on reading, books etc -  
aft. did my laundry - read, had callers etc.  
Dad went to a mtg. of Council men etc - who  
planned mtgs with the army reps -

Fireworks'll start soon - all girls have  
to register too - ye gads - whatta life! -

Dad's last coop long. for this session -  
when - what a head ache - election of new  
airy men, Cong. + Bd - next week - ! Monkeys  
monka, monka! - — Made an app'd for  
permanent Feb. 19.

It's amazing what joy one  
can derive from one single  
blossom - when flower & green  
are absolutely void, when one's eyes  
have seen only the black of tar paper  
& the beige of sand & dust, the grey  
of sage brush & grass mood only. -  
Our daffodil is beautiful - & as  
bright & alive as a star in the  
black sky.

Sunday - Feb. 8, 1943

Rev. Gots gave a stirring & dynamic  
sermon today. He said "There is a  
famine of intellectual curiosity - there  
is a famine of individual thinking" -  
how true! - said we must have the  
faith & courage, derived from prayer,  
to get ahead - bravely.

Finished reading "Mrs. Miniver"  
today. It was such a charming,  
reflecting & tho't provoking book - I  
loved it!  
Mr. Gillette - came to visit - &  
made us so d— mad. His holier than thou  
attitude & superior airs!!! I hate  
these hypocritical old missionaries!



I walked to Miss Robertson's from 41-  
Had tea in her cozy room with the  
Library Committee — by the time we  
left. it was really snowing & piling  
up. — The snow covers the ugly  
bare spots of camp - I like the ~~ugly~~  
calm & serenity of a snow fall so much.  
It was beautiful before foot prints  
marred the smooth white surface —  
Man the destructive element! — or  
some such thing - I wish I could  
philosophize - the trampled mess,  
unkept look of the path after the 1st  
blow — = my confused sad messy mind.

I feel so blue today —

I wish I could sit quietly  
at a beautiful symphony - Full  
of violins & cellos . . . .



Tue. Feb. 9, 1943

The icicles dangled from eaves ~~worms~~, the snow still lay on the ground - but the skies were clear & I guess we'll have no more snow for some time. — Was I overwhelmed this afternoon! - Around 3:00 - a whole crop of visitors - Miss Robertson, Irene Baba (Chairn of City Council) plus about  $\frac{1}{2}$  other huge men - council men - showing 5 senators from the Utah legislature around. Pop was there too! - It were was over whelming! - was I flattered to think they'd come to see our class. They came to see if we were being coddled - \* they had macaroni soup for lunch - ha ha!!! saw all the latrine etc too - I hear.

Aft school - Edie - Staff met with Lieut. Lee Tracy (Ex movie star) - He read the War Dept Proclamation - & answered our 28 questions - Result: just about as foggy as ever - They defend segregation as better for publicity etc - foosie!!! Mary MacN. came over for dinner -

Wed - Thurs - 2/10+11/45<sup>16</sup>

Lazy Bonee ~.

Cain't remember what  
I did !! Sel tek -

Fri. Feb. 12, 1943

They say they want some one strong, who can give the children the sort of program they've lacked all year. - gosh, I sure hate to give up my little sweeties in 4.3rd - but orders is orders! Taioe! — Keijo Omura's to take over after me.

Went to hear Kirby Page in the evening. He was such an inspiring speaker! He said we must lose our lives to find it" - that - if we had capacity for great suffering, we had "for great joy too - " that our joys would be just as shallow or as deep as our suffering. He said we must lose our selves for others - Must forget our self-centeredness

or we could never overcome the deep<sup>31</sup>  
tragedies which this war has brought  
to millions. — It really was up-  
lifting & marvelous for the morale —

I.C. got a letter from Holyoke today  
to be ass't N.S. teacher + \$6.50- for the  
fall year. LUCKY BUM! — Pendle Hill  
from June - more luck - & here Miss  
Brown still bickering over this in that -  
I guess they want me! but ye gade  
it's like taking nigger-baby steps across  
an auditorium or - as Miss D.F. put  
it "like a green Tomatoe that takes  
forever to ripen" — Smith can only  
pay my tuition \$6.00- — I have to pay  
\$5.00 - Bd + Rec - Shuz!

Sun - April 6, 1943 -

Pop went to Rehi today on Coop  
Bank biz. — At this late date - they  
have free tellers now so  
have special okay from Wash. so  
he went to have Mr. Bell Teletype -  
Talk about inefficiency - gad! —

— aft - took it off to go to Rec'd  
to see Mr. Zevodsky - he's trying to get  
my indefinite on the basis of his Seller's  
letter - got my fingers Xed —

Wed - April 7, 1943

Everything's breaky-dory - + Mom + Pop  
are leaving per schedule tomorrow! -  
so allie well! - I told the kids  
I was leaving + they were looked  
sad! —

Thurs. April 8, 1943 -

RAIN! IN THE DESERT  
AND IN APRIL!

why? - Because mom + dad  
are steppin' out today. - It  
pattered all morning - but let up  
by evening + afternoon. One of  
the Coop folks took them into  
Delta on a car - + they both looked  
so happy. I was excited helping  
them pack + seeing them off -

Felt kinda lonely tho - but  
everyone's so nice to us - Jerry +  
Kimi say they'll take me to a show -  
+ Kiro invited me over to watch  
Clelie take a bath - so went over -  
house is quiet with only 2 in  
the house - but am so glad m + p can  
have a nice vacation. — They sent  
us superb oranges, peanut butter +  
lau for us - !

Fri. April 9, 1943.

My last day with the 3rd graders -  
→ snow on the ground when we got  
up this A.M. - crazy, unpredictable,  
silly old Zopaz! just when I started  
to put my winter duds away too -  
ah me - ! Those m + p aren't freezing -  
got a post card from them already -

Went to church in the P.M. - with  
Grace Ziji + Mrs. G. - O'Leary in  
"It started with Eve" - (she was cute!)

Sat. April 10, 1943 -

A.M. Meeting —

P.M. Laundry - sheets etc etc.....

Weren't bad tho' - & finished early. -

P.M. - were invited over to Kiehl + Zoby's -  
with the Jepis, Zeiler + Mary, Mr. Ogawa (Rkt  
Mgr), + Yo Laii. - Here had lot of fun  
playing cards, eating (per usual) - sandwiches,  
candy, nuts, cookies, pop corn, etc ....  
then - we grabbed + grabbed + Zoby told us  
more interesting incidents about his  
trip to St. Louis - It was more fun + we  
stayed till 2:00 AM!!! Round 12:30 - Mrs. Zobys  
came over to make sure we were there  
Wow! - Checkin' up on us!

Tues. April 11, 1943

Got up & the ground was flooded with puddles & muck - church here was empty & the offering totaled only \$11.03. Sad!

P.M. Went with Sue & Kene to see to hear the Y.P. Fellowship speakers - Dave Tateuno, Kay G. & El. Gerard - speak on what & how much to tell about our Evac. etc. Dave told about his trip to S.L. & it was so interesting - what a kick! -

Mon. Apr. 12, 1943.

News today! One of our residents - a 63 yr old bachelor was shot & instantly killed but an N.P. on guard - who claims that he was trying to crawl thru' the fence - who wouldn't stop after 4 warning calls. - The body was found 40" inside the fence - & that's the inexcusable part. Ye gods - how could the man hear - if some one yelled from a guard tower about 20 feet or yards away - & ~~the~~

another inexplicable thing - a warning shot should always be fired over-head first! Gosh - it's really piping & so inexplicable! Hope the d - fool who shot him is jailed for life! — As Lohy says - it could easily be one of our friends or family next if this sort of thing continues - The sad part of it all was - there wasn't a single witness! — Gee - more face now, as everyone's all stirred up about it.

P.M. Went to Miss R's for a class in children's literature & she read us parts of one of the best children's books I've ever heard - called "A Tree for Peter" by Kate Seredy. It's just superb & has an uplifting quality about it which is wonderful for adults too —

My 1st day with the 1st graders - Gads! - are they noisy brats - & even Louie P.O. - bless 'em \*<sup>care</sup>!:

Got 2 small pgs & 2 letters from Mom & Pop today.

Tues. Apr. 13, 1943

class went fairly well in  
the A.M. - I was slightly


Sunday. May 30th.
