

The Petition of Peter H. Burnett, ~~for the place named~~  
~~in~~ Lots in Sacramento City, ~~in~~ was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 637 and is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco December 5<sup>th</sup> 1854,  
Case no. 637, Peter H. Burnett for Lots in Sacramento City, was ordered to be placed at the foot of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Class Cases on the Trial Docket.

San Francisco December 17<sup>th</sup> 1854.  
Case no. 637 was submitted under the Rule of March 20<sup>th</sup> 1854.

San Francisco January 23<sup>rd</sup> 1855.  
In the same case Commissioner R. C. Ang. Thompson delivered the opinion of the Board rejecting the claim;

Sweth that on the 18th day of June A.D. 1841  
General Alvarado then exercising the powers  
of Governor of the Department of Upper  
California duly authorized to make grants  
of Land belonging to the Republic of Mexico  
within said Department by virtue of the decree  
of the 18th August 1834 and the regulations  
of the 21st of November 1838 conceded and  
granted to One John A. Sutter a certain tract  
of Land situate in said department and  
now lying in the State of California, con-  
taining Eighteen Leagues and called "New  
Helvetia" and more particularly described by  
the Map accompanying the petition of said  
Sutter, that afterwards, to wit, about  
day of 1841 Manuel Mchellon  
then exercising the powers of Governor of  
said Department and duly authorized to  
make grants of Land by virtue of the decree  
and regulations aforesaid, conceded and  
granted to the said John A. Sutter and his  
son John A. Sutter Junr, twenty two leagues  
of Land, described as the Sobrance of the  
tract before granted by Governor Alvarado  
to said Sutter.

That the said John A. Sutter  
by deed dated the 14th day of October  
1848 conveyed all his interest in said Land  
to the said John A. Sutter Junr and that  
said John A. Sutter Junr also on the  
14th day of April 1849 laid off a Town called "Sacra  
Mundo City" upon a part of said Land  
for a description of which upon petition  
refers to a map of the same herewith filed  
marked (A) and made part of this petition  
The said John A. Sutter Junr by deed,  
dated 16th day of April 1849 conveyed certain  
Lots in said City to One Samuel Brannan  
and that Samuel Brannan by deed dated the  
14th day of April 1849 conveyed a portion

of Sacie Lots to your petitioner, for a description of which reference is hereby made to Exhibit Marker (B) and herewith made a part of this petition - That the said John A Sutter by decree bearing date the 30th day of June March 1849 conveyed to one John B Peavin Lot Number Six in the Square between Third and Fourth and I and L Streets in Sacie City; That Sacie Peavin by decree dated the 27th day of September 1849 Conveyed the West half of said Lot to one John H Monroe - That the said Monroe Conveyed the same to one L. E. Picket by decree dated the 16th day of April 1850 And that the interest of Sacie Picket was Conveyed to your petitioner by the decree of the Sheriff of Sacramento County dated the 30th day of November 1850 That the said John A Sutter Seiner by decree dated the 25th day of June 1849 Conveyed all the unoccupied portions of Sacie Land to the said John A Sutter, and that the said John A Sutter by decree dated July 1849 Conveyed to your petitioner, the Lots described in Exhibit (C) and made a part of this petition - That

X And to each other the Especial decree of the said Sutter by whom And further doth Allocated to John A Sutter is on file in mere any evidence the Surveyor General's Office at San Francisco, except the Map accompanying the petition of Sacie Sutter which has been lost or mislaid and cannot be found, after diligent search, and that the grant of the Sutter made by Governor Michelltono was destroyed by fire in Sacramento City on the 2nd of January 1850 and your petitioner is informed and believes, and uses much reason to see in the proper Office -

Most Excellent Governor of this Department

John Augustus Sutter, a native of  
the Republic of Switzerland Naturalized  
in the Mexican Republic and now residing  
in this Department, before the Noticees justice  
of your Excellency with due respect makes

That since his arrival in this Country  
being desirous of cultivating a portion of the  
many Vacant Land which it possesses, he  
obtained Your Superior permission to establish  
himself on the land which he now occupies  
accompanied by some Laborious Families who  
Chose to follow him, and as his assiduous  
labors already promise flattering hopes to  
his Establishment in particular and advantages  
to the Department in general, Seeing that  
after the Examples of those who follow him,  
enclustrious ideas are awaking in the other  
inhabitants of this Country the Selection of  
his place serving at the same time both as  
a strong barrier to the incursions of the barbarous  
natives tribes into the Settlements, and as a  
School of Civilization both to the barbarous  
Aborigines and to those Civilized by the  
Missions, who during the long period of  
years since they have been brought under  
Subjection, have not been useful members  
to Society in general, as the consequence  
he has had the pleasure to see that they have  
become owing to his independent works

In all these reasons he fonds himself under  
the necessity in order to aggrandize his uncer-  
taining and establish native families, to  
request that your Excellency will have  
the goodness to grant him Eleven leagues  
of land at his Establishment called Nice.

Selvetea situated towards the North in exact accordance with the lands laid down on the map which he has the honor of accompanying. Yore, Not exceeding in size Eleven leagues the land which is particularly indicated by water in winter; And he prays to Your Excellency and to the Mexican Nation, that the laws of Colonization in force, and all those which treat on the subject shall be faithfully observed by him.

Therefore he requests that Your Excellency, in virtue of the power which the laws confer upon you, well grant his request, and at the same time impose your powerful influence with the Supreme Government of the Nation, in order to obtain its Superior Protection, by which favour, the undersigned will receive a benefit, and the acceptance of this <sup>of</sup> ~~be~~ forwarded.

Whereas Don. Agustín Gutierrez a native of the Republic of Seocial and naturalized in the Mexican Nation, has asked a privilege to the law of the 18th of August 1834 and the regulations of the 31<sup>st</sup> of November 1838 for his personal benefit and that of twelve families, for Eleven leagues of Land on the margins of the River Sacramento, on the Vacant lands of the Northern frontier for the purpose of cultivating and improving them in the manner prescribed by said laws, to which end he has given sufficient proof of his industry, good conduct and other qualifications required in such cases and having already accepted his petitions, Constituted Endeavors and truly performed your favor of Our instructions, by ceding to Civilization a portion of several Mexican Natives of those Frontiers, and this government being sufficiently informed that the before mentioned lands do not belong to the private property

of any individual, pueblo or Corporation, and  
consequently they belong to those who possess them in said  
Lands; I have in accordance with the power  
Confided on me, in the Name of the Mexican  
Nation, granted to the said <sup>Don</sup> Francisco Sotelo  
by these present letters, for himself and his  
Colonists the aforesaid Land called Nuevo Hel  
Veteca, subject to the approval or disapproval  
of the Supreme Government and of the Most  
Excellent Departmental Junta, under the  
following Conditions.

1<sup>o</sup>. He may enclose it without  
prejudice to the paths routes and privileges  
principally the traffic & Navigation of the  
River.

2<sup>o</sup>. He shall maintain the Native  
Aborigines of the different tribes of those  
parts, in the enjoyment & liberty of their posse-  
sions, without molesting them, and he shall only  
reduce them to civilization by means of pacification  
and friendly relations, without hostility against  
them in any way until he obtain authority from  
Government.

3<sup>o</sup>. The land granted to him comprises eleven  
square leagues (Seis de ganchos Mayor) comprehen-  
sive in the extent delineated on the map  
which accompanies the Espediente, without  
including the lands mentioned by the impulse  
and current of the River, its boundaries being  
on the North the three Peaks and latitude  
 $39^{\circ} 41' 45''$  North; On the East the margins of  
Falsa River; On the South, latitude  $38^{\circ} 49' 32''$   
North; On the West the River Sacramento

4<sup>o</sup>. When the ownership to this Lands is Confirmed  
he will ask permission thereof from the respective  
Magistrate in order that it be measured  
according to law, the surveys which may  
result remunerating for the benefit of the Nation  
for the necessary purposes.
