

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Be it Remembered, that on this *third day of March*, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-*three*, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of *Salvador Vallejo*, *party* for the Place named "*Sup-Gomi*," was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. *794* and is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were had in their chronological order, to wit;

*San Francisco January 9' 1855,*  
Case no. *794*, *Salvador Vallejo* for part of the place named "*Sup-Gomi*," was ordered to be placed at the foot of the *4<sup>th</sup>* class cases on the Trial Docket.

*San Francisco January 23' 1855,*  
Case no. *794* was submitted under the Rule of *March 21' 1854*.

*San Francisco January 30' 1855,*  
In the same case Commissioner R. Aug. Thompson delivered the opinion of the Board respecting the claim.

Petition

To the Board of Commissioners for and in  
regards settling Private Lands claims in the  
State of California

Your Petitioner Salvador  
Valley of Sonoma in the State of California  
wouds respectfully represent to your Honorable  
Board

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That on the 19th day of October A.D. 1838  
by your Petitioner and one Juan Antonio  
Valley applied to the Director of Colonization  
in the northern frontier of Upper California  
for a tract of land known and called San Yose  
to the extent of sixteen leagues or eight leagues  
each

That Mr G Valley then director of colo-  
nization on the 15th day of March 1839 gave  
them an order to occupy said lands which  
which the said Salvador and Juan Antonio  
soon afterwards did take occupy flock and  
enjoy the said granted premises

That subsequent  
to said time to wit on the 5th day of September  
A.D. 1844 Don Manuel Murttuma granted  
the said land known and called San Yose  
to your said Petitioner and the said Juan  
Antonio Valley to the extent of sixteen square  
leagues or eight leagues each

Your Peti-  
tioner further represents that subsequent  
to the grant by Manuel Murttuma as  
aforesaid he your Petitioner purchased all  
the interest of the said Juan Antonio Valley  
in his said eight leagues and parcel of the  
said tract known and called San Yose  
wherby he became the sole owner of said tract  
entire to the extent of sixteen square leagues

Your  
Petitioner further shows that subsequent  
to his said purchase of all the interest of the  
said Juan Antonio Valley he your Petitioner  
sold two leagues of said land to sundry persons  
and subsequent to the sale of said two leagues  
he your Petitioner sold and conveyed the resi-  
due of said tract viz 14 leagues to H. J.  
Guschmiller and others and claims his

said original papers to the said Deschumacher  
to be used in evidence before your Honorable  
Board

That said original papers are now  
file in case No 307 of your Honors Doct  
with the case of the Petition of H J Deschumacher  
and others for compensation of frontier  
leagues Part and parcel of said lands  
Sup yours

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Your Petition refers to the said  
papers in support of the claim to the entire  
tract of section & quarter leagues known and  
called Sup yours

Your Petition in this respect  
that this may be taken and deemed as a  
separate Petition in connection with the Petition  
of the said Deschumacher and others,

and that  
with the final decree which your Honors may  
make in said case No 307 Frontier leagues  
of said lands may be decreed to the Petitioners  
in said case

and the two remaining lea-  
gues may be decreed to your Petitioner for  
and in trust for the assigns of said two leagues  
and as in duty bound will ever pray


