



To the Hon. the Board of Commissioners for settling private land claims in California:

The petition of Henry G. Langley respectfully shows: That on the 21st Sept 1838, Juan B. Alvarado, Governor of California by authority of the law of Mexico, granted to Salvador Vallejo, a certain tract of land called Napa, situate in the present County of Napa, as more fully set forth in the original little paper which are filed in claim No 495 in the office of the Secretary of this Board, hereby referred to & prayed to be taken as part of this petition.

That on the 1st Aug 1850 said Salvador & wife sold & conveyed to Jas W Edmondston J D Brulot & Mr S. Cripps, a certain portion of said tract, more particularly set forth in the deed of conveyance a certified copy of which is herewith submitted marked A.

That on the 19th July 1851 said Crippps, Brulot & Edmondston sold & conveyed said portion of land to Henry H. Lawrence as set forth in the deed of conveyance, a certified copy of which is herewith submitted marked B.

That on the 5th January 1853 said Lawrence sold & conveyed said portion of land to your petitioner as shown in the deed of conveyance, a certified copy of which is herewith submitted marked C.

Your petitioner further shows that said land is now & has been in the quiet & undisturbed possession of your petitioner & those under whom he claims from the date of said grant to the present time, & that he relies for confirmation of his claim upon the original little paper above referred to & upon each other & further proofs as he may be advised as necessary, whereon he prays confirmation of his title to said land.

The land claimed in this case is alleged
to be a part of the Rancho called Napa originally granted
to Salvador Vallejo, from whom through several menu
conveyances, the present claimant derives title.

By written stipulation between the Law
Agent & the attorney for the claimant, the testimony and
certain original documents filed in Case No 495, which
relate to the same original grant, are to be used as evi-
dence in this case. By these proofs is made of the original
grant by Governor Alvarado, bearing date December 21
1838 - the approval of the Departmental Assembly on
the 23rd day of the same month & the giving of judicial
succursa to the grantee on the 8th day of February 1844.
They also show that the said grantee was the successor
of the land in 1838 or 1839 & occupied the same, built a
house, had horses & cattle on the place & cultivated the land.
This proof is sufficient to entitle Vallejo to the property
designated in his grant & to enable him to convey to
another.

The claimant shows title in himself to
the portion of the Rancho claimed by him by of the fol-
lowing conveyance thereof. First. Aded from said
Vallejo & wife to John L. Crossby, James N. Edmonton &
Joseph D. Bristol recorded on the 1st day of August 1850.



by the Court affirming the decree of the Board
of Land Commissioners made in the above
cause and confirming to the claimant therein,
the lands set forth and described in said
decree. It further appearing that said order
of confirmation was made on an appeal duly
taken from the decision of the said Board of
Land Commissioners and was made with
the consent of the District Attorney in open

Court: and it further appearing to the Court
that by neglect or omission of the claimant's
Attorney, no formal decree of confirmation was
presented to the Court for signature, and
that no such decree has been signed by the
Judge or filed of record; and it being suggest-
ed to the Court by Philip Seare Esquire,
United States Attorney, that the Surveyor
General has informed him that it was ne-
cessary for the prosecution of public surveys;
that a decree in the said cause, describing
and defining the boundaries of the land so
confirmed as aforesaid, should be entered;
and it further appearing to the Court from
