



Petition

To the Hon. the Board of W. S  
Commissioners for the Settlement of Private  
Land Claims in California -

The petition of Ellen E  
White respectfully sheweth that she is the  
present claimant of a tract of land located  
in the County of Santa Clara containing about  
two thousand acres and forming the eastern  
part of the Rancho de "Pincen delas Estacas"  
lying between the creeks called Coyote and  
Penitencia -

That said tract of land was  
granted to Ignacio Alvarado on the 11th day of  
February AD 1838 by the Mexican Government  
through Governor Juan B Alvarado the then  
Governor of the Californias who acted under and  
by virtue of the laws then existing and in force  
with reference to the granting of lands in the  
Departments of the Californias - That said  
grant was approved on the 26th day of May AD  
1841 by the Departmental Assembly.

That on or about the 8th day  
of August AD 1848 said grantee Ignacio  
Alvarado departed this life having a last will  
and testament whereby he ordained that that  
portion of the Rancho de "Pincen delas Estacas"  
which lies between the creeks called  
Coyote and Penitencia be sold for the payment  
of his debts - That in pursuance thereof the  
said portion of said Rancho was duly sold  
in legal form and purchased by Charles White  
of said County on the 28th day of August AD  
1848. That on the 4th of November AD 1851  
said Charles White sold and conveyed said  
land to your petitioner by deed of that date

That there are no conflicting claims  
known to your petitioner and in support of her  
claims she refers to the original grant and

Witness states his name is James Alexander  
Forbes his age forty eight years and residing  
Santa Clara Co Cal.

Testim by Claimants Atty.

Were you acquainted with Charles White  
now deceased Augustin Aliso and Jose  
Antonio Aliso and Guadalupe Rinse  
if so state whether you know of a deed for  
Land being made by the them last named  
person or either of them to said Charles  
White what land was conveyed where sit-  
uated and all you know of the circumstances  
ausing.

I know all the persons named in the  
question - Charles White, Guadalupe Rinse  
are dead, the others are living - I know that  
in the latter part of August 1848 Augustin  
Aliso being the first named Executor of the  
will of his Father Ignacio Aliso made a  
conveyance of land to the late Charles  
White according to an order in that will for  
the payment of the debts of the said testator  
for the sum of two thousand dollars which  
was paid to the said Augustin Aliso by the

Said White as the Consideration for said land  
in my presence in two payments -

The said deed of conveyance  
was drawn up by me in the Spanish language  
and was executed in my presence before an  
Alcalde according to the usages of the country  
at that time - being one of the assisting  
witnesses -

The land covered is situated  
in the present County of Santa Clara on  
the South and West of the old road which  
leads from the Mission of San Jose to the  
town of San Jose - It is bounded on the  
North East by the stream known as the Anojo  
de Pintucia on the North west by the  
Estuary's of the Bay of San Francisco on the  
South and South west by the Anojo de Castro  
on the South East by the continuation of a  
line starting near the old Bridge over the  
river Guadalupe and running in an easterly  
direction to a certain Lycaurro tree situated  
in the plain to the west of the Anojo de Castro  
which tree stands alone and is a conspicuous  
object to the sight where said line intersects  
the Anojo de Pintucia. Said land being a  
strip off of the eastern side of the Rancho  
known as El Rincon delos Esteros.

Question by Game.

What was the usual form of  
making and executing wills according to the  
Customs of the Country in California and how  
long have you been familiar with such customs.  
Answer -

I have been acquainted with  
these customs for more than twenty years.

The common manner of execu-  
ting wills was before an Alcalde and

two apostning witnesses and the Certificate  
of the Alcalde on the will of its due Execu-  
tion was the only evidence of probate  
and was always received in the Courts as  
sufficient proof of that fact.

The will after being  
Certified by the Alcalde was delivered to the  
party appointed to execute it. No record of wills  
was ever kept to my knowledge in the Northern  
part of California where I resided.

Question by Game -

Look at the Certified copy  
of the will of Ignacio Alviso her shown  
you and herewith filed as Exhibit No 1 and  
state what you know of the execution of the  
original and whether such Execution was in  
accordance with the usual forms and  
customs of the County at the time it was done.

Answer.

Said original was executed in my  
presence - I was and of the Subscribing wit-  
nesses - I do not know positively whether Salvo  
Pachico was an Alcalde at the time but I  
know he had been acting in that capacity for  
many years before -

The City in Name B Alvarado Potrero -  
cal Chief Functionary Intempore of Upper  
California -

In as much as Ignacio Alvaro  
a Mexican citizen by birth has petitioned for  
his personal and family welfare for the lands  
known by the Name of Rancho de las Estacas with  
in the boundaries laid down in the plan accom-  
panying his petition for said tract first taking  
the measures and complying with the provi-  
sions in conformity with the laws and rules  
I making use of the powers in me vested  
in the name of the Mexican Nation have  
thought fit to grant to him the said property  
this grant to be in full Conformity with the  
laws governed by the approval or disapproval  
of the Most Exalt. Reputation and under the  
following conditions -

1<sup>st</sup> - The grantee nor his heirs shall have  
power to divide nor transfer the lands to any  
person who shall impose a tax, require a  
fictitious transfer bond or obligating Grant-  
ee or other obligations to pay whether for  
a pious or charitable purpose nor shall thus  
assign it to the Church.

2<sup>d</sup> - He shall have power to fence the same  
in without obstructing or injuring the roads  
or thoroughfares - He shall Survey the  
same truly and diligently adopting it for

whatever situation and use he may think proper.

3d. - When the grant shall have been confirmed he shall petition from the proper Magistrate or Officer the judicial possession thereof by virtue of this grant and from which he shall make out the boundary lines and place his stakes -

4th. - The lands donated to him are solely and exclusively those described in his petition and laid down in the plan attached to this instrument and and the Officer who shall give him possession shall note by this Government of the Number of 'Sitis' contained in the same.

Therefore I command that these presents serve him for a title and the same being of full value and force that this be registered in the proper book and delivered to the petitioner for his security and other purposes -
