follows -

The Law Agent of the United States was
Notified and attended

Joseph L Mayors a witness offered by the petiti-
oner and examined by him deposed & says;

I have been living in California for
the last eighteen years. I reside in the County
of Santa Cruz, and my age is forty six years

I further say that I am well acquainted
with Juan B Alvarado a former Governor of
the Territory of California. I am somewhat
acquainted with the hand write of said Juan
B Alvarado, and do believe that the signature
now shown me "Alvarado" with a scroll
on the paper I think and to the best of my
knowledge is his.

I know the petitioner William
Boole and have known him the last fifteen
years intimately. My lands on which I reside
joins his & on which I have been living since
1839 - The said Boole has occupied and
resided on the place where he now does and
which is called the Carbonera since the year
1838. That he has a dwelling house on it, a
Coral a field enclosed and cultivated.

The boundaries are well known to me, they are
the Land formerly belonging to Jose Boleroff -
The river San Lorenzo the Arroyo de las Viejas
and the Rio de Agua - There is about one half

league I think in the claim of Boole who has had undisturbed and peaceable possession of the said land thirteen years

Testimony by Geo. M. Cooley Esq.,

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One of the houses was on the land and occupied by Boole in 1838. I understand from Boole that he built it, this he stated to me before he got his grant. In 1839, I think he had about six acres of land fenced in & cultivated. He has now I think about 30 acres enclosed and cultivated. In 1848 I think he had a field in cultivation, about 15 acres. The land is within ten leagues of the Sea Coast. It lays near the Sea Coast the near est point of the land to the Sea Coast is probably within two miles. The land did not belong, nor was it claimed by any mission at the time of his grant.

 been a citizen of California for the last sixteen
 years and I reside in the County Santa Cruz
 since my age of fifty two years - I further say
 that I am well acquainted with Juan B. Alvarado
 a former Governor of the Territory of Cali-
 fornia. I have served as Captain under him
 once at one time in service under him since
 Alvarado for the term of two years and was
 continuous service - I know the hand writing
 of Juan B. Alvarado very well and
 often seen him write and have seen a great
 deal of his writing, having often received
 orders from him. The signature "Alvarado"
 with the scroll on the paper now shown
 me I think is his signature.

I know the petiti-
 oner William Boole and have known him
 very intimately for the last eleven years - I had
 known him somewhat before 1841 at which
 time I came to reside very near to Boole -
 Our lands are not far apart, and our
 cattle range together - During the whole
 time since 1841 Boole has occupied and
 resided on the place where he now does
 and which is called La Carbonera -
 He has dwelling houses on it - a corral - a field
 enclosed and cultivated - The land is grazing
 land, but not fit for much cultivation, it
 is hilly and somewhat barren - As the bound-
 ries are pointed out to me by the land formers
 of Jose Bolcoff, the New San Lorenzo - the
 Arroyo de la Villa & the Spring El of de agua
 there cannot be more than half a league
 in the claim of Boole

There were several houses on the land - I first
 knew the place in 1841 - There was then a plank
 house ^{which} Boole lived, he used to be there
 back and forwards, whether he built the
 house or not I do not know - afterwards
 he built an adobe house - After that he built

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a very good house of Saneed logs, it is a very good house for a farmer; these two last houses I know Boole built, as I saw him building them, but I cannot recollect the precise time when they were built - When I first came to these neighbors Boole was sawing logs with a whop saw. About the year 1848 I had occasion to go to Boole's place - I think he might have been some ten years in cultivation at that time - The nearest point of the land of Boole to the Sea Coast is about one and a half or two miles

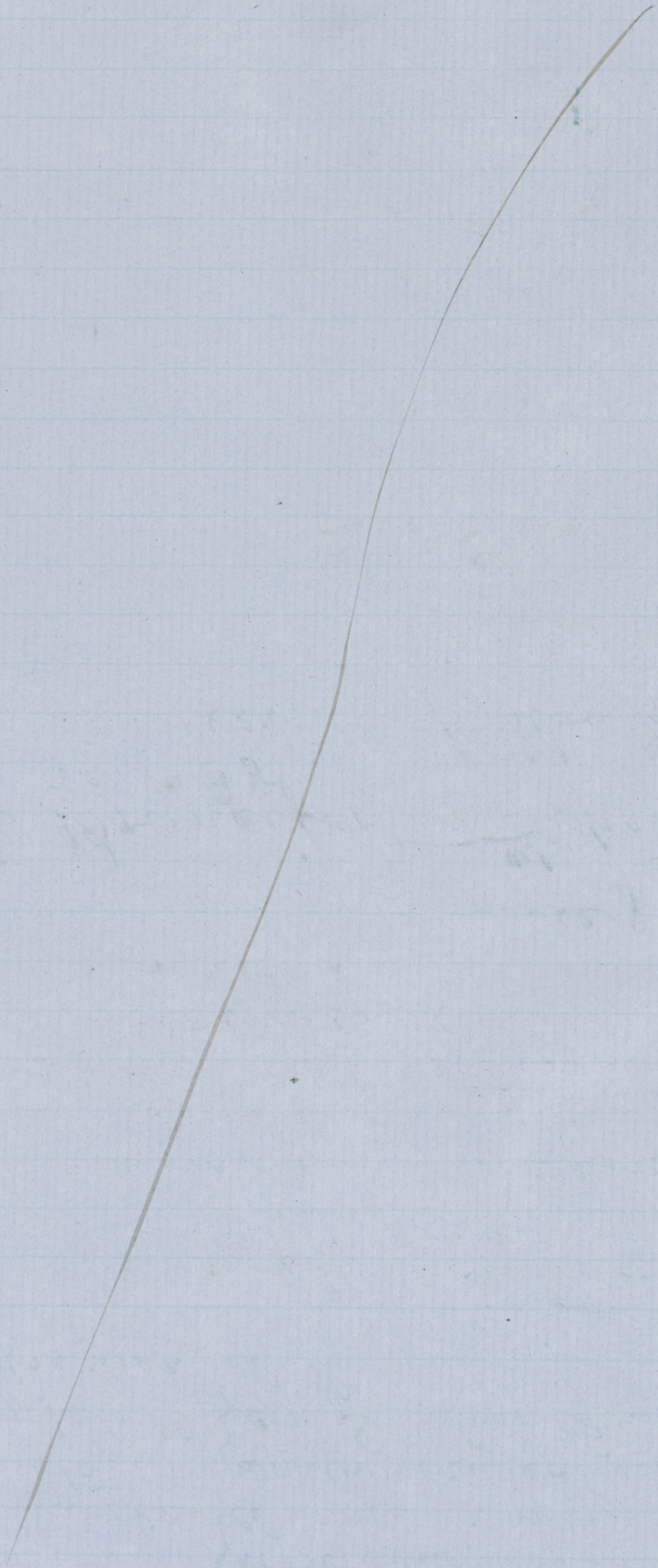

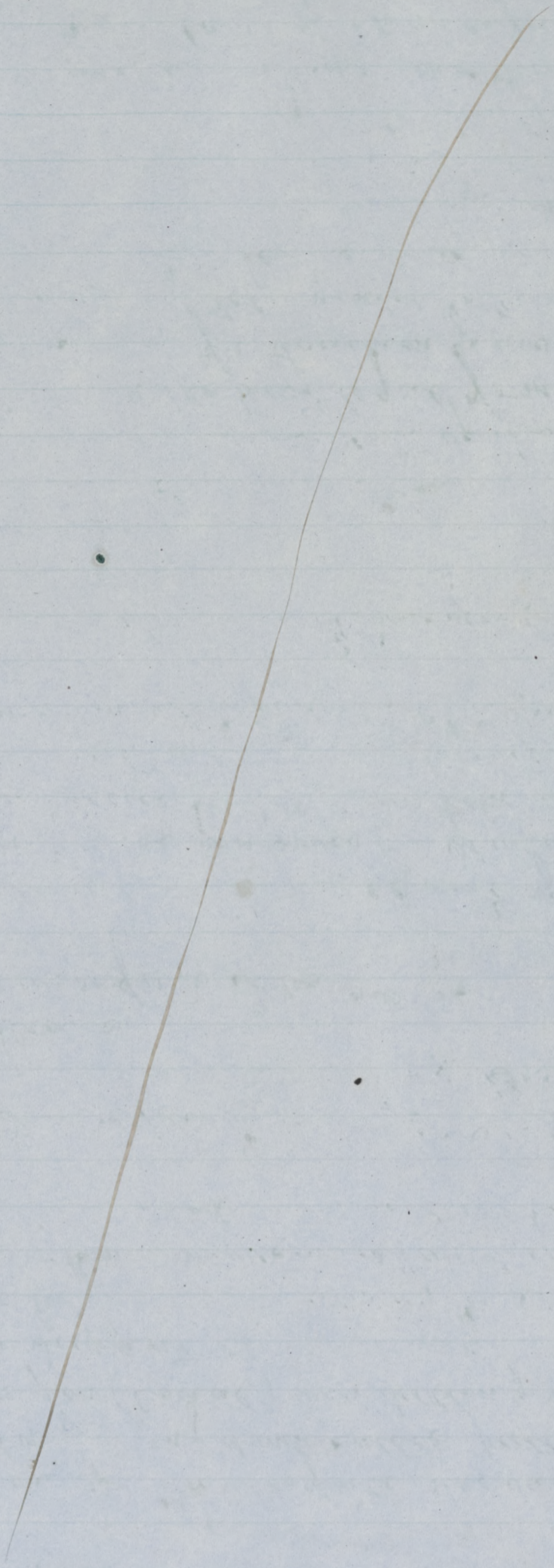

Rancho de la Carbonera

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This is a claim for a tract of Land situated in the County of Santa Cruz near the town of Branceforte and containing according to the testimony about one half of a square league. The petitioner has presented in support of his claim First a certificate of Naturalization signed by Manuel Jimeno acting Governor and Francisco Arce Secretary. Second a petition from the claimant to the Alcalde of the Town of Branceforte praying for a grant of the Land by certain specified Metes and bounds, upon which is entered a Marginal Decree of the Alcalde granting him the Land provisionally, by virtue of the Authority of the Ayuntamiento until the Governor shall issue the Corresponding title. This decree is dated Feb 2^o 1838. Third a similar petition from the claimant to the Governor dated Feb 2^o 1838 praying for a grant of the Land and describing by the same boundaries. On the Margin of this petition is entered a Decree of Governor Alvarado granting him the Land selected and directing the Alcalde of the Town of Branceforte to acknowledge the same. This last decree is dated Feb 3^o 1838.

The genuineness and authenticity of these documents are established by the testimony. It is likewise in proof that the claimant occupied the Land with a house in which he lived, with Cattle, and by cultivation of portions of the same. That he has so continued to occupy it up to the time of filing his petition before the Board, having in the meantime erected two other houses and made other improvements on the premises.

The Evidence is considered sufficient to establish the claimants right to a Confirmation and a decree will be entered accordingly.

In pursuance of a notice from the Attorney General of the United States hereunto annexed, it is hereby stipulated and agreed that the appeal heretofore taken in this case from the decision of the United States Land Commission to ascertain and settle private land claims in California be dismissed and that the notice of intention to prosecute said appeal filed in this Court by the Attorney General of the United States be withdrawn, and that the claimant have leave to proceed under the decree of the said Land Commission in his favor, as under final Decree.
