



IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

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Be it Remembered, that on this Second day of March, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Three, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of John A. Sutter,
for the Place named
Town of Sutter,
was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 759 and
is as follows, to wit;

(Vide page 3 of this Transcript.)

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco, January 9th 1855.
Case no. 759, John A. Sutter for the town of Sutter
was ordered to be placed at the foot of the 4th class cases
on the trial docket.

San Francisco, January 23rd 1855.
Case no. 759 was submitted under the Rule of 21st
March 1854.

San Francisco, July 17th 1855.
In the same case Commissioner S. B. Powell delivered
the Opinion of the Board respecting the claim,
(Vide page 5 of this Transcript.)
and the following order was made, vizt,
(Vide page 6 of this Transcript.)

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1859 To the Company, appointed to investigate
and settle land claims in California

Sethlin

John A. Sutter represents

That the town of Sutter
situated upon the Sacramento river within
the limits of the present County of Sacramento
was laid out upon lands claimed by him under
a grant from the former government of California
and conveyed by him to ^{in trust for} ~~to~~ ^{him} ~~the~~
and said town that all the holders and
owners of lots in said town, claim under
him; and that the said town existed on the
7th day of July, 1848.

That the limits of said
town are as follows:

Commencing at a point
on the east bank of the Sacramento river,
about five miles and a half below the
mouth of the American river, at the middle
of main street or laid down on the plan
of said town, near a large Sycamore
tree, standing immediately on the bank of
said Sacramento river, there running down said
river in a southerly direction one half mile;
thence at right angles in an easterly
direction one mile; thence at right angles
to said last mentioned line in a northerly
direction two miles; thence at right angles
to said last line in a westerly direction to
the bank of said river, thence down said
river to the place of beginning; the said
lines being shown on the map of said
town which will be purposed.

We know of no other
claim to any part of the tract of land herein
described. We pray that the title should
be confirmed in his name for the use
and benefit of the lot holders in said
town claiming under him.
