



Petition

To the Honorable Board of Commissioners for
Settling Land Claims in the State of California
The petition of Lorenzo D Brown and Robert S
Rundall respectfully represents; That on the 31st
day of September A.D. 1838 Juan B Alvarado, by the
Law of Mexico of 1824 and Instructions of 1828 gran-
teo to Salvador Vallejo a tract of Land called Rancho
de Napa situated in the present County of Napa
with the boundaries described in the grant and acc-
ompanying map, which original grant and map
are now in the office of the Surveyor General of the
United States for the State of California as also the
Approval of the Departmental Deputation and Act
of Judicial possession, all of which copies have been
filed in claim No. 495. in the office of the Secretary
of this Honorable Board hereby referred to and pray-
ed to be taken as part of this petition.

That on the 31st day of December A.D. 1849 the said
Salvador Vallejo sold and conveyed unto One Victor
Pinedon a certain tract of Land within the limits of
said Rancho de Napa containing Six hundred and
forty acres and particularly in the said Conveyance
of Salvador Vallejo a true copy of which is herewith
filed and marked B and prayed to be taken as part
of this petition.

That subsequently to the date of the last mentioned
Conveyance the said tract of Land was lawfully
conveyed according to the Deesas, copies of which
are hereto annexed marked C.D.E & F and is now the
property of your petitioners, for valuable consideration
and accordance with Law.

And your petitioners further show that said tract of
Land has been in the quiet and peaceable possession
of the petitioners and those under whom they hold
that there are no conflicting claims, and that they reside
for confirmation upon the Treaty of Guadalupe Hidalgo

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the act of Congress creating his Honorable Board the
original papers of said Grant above referred to and
such other and further proofs as they may be advised
are necessary - Therefore they pray a decree of confirmation
to their said Grant.
