



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is the official copy of the original Grant made and signed by me as Justice of the Peace on the 10th of August A.D. 1845. I am agreeable with the signatures of Manuel Pedrozana and Vicente Jimenez. This is a copy of the originals of which this is an official copy as you will

The originals were taken away by Lazarus Peña to Mexico and I do not know that it was ever brought back. Lazarus Peña died not to my knowledge over four years ago and he left this country in 1845.

The second paper is the original map made by myself and truly represents the land granted

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Patten in said Bill mentioned, so far as the same relates to that portion of the land herein described as lying in the Russian River Valley, and North and East of the line drawn along the summit of the Range of hills separating the said Valley of Russian River from the Valley Izabaca, as shown in the Plat of the survey of the Deputy Surveyor Hayes filed as an exhibit to said Bill, and especially as to the alienating, encumbering, leasing or disposing of said land or any part thereof, by the said Defendants or either of them, be stayed, and the same are hereby stayed.

The claim is presented in the names of Jesus, Antonio, Luis, Francisco, & Clara Piña described as Heirs of Jose German Piña decd.

To establish their claim the claimants produced Certified Copies of from the Surveyor General's Office of the following papers.

1. Petition of Jose German Piña for 4 square leagues of land known as "Trabuco" adjoining land of Henry Hatch, accompanied by a diagram, dated Sept²⁵ 1843. Annexed is the usual reference by the Govr Micheltonia for information dated Oct 3, 1843.

2 a favorable report dated Oct¹² 1843.

3. A Deed of concession by Govr Micheltonia dated Oct 14, 1843, for the land known as Trabuco, bounded on the South by the Rancho of Henry Hatch, & East West and North by ranges of Mountains

an extent four square leagues.

No ^{original} title was produced, but a paper purporting to be the original Grant was produced accompanied by a Usurio, and Jose de la Rosa testified that it was an Official Copy of the original Grant made and signed by him as First Alcalde on 10 Aug 1845, and the signatures of Michutorena & Jimenez to the original were genuine.

This paper, so proved, is a title from Michutorena to German Pina dated 14 ^{September} 1843, for the tract as described in the concession.

The existence of the Grant being thus proved, the nonproduction was accounted for thus:

José de la Rosa, proved that he delivered it to Lazaro Pina who left Cal. for Mexico in 1845 and has never returned.

M.G. Vallejo made affidavit that he is admn of Estate of German Pina. That Lazaro Pina father of German left California in 1845 and it is believed with the original title in his possession; that he was killed at Cucul Gordo: that he has made diligent search and inquiry but cannot

find the papers, but believes them lost.

The cultivation and occup-
ancy of the land has been continuous from
a period anterior to the date of the Grant.

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The land is well known by the
name of "Trabucco" and its boundaries
distinctly marked out so that there will
be no difficulty in locating it.

If the Court should deem
the evidence sufficient to establish the loss
of the Grant and account for its nonproduction,
I interpose no objection to the confirmation.
