

Be it Remembered, that on this third day of March, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-three, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of W<sup>m</sup> H. Davis et al: for the Place named "A lot in the city of San Francisco," was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 811 and is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco January 9<sup>th</sup> 1855.  
Case no. 811 was ordered to be placed at the foot  
of the 4<sup>th</sup> class cases on the Trial Docket.

San Francisco January 23<sup>rd</sup> 1855.  
Case no. 811 was submitted under the Rule of March  
21<sup>st</sup> 1854.

San Francisco February 6<sup>th</sup> 1855.  
In the same case Commissioners R. A. G. Thompson  
delivered the opinion of the Board rejecting the claim;

Petition

Claims of William H. Davis and Jose Ramon Estudillo, Executors of the last will and testament of Jose Joaquin Estudillo, to town lot in the City of San Francisco.

Petition represents that in the year One thousand Eight hundred and thirty five upon petition of said Jose Joaquin Estudillo he received from the Political Chief and Government of the department of California a grant of a lot or piece of land in the Town of Yerba Buena now the City of San Francisco in the State of California Two hundred varas square, that said Jose Joaquin Estudillo received possession of and improved said land according to law and in all respects complied with the conditions of said grant.

That said Jose Joaquin died in the year One thousand Eight hundred and fifty two leaving a will of which Petitioners are the Executors and have been qualified as such according to law.

Expediente translation of said grant is herewith filed marked H.


Wherefore Petitioners pray that said land may be confirmed to the heirs and representatives of said Jose Joaquin Estudillo deceased as the owner thereof in fee.



The Commission of the Government ordered to give an opinion upon the petition of the Citizen Jose' Jaquin Estudillo a resident of the Town of San Francisco wherein he solicits the privilege of building a house on Yerba Buena & also requests for 200 rs Iguaro of land to cultivate

The Commission thinks that no obstacle would be in the way of making this grant notwithstanding its topographical position being immediate to the Beach, in equal terms other residents are occupying lands because they have not met with any reasons to prevent them the use of land near the Beach. And farther than this it should be considered as owned by the Ayuntamiento of San Francisco and should be subject to the Regulations in the same manner as others to whom lands are granted in ownership -

Wherefore the Commission concludes with the following proposition -

"That can be granted to the Citizen Jose' Jaquin Estudillo the lot for a house without going beyond the quantity of varas set forth in Art 15 of the Regulations of Colonization = Clothing & And also the 200 rs he solicits -

First - The petition of the said Estudillo for a  
grant of two hundred varas square of land and  
a house lot in the place called Yerba Buena dated  
Sept 12. 1835 -

Second. The order of the Government referring  
the same to the Departmental Assembly -

Third. The proceedings of that body in relation  
to the matter concluding with the following reso-  
lutions.

1st. That can be granted to the City in Jose  
Joaquin Estudillo the lot for a house with out  
going beyond the quantity set forth in article  
15<sup>th</sup> of the regulations of Colonization and also  
the ten hundred varas he solicits -

2d. - The Ayuntamiento of San Francisco  
can grant the land said lot at a distance of  
200 varas from the Beach and can permit  
other residents to establish themselves there under the  
same restrictions and with the order regulating  
a Town under the best policy -

There is no Evidence introduced in the Case showing that any grant was ever made under those resolutions either by the Political Chief or by the Ayuntamiento of San Francisco or on whom the right to make it was conferred. nor is there anything to show that the alleged grantee ever possessed occupied or claimed any lands by virtue of the rights conferred by said documents.

The Petitioners having failed to show any title to the premises claimed their application for a Confirmation must be denied.
