





Petition

To the Honorable the Commissioners to Settle  
Private Land Claims in California.

The petition Cayetano Evans respect-  
fully Shows That on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of November AD 1836 he  
applied to the proper authority and received permission  
to occupy and Cultivate the tract of land known by  
the name of Talucay Situate in the then Jurisdiction of  
Sonoma and the now County of Napa, while the proper  
measures were being taken to proceed from the Government  
a title in fee, and that on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of October AD 1841  
a decree was made by the Governor in due form granting  
the said land to the petitioner, all of which is shown in  
the Exhibit an exact copy of which is submitted herewith  
marked "A" with a translation marked "B".

That on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of October AD 1841 Manuel  
Imino Governor ad interim of California by virtue of au-  
thority in him vested granted to the petitioner the  
aforesaid tract of land containing two square leagues  
a title more or less with the boundaries set forth in the  
title and in the map which accompanied the Petition  
a copy of which title is submitted herewith marked "C"  
with a translation marked "D".

That on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of June AD 1845 the  
Departmental Assembly of California approved the said  
grant in law form a copy of which approval is  
submitted herewith marked "E" with a translation  
marked "F".

That on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of April AD 1842 the  
said land was duly Surveyed and the paper plan of it  
given to the petitioner by the proper authority, a copy of  
which act of Survey and Demarcation Possession is submit-  
ted herewith marked "G" with a Translation marked "H".

The petitioner further Shows that the said land  
has not been surveyed by the Surveyor General of the United  
States, but that it was Surveyed by the proper authority  
at the time of giving the Demarcated possession and that  
the boundaries are fully described, easily recognized and  
well known. That he knows of no conflicting claim.

That he has been for more than 16 years, and now is in  
the quiet peaceful and undisputed possession of

of the said tract of land.

The petitioner relies for confirmation of title upon the original papers copies of which are submitted herewith upon the documents & minutes in the Archives now in the custody of the Surveyor General and upon such other and further proofs as he may be advised are necessary.

Wherefore he prays the Commissioner to confirm him the said tract of land.

On this day before Wm. H. Hall one of the Commissioners for Ascertaining and Setting apart Land Claims in California, came M. G. Valliso, a witness produced in behalf of the claimant Cayetano Juanis being hereon called on the examination aforesaid, and was duly sworn.

The U. S. Law Agent present.

In answer to questions in behalf of the claimant the witness testified as follows.

My name is M. G. Valliso, aged forty four years & my residence is at Sonoma in this State.

I know the Rancho Yalucay. It is situated in Napa Valley about twelve miles from Sonoma on the East side of Napa River. The present claimant Cayetano Juanis has occupied the land from 1836 to the present time. He built a house on it in 1836, a large adobe house for himself & numbers of small houses for his Indian servants. Also a large store house.

He immediately plowed flat under cultivation some two hundred acres more which was enclosed with a stone fence. He also kept cattle & horses in it. The number of cattle & horses on the place was at first about two hundred and afterwards the number

was measured to fifteen hundred or more.

I have examined a paper now before me  
marked H. H. purporting to be the original title pa-  
per of the Claimant to the Rancho with the approval  
of the Departmental Assembly & with Evidence of the  
giving of judicial possession I am acquainted with  
the handwriting & signatures of all the persons whose  
names appear upon said papers & I have no doubt  
the signatures are genuine. I was present when the judicial  
possession aforesaid in said papers was given.

In answer to questions by the Law Agent  
the witness testified as follows.

The land is not within ten leagues of the  
Sea coast. It is within ten leagues of Napa Bay.

The land was not occupied by any Mission  
nor was it within the limits of a mission on the 21st of  
November 1828.

rancho previous to 1838. I saw him there in 1838

and he has continued to live there ever since. He had a  
hat or house there in 1838. He built a large house in which  
he now lives. Some four or six years ago or more & most  
of the land suitable for cultivation was fenced. He has  
had stock on the farm ever since I knew it. When I  
was there last he had considerable stock on the farm.  
This land under cultivation was extensive.



The Magistrate who may give the possession will have it measured Conformably to dimensions leaving the surplus which belongs to the Nation for its Conimere uses.  
4th.. Should he do otherwise than these conditions he will lose his right to the land, and it will be alienable by another.







## *Opinion*

The Claim presented in this Case is founded upon a grant made by Manuel Jimeno Governor ad interim, in virtue of the Decree of the 18th of August 1821, and of the ordinance of the 1st November 1828 of the Mexican Government by a regularly authenticated transcript from the archives of the former Government of the Country, by documentary evidence and the depositions in the Case. It satisfactorily appears that the grant was duly made by Competent Authority, on the 26th of October 1841, that it was approved by the Departmental Assembly on the 16<sup>th</sup> of June 1845, that Judicial possession and measurement was had in the manner then practised on the 17<sup>th</sup> of April 1842, and that prior to that time under a provisional title, the Claimant occupied the premises which he has held uninterrupted ever since to the present time. The grant as for two Spanish leagues or Setas de granada Mayor, a little more or less, which last term we have already decided neither avoid the Grant for uncertainty nor increase or diminish the specified quantity in the case of John Prys No 222. In accordance with the principles laid down for our government in the 11th Section of the act of 1851, the Claim is held to be valid and we proceed to make the following Award of Compensation.


