



Your Petitioner further represents that the said grantee on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of March AD 1846 caused his title to be recorded in the Office of the Sub-Prefect of Yerba Buena by Francisco Guerro - that the boundaries and location of said two fifty vara lots are well known and established and that your Petitioner has never parted with the title thereto

Your petitioner presents herewith his original grants of said land in the Spanish language together with a translation of the same and will make further





Mr Smith had the promise from Michil town for those lots as soon as he should become a citizen -

5th Ques - State if you were with him in selecting the lots and state as well as you can where they are situated or located in reference to the present streets -

5th Ans - I was with Capt Smith when the selection of the lots were made - The location is at the junction of Pacific & Sansome streets bounded by the old water line - 100 varas on the water and 50 varas back on a level piece of ground that there was there -

6th Ques - State what objects, if any, were near or on the lot?

6th Ans - Mr Thompson had a small frame house there which he used as a storehouse that house was either on or very near said lot - I think it was on said lot
