



Your petitioner Benjamin McCombs of the County of Napa respectfully represents that on and before the nineteenth day of January A. D. 1852 Salvador Vallejo was the lawful owner of a tract of land situate in Solol County and known as Salvador's Ranch containing eleven square leagues, that his title thereto was obtained by a grant made to him by H. Alvarado former Governor of Upper California which said Grant is described as follows: That tract of land situate in the County of Napa known and described as the "Parajo de Napa" situate between the Napa back adjoining the lands of Nicolas Higuera on the South and on the North by the lands of George Ion containing eleven leagues as will more fully appear by the original Grant and papers connected therewith on file and record in the public archives of California and which Your petitioner causes leave to produce and prove, Your petitioner further shows that on the seventh day of March A.D. 1850 said Salvador Vallejo and wife by a deed of that date, a copy of which is annexed and marked "A" conveyed to Your petitioner a portion of said Salvador Ranch described as follows a certain piece of land in the Pueblo of Salvador, Napa County California and known upon the Map of said Pueblo as copied in Record Book D. page 132 in the office of William M. Fuller, Alcalde of Sonoma as lot number five (5) containing forty acres more or less that on the nineteenth day of January A.D. 1852 said Salvador Vallejo and wife by a deed of that date, a copy whereof is annexed and marked "B" conveyed to Johnson Howell six hundred and forty acres of said land as will more fully appear by reference to said deed last mentioned. And that on the twenty fourth day of January A.D. 1853 said Johnson Howell by a deed of that date a copy whereof is annexed marked "C" conveyed all that certain other part of said land so conveyed to him by said Salvador Vallejo as aforesaid particularly described as follows. Commencing at a point on the North Eastern line where the Northeastern

line of John Blakes land touches said line, and running
on State North East line 32° 06' West thirty six chains, and
thirteen links. Thene North 55° 19' East twenty seven
chains and twenty six links. Thene South 32° 06'. -
East twenty seven chains thirty six links to John Blakes
line. Thene South 57° 52' West twenty seven chains
and twenty three links to the place of beginning. Cont-
aining One hundred acres of land, and that your
petitioner claims title to said two parcels of land
herein before set forth. That he has been and is now
in quiet and peaceable posession thereof and knows
of no other claimant to the same or any part thereof
and therefore respectfully prays that the same may
be confirmed to him.

1st Question. What is your name, age and place of
residence?

Answer. My name is Emile D'Heucourt
my age 38 years my residence in Napa County
California.

2nd Question. Are you a Surveyor by occupation
and are you acquainted with the Rancho of Napa
County called the "Napa Ranch" and with the boundaries
the same Ranch granted to Salvador Mullyo and
sometimes called the Salvador Ranch, if you describe the
boundaries?

Answer. I am a Surveyor by occupation
I am acquainted with rancho named, and I know its
boundaries. I have Surveyed them. It is bounded on the South
by the Arroyo de Napa and a straight line running
from that Arroyo to the arroyo de los Cauveros, to the
lower part of the arroyo los Cauveros on the North
by a straight line from the upper part of the Cauveros
called Gont's pass, to where the Southern line of
George C. Gont touches the mountain, and also by said
Gont's northern line to the river Napa and on the East
by said Napa river which is sometimes called the
Riv de los Cauveros, to its junction with Napa Creek
or Arroyo de Napa.

3rd Question. Have you examined the
description of the lands claimed in the following cases
on the docket of the Board of U.S. Land Commissioners
to wit No 577 in which Benjamin McCombs is

cattle and horses on it and cultivated portions of
the land. Since the Americans took possession of
the country he has sold portions to various individuals.

I am acquainted with the signatures of Juan
B. Alvarado, Francisco Are, Jacob P. Leese, Victor
Prudon, Damaso H. Rodriguez, Matavio Berreyera
and Rafael Narvaez, their signatures to the documents
before me marked N° 1. in 1855. and purporting
to be the original title approval and judicial

he prays you to grant him, Meanwhile he
petitions the Government the title of Ownership
that known by the name of "Napa" bounded
on the South by Ignacio Higuera, and on
the North by Citizen George Wayne which land
is vacant; And although the Indians in
that direction formerly kept (thereon) the cattle
which were given to them, upon the cessation
of this Mission, it is known to your
self that they killed all the cattle, sheep
and horses; from this cause the reasons
in

you to the Community. In these and the
foregoing reasons he prays you to take under
consideration his petition, and decree in
his favor if you should deem it fit
