





by virtue of the Colonization Laws of Mexico that said Bnev-
ides sold and Conveyed said land to your petitioner by deed
dated 25 day of May 1851 that said land is situated in
the County of Solano and bounded by the Ranchos of the
Benavides, Amigo, Caytano, Maris & the hills in the direction
of San Baca and there is no conflicting claim to it as
known to your petitioner.

Your petitioner further show that
said land has been occupied & cultivated from the date
of the grant to the present time as will be proved by testimony
to be produced before your Hon Board.

All which as respectfully submitted



Deposition of Jose' S Benysa in Claim No 202.

Witness states that he is 31 years of age & resides in Martinez, that he is acquainted with Wm. Gordon and Nathan Coombes, the claimants herein & knows that they said Gordon and Coombes bought from his brother, Jose Ignacio Benysa, the Rancho "Los Chimiles" which is situated at the head of the Suisun Valley and on the head waters of the Rio de los Pintos in Solano County, that a grant was made of said Rancho to his said brother sometime in May 1845 by Gov. Pio Pico, that he built a house on said land & occupied it in the same year he also had a ranch on it & ground in cultivation, besides stock of cattle & horses, & that said land has been occupied without interruption to the present time.

This Indictment made this Twelfth day of September AD 1850 between Jose Ignacio Bergasa of Napa County California of the first part and John Moore of the same place of the second part. Whereas it is agreed that the said party of the first part for and in consideration of Five thousand dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged hath granted Bergasa sold & conveyed and doth by these presents Grant & give unto the said party of the second part a certain portion of the Rancho of Chemis more adjoining said County known & described as the Coral Valley or the Valley of Chemis, which Valley is bounded on all sides by the Mountains & borders toward the South West upon the Rancho of Cayetano Juan taking in the whole of said Valley with the Cattle belonging to the said party of the first part noweapartit. Being thirty head of cattle more or less & containing in all Two miles square of land more or less. Together with all & singular the hereditaments & appurtenances therunto belonging or appertaining and the rents & issues & profits thereof & also all the Estate right title interest property claim & demand whatsoever both at law & in Equity of the said party of the first part in & out of the said lands tenements & hereditaments. To have and to hold the same with all the appurtenances unto the said party of the second part his heirs & allies as to their sole & only proprieuse Benefit & behoof forever. And the said party of the first part for himself his heirs executors & administrators doth command & agree to and with the said party of the second part that the said lands & tenements & hereditaments are free & clear and freely acquitted of and from all former gifts grants & bargains sales & estates whatsoever had or made by the said party of the first part or by any person lawfully claiming or to claim under him by his act. And the said party of the first part doth covenant and agree to bid the said party of the second part his heirs & assigns that all and singular the other real lands tenements and premises and every part thereof he will and his heirs and assigns shall warrant and defend against the claims or claims of all and every person lawfully claiming the same by these presents.

The Claim in this Case is presented by Assessors
as a right to the Centro Ranch granted under American
and Mexican Conveyances for distinct and different parcels
hereof as shown by their respective title deeds from the
original grantee, Jose Ignacio Benjuya to whom the
grant was made on the 2^d of May 1846 by Pedro Pico
Governor of California in virtue of the Law of the 1st
of August 1824, and of the Ordinance of the 21st of November
1828 of the Mexican Government by a legally
authenticated Transcript from the Archives of the former
Government of the Country, a Statement of the Description
thereof admitted as Evidence in the Case from the docu-
ments produced and other testimony on file it fully
appears that the grant was duly made by competent
Authority approved on the 22^d of May 1846 by the
Departmental Assembly, and that the premises have
been in the undisputed possession of the grantee and
those claiming under him from the date of the grant
to the present time. The only objection urged by the U.
S. Law Agent against the Confirmation of the Claim is
the want of judicial possession and measurement of
the land which has been occupied by this Plaintiff
in various cases hitherto decided. The grant
is for four square leagues of land or 4 Serias de Canada
Major. In accordance with the principles of decision
prescribed for our government in the 11th Section
of the Act of the 3^d of March 1851 the Claim as held to
be valid, and we proceed to make the following


