

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Be it Remembered, that on this twenty eighth day of February, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty three, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Antonio Maria Osio, for the Place named lands near the Mission of Santa Clara, was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 641 and is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco January 2^d 1855.
Case no. 641, Antonio Maria Osio for land near the Mission of Santa Clara, was ordered to be placed at the foot of the 4th class cases on the Trial Docket.

San Francisco January 30' 1855.
Case no. 641 was submitted without argument and taken under advisement by the Board.

San Francisco February 6' 1855.
In the same case Commissioner R. A. Thompson delivered the Opinion of the Board respecting the claim:

To the Board of Commissioners presertaining
and settling Private Lands between the State
of California

Your Petitioner avers that he
is of residing in said State of California
respectfully represents to your Honorable
Board

That he claims a certain tract or
piece of land called the Orchard of Jesus
and the house situated in front of the said
tract of Santa Clara in Santa Clara County
and State aforesaid,

which was irrigated by
the waters from the river that he claims
said lands and appurtenances in fee and by
virtue of a grant made to him by Don Jose
Castro Commandant General,

For the use
of the people of California under the authority
of the Mexican Government and by virtue of
an order from the General of the Department
of the California confirming upon said Com-
mandant General authority to grant land

and
thus obtain the means necessary for the defense
of the country that said grant bears date on the
23 day of June A.D. 1846

That it was made upon
a good and valid consideration paid to said
Commandant General by your Petitioner

That
he was then in immediate possession of the
lands granted to him as aforesaid by competent
authority that the boundaries thereof are
well known and understood and your
Petitioner is not aware of any good and valid
interfereing claim to the said lands

Your
Petitioner presents herewith the original grant
in the Spanish language together with a
translation of the same and will make for
the proof of title of record by the Board

resado Sr. Pico la llave de arboles y casa que
se halla al frente de esta Misión lugarezgo le
entra de las ventanas de la pila: pues consta
qda. quedan ya enajenadas y pertenece a dicho
Sr. Ovio a quien la ha vendido en pago o orden
o abajo de mil pesos de la cantidad que le
acerrota asciende esta Comandancia General.

resources with which this Department counts
upward one of them being the establishment
under the management of Your Reverence

I shall be pleased to command the delivery to
the hands of the said Director of the Fruit Gar-
den and house situated in front of this Mis-
sion,

and which is irrigated by the waters
of the river (pozo) as in this day it is em-
ployed and belongs to said Director to whom
I have credit in payment or

satisfaction
of one thousand dollars of the amount due
him by this General Commandant and
Santafelena June 23, 1846

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This is all claim for
tract of land known as the orchard of this
situated in front of the mission of Santa
Cecilia in the County of the same name
and purports to be for services rendered made
by Jose Castro Commandant General
of Upper California to the claimant
in consideration of the sum of one thousand
dollars due him from the Commandant
General for services advanced in payment
of the troops under his command.

The only
evidence of title presented in support of
the claim is an order from the said Com-
mandant General to the first Rev. Fr.
Father Minister Major of Madrid & S. de
Rey directing him to deliver to the man
of Don Autunio Marin all the first year
and his orchard situated in front of the mission
under his management,

it had been granted and belonging to the
said Don Asio to whom he had ceded it
in payment of the sum of one thousand
dollars due him by the Commandant.

This
order bears date on the 23d of June 1846 is
signed Jose Castro and purports to be
made under the authority expressed on
having the Government take care of the
14th of May.

This is no proof of the gen-
erality of this document but even if it
was proved so none of the Government is bound
legally to be answerable to make such
adjudication of the property claimed

or to
alleviate any portion of the public domain
in any manner for any purpose. In the

absence of such authority his grant would
confer no rights of property in the grantee
The claim is therefore rejected.
