



3 Petition

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To the Honorable the Board of Commissioners
for the adjudication of California Land claims

William Boole, a native of England and
naturalized citizen of the Republic of Mexico
and for 28 years a resident of California respe-
ctfully shows: That on the 3rd day of February
in the year 1838. Governor P. B. Alvarado by his decree
granted to him, your Memorialist a certain piece
of Land adjacent to the village of Branciforte
Santa Cruz County and State of California
and known by the name of "La Lombonera" con-
taining about one half league square more
or less. That the said Land is bounded as
described in the petition of Memorialist to the
Governor therefor dated 2nd February 1838: the
which with all the original papers connected
therewith accompany this Memorial: That
your Memorialist has stocked and improved
the said piece of land, has resided thereon in
undisturbed possession for more than 14 years, and
has raised and supported his family thereon and
that he is not aware that any other person or persons
pretend or can pretend to claim the said descri-
bed piece or parcel of ground.

Therefore your
Memorialist prays your Honorable Board to
cause to be extended to him the Patent in fee,
for the above described Land in virtue of the
Authority recited in your Honorable Board
by the act approved 3rd March 1851

Commissioners for Ascertaining and Setting aside
Land claims in California came Joseph L
Mayors a witness produced in behalf of the
claimant William Bocle whose petition is
No. 310 on the docket of said Commissioners
and after being duly sworn testified as
follows -

"The Law Agent of the United States was
notified and deposed

Joseph L Mayors a witness offered by the petitioner
was examined by him deposed & says;

I have been living in California for
the last eighteen years. I reside in the County
of Santa Clara, and my age is forty six years

I further say that I am well acquainted
with Juan B Alvarado a former Governor of
the Territory of California. I am somewhat
acquainted with the half brother of said Juan
B Alvarado, and do believe that the sign
line now known me "Alvarado" with a scroll
on the paper, I think and to the best of my
knowledge is his.

I know the petitioner William
Bocle and have known him the last fourteen
years intimately. My land on which I reside
joins his & on which I have been living since
1839 - The said Bocle has occupied and
resided on the place where he now does and
which is called La Carbonera since the year
1838. That he has a dwelling house on it, a
Corral a field enclosed and cultivated.

The boundaries are well known to me, they are
the Land formerly belonging to Jose Bolcroff
The river San Lorenzo the Arroyo de la villa
and the Ojo de Agua - There is about one half

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league I think in the claim of Boole who has
had undisturbed and peaceable possession
of the same Land Thirteen years

Question by Geo. W. Cooley Esq.

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One of the houses was on the Land
and occupied by Boole in 1838 - I understand
from Boole that he built it. This he showed to
me before he got his grant. In 1839, I think he
had about six acres of land fenced in &
cultivated. He has now I think about 30
acres, enclosed and cultivated. In 1848 I think
he had a field in cultivation, about 15 acres.
The Land is within ten Leagues of the Sea
Coast. It lays near the Sea Coast the near
est point of the Land to the Sea Coast is
probably within two miles. The land did
not belong to anyone it claimed by any
mission at the time of his grant.

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Isaac Graham a witness offered by the petitioners
examined by him, deposes and says; I have
been a citizen of California for the last sixteen
years and I reside in the County Santa Cruz
since my age of fifty two years - I further say
that I am well acquainted with General B Alvarado
who was a former Governor of the Territory of California
of service. I have served as Captain under him
I was at one time in service under him during
Alvarado for the term of two years and now
contiguous service - I know the hand writing
of General Vicente B Alvarado very well having
often seen him write and have seen a great
deal of his writing, having often received
orders from him. The signature "Alvarado"
with the scroll on the paper now shown
me I think is his signature.

I know the place
now called Bocle and have known him
very intimately for the last eleven years - I had
known him somewhat before 1841 at which
time I came to reside very near to Bocle -
Our ranches are not far apart, and our
cattle range together - during the whole
time since 1841 Bocle has increased and
resided on the place where he now does
and which is called La Loberia -
He has dwelling houses on it - a corral - a field
enclosed and cultivated - The land is good
land, but not fit for much cultivation. It
is hilly and somewhat barren - As the boundaries
are not pointed out to me very distinctly formerly
of Jose Bolcoff, the man San Lorenzo - the
Appaloosa River & the Spring Eel of the
There cannot be more than half a league
in the claim of Bocle

There were several houses on the land - I first
knew the place in 1841 - There was then a plank
house on ^{which} Bocle lived, he used to be there
break and foregoes, whether he built the
house or not I do not know - afterwards
he built an adobe house - After that he built

a very good house of squared logs, it is a very good house for a Farmer; these two last houses I know Bocek built, as I saw him building them, but I cannot recollect the precise time when they were built - When I first came to this neighborhood Bocek was sawing logs with a whet saw. About the year 1818 I had occasion to go to Bocek's place - I think he might have had some in ages or cedars at that time - The nearest point of the land of Bocek to the Sea Coast is about one and a half or two miles.



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This is a claim for a tract of Land situated in
the County of Santa Cruz near the town of
Brancefofe and containing according to the
testimony above One half of a League
The petitioner has presented in support of his claim
First a certificate of Notarized by
Manuel Jimeno acting Governor and Francisco
Arce Secretary - Second, a petition from the claim
ant to the Alcalde of the Town of Brancefofe
praying for a grant of the Land by certain
Specified Meters and boundaries, upon which is
entered a Marginal Decree of the Alcalde
granting him the Land provisionally, by virtue
of the Authority of the Ayuntamiento until the
Governor shall issue the Corresponding title -
This decree is dated Feb 2nd 1838. There is
similar petition from the claimant to the Gover
nor dated Feb 2nd 1838 praying for a grant
of the Land and describing by the same bounda
ries. On the Margin of this petition is entered a
Decree of Governor Alvarez granting him the
Land Selected and describing the Feuds of the
Town of Brancefofe to acknowledge the same
This last decree is dated Feb 3rd 1838.
The genuineness and authenticity of these docu
ments are established by the testimony. It is
likewise in proof that the claimant occupies
the Land with a house on which he lives,
with cattle, and by collection of parts of the
same - That he has so continued to occupy it
up to the time of filing his petition before the
Banc, having in the meantime erected two
other houses and made other improvements on
the premises.

The evidence is considered sufficient
to establish the claimant's right to a confirmation
and a decree will be entered accordingly

In this cause on hearing the proofs and allegations it is adjudicated by the Commission that the claim of the petitioner is valid, and it is therefore decreed that the same be confirmed.

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The land of which confirmation is made is situated in the locality of Santa Cruz and is known by the name of La Carbonera being the same which was granted to the petitioner by Governor Alvarado on the 3rd of February 1838 and has been held and occupied by him ever since, and is bounded as follows - By the Lances owned at the date of the grant by Don Jose Bolcoff, by the river San Lorenzo - The arroyo de la Villa and the Spring of Water (el Ojo de agua) containing one half of a square league for a more particular description reference is made to the original plan filed among the papers in this case.

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



decision of the United States Land Commission
to ascertain and settle private land claims
in California be dismissed and that the notice
of intention to prosecute said appeal filed
in this Court by the Attorney General of the
United States be withdrawn and that the
claimant have leave to proceed under
the decree of the said Land Commission
in his favor, as under Final Decree.
