



Your Petition Wm B Ida

of the Township of Ida in the County of  
Colusa State of California respectfully represents  
to Your Honorable Board that he claims a  
certain tract of land called the

"Rancho de la Baranca Colorado"  
containing four square leagues a title now  
or less situated in the County of Colusa and  
State of California, that he claims the same in  
full virtue of a grant made to Josiah Belden  
a Mexican Citizen by Ratification under  
the Authority of the Mexican Government by  
Machitomo Governor Commandant Genl and  
Inspector of the Department of the California  
bearing date the twenty fourth day of Decem-  
ber AD two thousand Eight hundred and  
forty four and approved by the Honorable  
Departmental Assembly on the eighth day of  
October one thousand Eight hundred and  
forty five.

Your Petitioner further represents  
that the said grantee on the ~~twelfth~~ day of  
April One thousand Eight hundred and  
forty nine transferred the Northern half of the  
same to your petitioner as will appear by  
reference to a copy of his deed annexed hereto  
marked B and that on the twenty fourth  
day of May One thousand Eight hundred and  
forty nine the said grantee transferred the  
remaining Southern half of said Rancho to  
your petitioner in connection with James M  
Ida Wm C Cooper and Wm H Ida, and that  
on the twenty third day of June AD one thou-  
sand Eight hundred and forty nine Wm H Ida  
Ida deceased and assigned all his right and

intrest in sa Rancho to Your petitioner  
And James M. Ido and Wm C Cooper as  
will appear by Reference to the accompanying  
of the Copy of the Grants and Marked  
"C" and by the said Deed of the said Wm  
H Ido Endorsed thereon.

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And further Your petitioner hereby  
represents that it is the desire of the said  
interested parties to wit, James M Ido and  
Wm C Cooper that the patent for the same  
to act for the said four leagues of land may  
issue in the name of your petitioner.

Your petitioner would further  
represent that he was put in actual possession  
of the said Rancho on the 15th day of January  
one thousand Eight hundred and forty six  
by the said original Grantees having received  
judicial possession of the proper Officer  
that Your petitioner has peaceably possessed  
said land ever since according to the boundaries  
expressed in the original grant a copy of  
which is hereto presented in the Spanish  
language Marked "A" and also a translation  
of the same Marked "B". That your petitioner  
hath no knowledge of any interfering claim  
whatever and that if requested by Your Hon.  
Board he will give further evidence of this  
title.

Your petitioner pray Your Hon  
Board to take into Consideration his Claim  
to said tract of land and decree the title to  
be paid and confirm the same and Your  
Petitioner will ever pray.

I heard so understood he told me so and I have seen him on the land which he told me he had so obtained.

Question 4.

Did or not the said Bedon occupy the land of so how and whom first -

Answer.

I know that about the end of 1844 or beginning of 1845 Bedon had stock upon the land and built a corral.

Question 5.

When did the claimant Bedon begin to occupy this land & if you know state what improvements if any he put on the land.

Answer.

Mr Bedon settled on it with his family in the latter part of 1845 - He built a dwelling house and put in cultivation upwards of twenty acres and had cattle & horses upwards of sixty three ever since.

the west bank of the Sacramento river in the

North part of Colusa County and is bounded as follows viz, on the North by Bear River Colorado on the East by the Sacramento River on the South by lands granted to Wm G. Chard and on the West by barren and vacant lands.

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Quesiton 1.

Did you or not ever draw a map of the land for the original grants.

Answer.

I did.

Crops Justine propounded by the United States Law Agent.

Crop Justine 1.

No you know what induced Gov. Micheltorma to perfect the title of the claimant in this case in the Sacramento Valley when he refused to grant to others as he did to the claimant.

Answer.

I know nothing of the refusal referred to in the question. I always understood that Gov. Micheltorma after the general title being held would make one in due form to any of those who were embraced in the said general title -

Crops Justine 2.

Do you not know that Gov. Micheltorma in the paper called the general title declared that the Departmental Government struck out at that time if was in form the titles to the lands which had been solicited on account of his engagements.

Answer.

I do know what is in the paper I knew that he said that he had not time to make all the grants required and I further

Know that at the time he issued the general  
title. The defendants were not in Monterey  
but in Sacramento Valley with the exception  
of Mr. Belding Mr. Chard, Mr. Thomas and  
Mr. Dyes & Mr. Poems & all of whom resided  
in Monterey.

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This question objected to as  
irrelevant since by no general title presented in  
this case.



The claimant in this case has affixed  
 before the Commissioner in evidence a true copy of an upoint made  
 by S. B. Narmell, of Josiah Beldin, from the archives of state,  
 in the office of the United States Surveyor



The survey then, though without doubt correctly located, is not in accordance with the decree, and we must therefore decline to issue a Patent until the case is relieved of this objection by reforming the decree.
