

Case No. 735 was ordered to be placed at the foot

Petition

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The Petitioner Eliza Knight re-
spectfully represents, That on the 21st day
of September A.D. 1838 Juan B. Alva-
rado Governor of California by virtue of
authority in him vested granted to Sal-
vador Vallejo the tract of land called
"Napa" and the boundaries described
in the Map and title which original -
grant map, appraisal and act of
judicial possession are filed in claim
No 495 and hereby referred to and made
a part of this petition, translation
of which are submitted herewith marked
"A"

That on the 5th day of April A.D.
1847 the said Salvador Vallejo sold
and conveyed to G. W. Harrison one
square mile or six hundred and forty
acres of said tract of land as is now
particularly described in the deed of
conveyance from said Vallejo to said
Harrison a duly certified copy of which
is submitted herewith marked "B"

That on the 2^d day of August
A.D. 1852 the said G. W. Harrison sold
and conveyed to William M. Roggs
one half of said square mile, as is
more particularly described in said
deed of conveyance from said Harrison
to said Roggs, a duly certified copy of
which is submitted herewith marked "C"

That said William M. Roggs sold
and

and conveyed to the Petitioner on the 3d day of August A.D. 1832, a quarter section of said tract of land as is more particularly described in the original deed of conveyance submitted herewith and marked "D"

And the Petitioner further represents that those under whom he holds have held for some fifteen years, and that the Petitioner now is in the quiet possession and occupation of said land.

Wherefore he prays the Commissioners to confine to him the aforesaid tract of land.

came George C. Yount a Witness in behalf
of Clement Julius Rose No 732
who after being duly sworn deposed as
follows:

Questions by Mr. Halleck Attorney for
Claimants.

1st Question. What are your name age
and place of residence?

Answer. My name is George
C. Yount my age is fifty nine years and
I reside in Napa County in California
I have lived in California ever since
February 1831 and in Napa since 1836

2^d Question Do you know the Rancho
called Napa granted to Salvador Vallejo
if yes where is it situated

Answer. I know the Rancho
It is bounded in the North or Northwest
by my Rancho on which I live on the
East by Napa River, on the South by
Nicholas Higuera and on the West by
Cunero Creek. It is in Napa County
above mentioned

3^d Question. State what you know
about the occupation of the land?

Answer. Salvador Vallejo first occ-
cupied it in 1837 or 1838 I am not
positive

positive which

He had horses cattle and corals upon it. He built an adobe house in it which he occupied with his family.

The house was built by him the same year that he went there. He cultivated very largely. I suppose four or five hundred acres were cultivated in wheat corn barley beans and other vegetables. He continued to occupy it until after the Americans took possession of the country. He had probably four thousand head of cattle in it at that time.

4th Question Do you know whether he sold any of the land, and if so to whom?

Answer. He has sold pretty much the whole valley. He sold some of it to Mr. Rose an Attorney in San Francisco also some to Mr. Osborne, Mr. Berettte Captain Knight and Mr. McNeil. These persons now occupy the lands purchased by them. They are all fenced in and cultivated.

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I think the Rancho called Mapu
in Napa valley which was granted to Sal-
vador Vallejo in 1838. The grantee first
occupied it in 1838 or 9. He built a
house in it and animals had cattle and
horses in it, and cultivated portions of
the land. Since the Americans took pos-
session of the country he has sold portions
of it to various individuals.

I am acquainted with the signatures of Juan B. Alvarado, Francisco Ace, Jacob P. See, Victor Prudon, Amaro A. Rodriguez, Mariano Benítez, and Rafael Narvaiz. Their signatures to the document before me marked No. 1, in 1895 and purporting to be the original title approval and judicial possession are genuine.



The Petitioner alleges that the Rancho of Napa was granted by the Mexican Government to Salvador Vallejo in 1838, that on the 5th day of April 1847 said Vallejo sold the portion claimed in this case to G. W. Harris and made a legal conveyance thereof to him - that Harris conveyed the same to William G. Rogers, who on the 3^d August 1852 conveyed it to the present claimant.

The certified copies of the above mentioned conveyances introduced to sustain the title of the Petitioner derived from said Vallejo through them are insufficient to establish an unbroken chain of title. The deed from Harris to Rogers purports to be executed by Edward P. Sage as the Attorney of said Harris "for that purpose duly constituted and appointed" while no letter of Attorney or other evidence of authority is presented of course without such evidence it cannot be regarded as the act of Harris.

This indispensable link in the claim of his title being wanting, the claimant has failed to prove himself the owner of the property and is consequently not entitled to a

The Land of which confirmation is made is a portion of the Rancho de Napa, which was granted to Salvador Valley, by the Mexican Government and situated in the present County of Napa. That portion hereby confirmed contains about One Hundred and Sixty acres and is described as follows:

Commencing at the South west corner of the tract of land in Napa Valley, known as the Harrison Tract, thence running Easterly one half of a mile, thence at right angles Northward one half a mile; thence at right angles Westward one half a mile, thence at right angles Southward one half a mile, to the place of beginning, being the South Westerly quarter section of the aforesaid Harrison tract. For more particular description ^{reference is made} ~~to be had~~ to the deed from William Boggs to said Knight, a copy of which

is contained in the transcript of
the record in this cause. Provided
that the Land, the title to which is
hereby confirmed, is the within the
exterior boundaries of the grant to
San Salvador Valley, as said bound-
aries may be finally determined
by decree of this court, & otherwise.
