



IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

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Be it Remembered, that on this second day of March Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-three, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Robt. Cathcart, Adm^x for the place named Sargent was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 771, and is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco January 9th 1855.
Case no. 771. Robt. Cathcart, Adm^x for the place named "Sargent", was ordered to be placed at the foot of the 4th class cases on the Trial Socket.

San Francisco January 23rd 1855,
Case no. 771 was submitted under the Rule of 21st March 1854.

San Francisco April 17th 1855.
In the same case Commissioner S. B. Farwell delivered the opinion of the Board rejecting the claim.

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Petition

To the Honorable The Board of Commissioners
for Ascertaining and Setting the Private Land
Claims in the State of California

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The petition of Robert Guthrie Public Acmen
of the County of Sante Fe and
Administrator of the Estates and Chattels and
Real Estate of Joachin Beech in behalf of
the heirs of said Beech respectfully represents

That on or about

the first day of July in the year 1833 the
said Beech presented his petition to Jose
Figueroa then Governor of California for a
grant of Land situated in upper California
on the Banks of the River San Lorenzo of
the extent of Two leagues, or thereabouts in
length and one League in breadth, that shortly
thereafter, to wit, in the month of October in
the year 1833 the said Governor of California
granted to the said Joachin Beech the
said tract of Land then and now known
as the "Sargent Rancho" situated on what is
now the County of Santa Fe in the State
of California.

That the said Beech was then
in the possession of the said Rancho of "Sargent"
and continued in the possession thereof for a
long time thereafter, and that the said Rancho
or tract of land has been occupied and emp-
loyed and is still occupied

That your petitioner
further represents that the said "Espediente"
or grant of said Land to the said Beech
is now on file in the office of the Surveyor
General of the State of California to which
he begs leave to refer a copy of which your
petitioner has not been able to procure since
the said Estate has come into his possession,
but which he will offer in evidence to your
Honorable body together with other proofs
to establish the title of the said Beech

Your petitioner further

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represents that the original grant of said Rancho
of Sayente has not found among the papers of
the said Joachim Beelne deceased and he
prays that a certified Copy and Translation
thereof may be accepted in lieu thereof

You petition therefore pray
that your Honored Commissioners will conform
the letter of the said Rancho of Sayente to the
said Joachim Beelne and his heirs, and that
a protest on the same may issue out of the
proper Department of the Government of the
United States

And your petition will ever pray
