



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To The Hon Board of Commiss for settling Private Land

The Petitioner of Hannah W Coombs
respectfully represents

That on the 21st day of September
1838, Wm B Alvarado Governor of California by
virtue of the power in him vested by the law of 1824
and instructions of 1828 granted to Salazar Valdez
the tract of land called Napa Valley in the present
County of Napa, with the boundaries described in
the grant and accompanying Map which original
grant and map with the approval of the Deputation
and the act of judicial possession with the transcripts
time of the first in record No 95 in the Office of
the Secretary of this Hon Board may be referred to and
prayed to be taken as part of this Petition.

That on the
24th of September 1851, said Salazar Valdez and
Maria Levy, his wife, sold and conveyed to Archibald
Dissinger certain portions of said tract more particu-
larly described in the deed of conveyance, a certified
copy of which is herewith submitted marked B
That on the 29th of September 1851, said Archibald
Dissinger and his wife Mary Dissinger, sold and conveyed to
Yon Petitioner said portions or lots 23, 24, 33 & 34
containing in all one hundred and sixty acres a
certified copy of which deed of conveyance is herewith
submitted marked C

Yon Petitioner further shows
that said tract of land has been for some fifteen
years and now is in the quiet and peaceful possession
of yon Petitioner and those men whom she holds





For a parcel of land
containing 160 acres being
part of the Ranch called Napa
and known as lots 23, 24, 33
and 34 situated in Napa County

The land so claimed in this case is alleged to be a part
of the Ranch so called Napa originally granted to Gal-
va or Valley upon the title of the claimant is derived
from him.

By written stipulation between the Law Agent
and the Attorney for the claimant the test in my hand
contains original documents filed in Case No 495 which
states to the same original grant as to be used as
evidence in this case. By these proofs is made of the ori-
ginal grant by Governor Alvarado bearing date
December 21st 1838 the approval thereof by the De-
partmental Assembly on the 23^d day of the same month
and the giving of formal Possession to the grantee
February 8. 1844.

They also show that the said grantee
went into possession of the land in 1838 or 1839
and overpaid the same for it a sum of horses
and cattle on the place and cultivated the land
This proof is sufficient to establish Valley's right
to the land designated in his grant and to enable
him to trans fer his title by conveyance to another
No intent is there in Success to the portion of the
land claimed in this case the present claimant

It appearing to the court
upon inspecting the minutes and entries in
the Register of the Clerk on the 2nd day of
March A.D. 1857, that an order was made
by the court affirming the decree of the Board
of Land Commissioners made in the above
cause and confirming to the claimant therein,
the lands set forth and described in said
decree. It further appearing that said order
of confirmation was made on an appeal duly
taken from the decision of the said Board of
Land Commissioners and was made with
the consent of the District Attorney in open

court: and it further appearing to the court that by neglect or omission of the claimant's attorney, no formal decree of confirmation was presented to the court for signature, and that no such decree has been signed by the Judge or filed of record, and it being suggested to the court by Philip Seare Esquire, United States Attorney, that the Surveyor General has informed him that it was necessary for the prosecution of public surveys, that a decree in the said cause, describing and defining the boundaries of the land so confirmed as aforesaid, should be entered; and it further appearing to the court from statements of the District Attorney that no objection exists to the entry of the decree of confirmation of the said lands of claimant, Kune pro Kune, as of the day when said order of confirmation was made as shown by the entry in the minutes and in the Register of the Clerk.

Now therefore on the motion of Philip Seare, District Attorney, it is ordered that a decree of confirmation in said cause, be entered, Kune pro Kune, as of said day.

Wherefore in consideration of

the premises, it is hereby ordered, adjudged and decreed that the said decree is hereby affirmed, and it is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that the claim of the said appellee is a good and valid claim and the same is hereby confirmed.

The lands of which confirmation is hereby made are a part of the place known by the name of Napa, in Napa County, which was granted to Salvador Vallejo, which place is bounded and described as follows to wit:

Commencing ~~on~~ the Arroyo of Napa, ~~on~~ the boundary of Nicolas Siquera hence following a Southerly direction to the lower pass of the Arroyo de los Cameros, six thousand varas to a pile of stones, hence toward the North-West along the Arroyo, six thousand varas to the upper road which goes to Napa, hence along the same Arroyo North-North West, to the upper road, which goes to the Rancho of Yunk four thousand six hundred varas, hence continuing on the same course to the boundary of said Yunk, by estimation, ten thousand varas, hence towards the North-North East, three thousand two hundred and fifty varas

To the river Napa, thence down the same river course South East to the arroyo of Napa fifteen thousand one hundred and seventy five varas and thence following the same Arroyo westwardly two thousand six hundred varas, to the place of beginning, containing four square leagues of land, agreeable to the grant, to said Vallejo and the judicial measurement thereof.

The portion of the above described premises of which confirmation is hereby made ^{bounded and} described as follows to wit: being lots number twenty three (23), twenty four (24), thirty three (33), and thirty four (34), containing in each lot 40 acres of land in ^{the} Pueblo de Selvador, according to the survey and plan of the same as made by James Huddspeth being situated in Napa County, and the same premises described in a deed from Archer C Jesse and wife to said Hannah M Coombs dated September 29th A.D. 1851.
