



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Be it Remembered, that on this Second day of March, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-three, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Henry W. Curtis ~~for part of~~ ^{part of} Place named "San Antonio," was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 709 and is as follows, to wit:

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco January 2nd 1855,
Case No. 709, Henry W. Curtis for part of "San Antonio," was ordered to be placed at the foot of the 4th class cases on the Trial docket.

San Francisco March 13th 1855,
Case No. 709 was submitted on briefs taken under advisement.

San Francisco July 10th 1855.
In the same Case Commissioner R. A. Thompson delivered the Opinion of the Board rejecting the claim;

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709 To the Board of Commissioners for
ascertaining and settling the private
land claims in the state of California

Petition of
Henry C. Curtis

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On petition Henry C.
Curtis of Santa Clara County in the state
of California respectfully represents to
your Honorable Board that he claims
a piece or parcel of land containing six
hundred acres which is a part of the north
half of the south half of a certain tract of
land known as "Laurelton" situated in
said County of Santa Clara and the whole of
which said tract known as "Laurelton"
is bounded on the south by the Creek affection-
ately called in the creek of
Matadas, on the west by the River Madre de
(Mother mountain of) Santa Clara, and ex-
tending easterly to the edge or terminus
of the lower Boyas (Low Hills).

That your petitioner claims
said piece or parcel of land by virtue of a grant
of said tract known as "Laurelton" made to
Juan Prado Maza under the authority of the
Mexican Government by Juan B. Alvarado
constitutional Governor of the Department of
the California bearing date March 29, 1839
and approved by the departmental Captain
in the 22nd day of May 1840.

Your petitioner further
represents that said Juan Prado Maza
having died, the said south half of said
tract known as "Laurelton" was on the
10th day of April 1848 sold and conveyed
by the executors of his will and his heirs at
law under the sanction and by the direction
of the judicial authorities having jurisdiction
in the matter to John Reid. That the
said John Reid conveyed the said south
half of the said south half to William
H. Miller on the 25th day of March 1859
and that said William H. Miller subsequently
conveyed the said piece or parcel
of land containing six hundred acres
to some titleholder. Your petitioner further

represents that pedigree papered of said tract of land known as "San Antonio" was given to the said grantee soon after said grant was made and the boundaries thereof designated and defined, and that he and those claiming under him have been in the peaceful possession thereof ever since, and that your petitioner knows of no interfering claim.

Your petitioner further presents herewith a diagram of said south half of said tract known as "San Antonio" marked "H" exhibiting the boundaries of said piece or parcel of land so annexed to and claimed by your petitioner and prays that the same may be deemed and taken as a part of this petition, and prays leave to refer to a copy of said original grant and a translation thereof presented to you Hon. Body with the petition of William Alvarado, Henry F. Dowd, and James W. Weeks for confirmation of their claim to the whole of said south half and to present such further proof of title as may be required by the Board.

Your petitioner prays your Honorable Board to take into consideration his claim to said piece or parcel of land and declare his title to be valid and confirm the same.

Your Petitioner, the said Henry C. Curtis,
respectfully represents that, heretofore, to wit:
on the 2nd day of March A.D. 1853, he
filed before the Board of Commissioners
of the United States for ascertaining and
settling the private land claims in the
State of California, his Petition for con-
firmation of his claim to a certain
tract of land, containing five hundred
acres, situated in the County of Santa
Clara, in said District and State, and
being a portion of the South half of
the tract of land known as "San
Antonio", granted on or about the 29th
day of March A.D. 1839, by Juan B.
Alvarado, then Mexican Governor of Cali-
fornia, to one Juan Prado Mesa, for
a particular description of which, as well
as the dereliction of title of your Peti-
tioner from the said Mesa, he prays
leave to refer to his said Petition, filed
before said Board as before stated:

Your Petitioner further states that in
consequence of no evidence having been

offered in support of his said claim, the same was, on the 10th. day of July A.D. 1853, rejected by said Board, as appears by their Report and Opinion, filed herein at said last mentioned date, to which he begs leave to refer for the grounds of said rejection:

That on the 1st day of December A.D. 1853, a transcript of the record of said cause from said Board, was filed in this Honorable Court, by virtue whereof said cause was appealed to this Court:

That, afterwards, to wit: on the 28th day of April A.D. 1856, your Petitioner filed in this Court, and served upon the U. S. District Attorney for said District, a notice that he would prosecute the said appeal in this Court:

Your Petitioner therefore prays, this Honorable Court to review and reverse the decision of said Commissioners, and to adjudge and decree his said claim to said tract of land valid, and to confirm the same, and, as in duty bound, he will ever pray &c.
