



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Be it Remembered, that on this eleventh day of February, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-three, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of John Love, for part of Place named "Salvador Ranch," was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 582. and is as follows, to wit;

In Case No. 582, John Love for part of "Salvador Ranch," the deposition of Emile A. A. Nemecourt, a witness in behalf of the claimant, taken before Commissioner Peter Scott, was filed.

 chains and eighty eight links to the place

I know the Ranchr called  
Papaw m Pasha Ranch which was granted  
to Salvador Vallejo in 1838 - The  
Spaniard first occupied it in 1838 or 1839  
he built a house on it and corralled  
cattle and horses on it and cultivated portions  
of the land, since the Americans took

Possession of the County he has sold portions of it to various individuals.

I am acquainted with the signatures of Juan B Alvarado, Francisco Atco. Jacob P Liso. Victor Prudencio Ramoso A Rodriguez. Basilio Bimpeisa and Rafael Haroquez. whose signatures to the document before me marked No 1. in 495 and purporting to be the original title, approval and vindication possession are genuine -

13 Translation of Senor Commandant of the Frontier  
Espediente

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Salvador Vallejo a residente of this Frontier presents himself to your Excellency in due form of right and States that he is owner of a considerable quantity of Cattle and horses and also that he requires every thing necessary for the Cultivation of a piece of productive land being therefore in regard thereof he requests that you will make him a grant whilst he applies to the government for the title of ownership to the Land known by the former name of Napa adyacent on the S<sup>t</sup> the lands owned by the Citizen Nicolas Ygualanda on the North by that of Citizen George Yount which said lands is vacant; before now the Indians kept their cattle there but owing to the delay in Secularizing the place into a Mission. You must be well aware of them having killed off all the cattle, the horses and sheep sharing the same fate, and for which cause, and those mentioned above I supplicate your Excellency by virtue of this petition to decree in my favor should you find it fit.

Sonoma May 1<sup>st</sup> 1837.

Sonoma June 2<sup>nd</sup> 1837.

That is granted to the party in this instance the lands he solicits (it being vacant and not recognized as private property) in conformity with the documents, that he states, he can produce his documents before the Political Government of the State that corresponds whenever he shall think fit to cultivate it.

Most Excellent Sir

The Commission on Vacant lands  
have been detained in examining the "Espediente" sought for by the citizen Salvador Vallejo,  
and they have not met with any success whereby  
they might be enlightened of the extent of the  
"parage" de Napa" that the Government granted  
to the said Mr Vallejo though it might be  
supposed that the maximum would exceed  
the "One Hectares de ganado Mayor" apportioned to  
each Colony by the regulation of the 21<sup>st</sup> Nov  
1828, in that the Commission is aware from the  
knowledge that it has acquired in this respect,  
they know that petitioners for vacant lands very  
seldom ask for the quantity that can be granted  
and whenever neither in the petition of the peti-  
tioner, nor in the plan of said parage, nor in the  
decree of concession does the extent of the lands  
appear.

It appears to the Commission as a measure  
most expedient that the extent of the lands  
granted be made known to the Government  
by Mr Vallejo (it being the only means the  
Commission believes whereby the Most Excellent  
Assembly would give its approbation) The  
documents call for the exact Commission in  
the "Terceros de Napa" wherefore the Commision  
submits to the Excellency of your Excellency  
the following proposition.

Untill the party  
interested submits a correct copy of the title  
of concession of the "parage de Napa" and  
an exact plan with its corresponding scales  
the approbation in his favor made by the  
Government is hereby suspended -

Senor Governor

Salvador Vallejo a resident  
of this Jurisdiction and frontier comes  
before your Excellency in due form & States  
that having solicited of the Commandant  
of these points the "paseo de Napa" composed  
from the Creek of this Name that divides  
it from the Citizen Nicolas Hergenra (who  
owns a part of the land called "Napa")  
concerns the South, and by the North with  
that of citizen George Young. He requires  
it to establish upon it his property both  
moveable and immovable. It was granted  
to him provisionally in the terms expressed  
in the Document not duly accompanying  
this, as also the map that points out its  
extension.

Wherefore I supplicate that  
your Excellency will extend to me the title  
of ownership in the usual form

"This is not  
done upon stamp paper there being none  
that corresponds in this place"






