



To the Commissioners appointed to investigate and settle  
 private Land claims in California  
 Jacob R. Mayer and L. G. Isham represent, That on the  
 30th of September 1841 Manuel Simeno Governor of California  
 under authority of the Laws then in force granted  
 to Maria Ygnacia Lopez a tract of two leagues of land  
 called "La Baja de Santa Rosa described in the grant  
 and which lies in the present County of Sonoma  
 That on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of January 1842 the land was marked  
 out and peaceful possession thereof delivered to the  
 grantee by the proper officer in due form of Law  
 That the land was occupied and improved by the grantee  
 immediately after the date of the grant and has  
 been in the actual possession of the grantee and those  
 claiming under her from that date to the present time,  
 their possession and occupancy extending to the lines  
 marked out when the peaceful possession was given  
 That the said Maria Ygnacia Lopez died in the  
 year 1849 leaving ten children who were her only heirs  
 viz. Julio Canillo, Felicidad Canillo, Bonita Canillo,  
 Francisca Canillo wife of Mariano Vallejo;  
 Juana de Jesus Canillo, wife of David Mullagh;  
 Maria Luisa Canillo wife of Salvadore Vallejo; Maria  
 Marta Canillo; Josefa Canillo de Fitch widow  
 of Fitch; Joaquin Canillo; Jose Ramon Canillo  
 and Romona Canillo wife of John Wilson  
 That all of said heirs united in conveying to Joseph  
 Hooker and De Witt C. Thompson all that portion  
 of said Rancho called "La Baja de Santa Rosa  
 bounded and described as follows viz: Beginning  
 at the South East corner of said Rancho and running  
 thence Northwardly on the Eastern boundary of said  
 Rancho to the Arroyo de Santa Rosa thence down said  
 Arroyo to the fence and dividing line between the lands  
 of Juana Canillo de Mullagh and Marta Canillo as  
 marked and surveyed by E. T. Feabody County Surveyor  
 thence running Southwardly on said dividing

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line to the Southern boundary of Sauc Rancho and  
thence Eastwardly on said Southern boundary to the  
place of beginning.

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That under said conveyance the said Hooker and  
Thompson took such an undivided half interest  
in the portion of said tract of land above described  
that the said Hooker conveyed his undivided half interest  
etc thereon to the petitioner L. G. Isham and the said  
Thompson conveyed his undivided half interest to the  
petitioner Jacob R. Mayer

The petitioners file herewith a copy of the Grant marked  
Exhibit A and a copy of the statement of the proce-  
dings of the Judge in giving judicial possession of  
the Land, marked "Exhibit B" with a translation  
of each of said documents severally marked 2 &  
3; and in support of their claim rely upon the papers  
now filed and such other evidence as they may  
hereafter offer.

They pray a confirmation of their claim according  
to the conveyances under which they hold, the place  
and the lines established when the judicial possession  
was given and in conformity to which the actual  
possession and occupancy have been held.

a witness in behalf of Clemente J. de  
Ganillo No 643 who after being duly  
sworn deposed as follows.

Deponent by Mr. Grelleman  
Attorney for Claimant.

1<sup>st</sup> Question. What is your  
name age and place of residence.

Answer. My name is Salva-  
don Vallejo my age is forty years since I  
reside in Napa County in California.

2<sup>nd</sup> Question. Do you know the  
place called "Calecio de Santa Rosa" if  
so, how long have you known it and  
who has resided upon it?

Answer. I know the place  
and have known it about fourteen  
years. In 1838 I have lived upon it since  
I have known it. Since 1838 Maria Ign-  
acio Lopez has lived on it with her family.

3<sup>rd</sup> Question. State what you  
know about the occupancy of the land  
by her, and the improvements made on  
the place.

Answer. She moved on the  
place in 1837 or 1838. I do not recollect  
which. She built houses on it at the  
time she went there. The houses were  
large, being from fifty to one hundred  
yards on length, and were all stone buildings.  
She cultivated from two to three hundred  
acres of land on the place; had some  
manege fruit trees and a stock of cattle  
and horses on it. She died on the place  
from 1837 or 1838 until her death which  
was about four years ago.

4<sup>th</sup> Question. Do you know  
whether medical supplies of the kind  
were ever given to her if you when and

by whom?

Answer. I myself gave Landecal paper  
em of that place to him, but I do not recollect  
the time - I acted as Civel Magistrate  
of Sonoma in giving the paper.

Please examine  
the documents nowhere presented to you, pur-  
porting to be a record of the act of peaceful  
paper, Milwaukee "Exhibit B" attached  
to the deposition of M. L. Vallejo heretofore  
taken and filed in this case, and

Answer. I have examined the  
paper - the signatures referred to are my  
own genuine signatures. I signed the  
document as Magistrate of Sonoma.

Answer. The docum-  
ent was written by my Secretary and  
signed by me. I cannot recollect the  
course of the different lines measured  
but I can tell you the lines which

Answer. I do not know.

Whereas Dona. Maria Ignacia Lopez has asked for  
her own benefit and that of her family the place known  
by the name of "Cabeza de Sta. Rosa" bounded by the  
Rancho of John Wilson, by that of Marcus West, by  
the Lake which is to the East and the point where  
the Extent of two leagues terminates in the plain of  
Sta. Rosa: the necessary steps having been taken  
and inquiries made as directed by the laws and reg-  
ulations, in excess of the powers which are confi-  
ered upon me, in the name of the Mexican Nation,  
I have granted her the said Land declaring it her  
property by these presents, subject to the approval  
of the Most Excl. Departmental Assembly and to the  
following conditions -

1<sup>o</sup> She shall have power to enclose it without injuring the  
the croppings vines and shrubberies: She shall enjoy  
it freely and exclusively, applying it to the use on each  
elevation which may best suit her but within one  
year she shall build a house and it shall be inhab-  
ited

2<sup>o</sup> She shall solicit the proper Judge to give her the  
judicial possession in virtue of this decree, and he  
shall mark the boundaries, on which shall be placed  
in addition to the moneuments some fruit trees or forest  
trees of some utility

3<sup>o</sup> The Land mentioned is two leagues (de ganado  
maya) of large cattle, a little more or less as

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Explained by the map accompanying the proper Especialente - The Judge who may give the paper shall have it measured in conformity to the ordinance leaving the boundaries which according to the Law for its convenient uses -

4<sup>th</sup> If she should violate these conditions she shall lose her right to the Land once it may be denounced by another -

Wherefore I order that the present title being hereof sum and valice, be registered on the proper Book and be delivered to the party interested for his security and other purposes

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It is stipulated in this case that all papers (except the Mesne Conveyances) filed and depositions of witnesses taken in cause No. 643 in which Jules Carillo is claimant of part of the same Rancho called "Cabeza de Santa Rosa" shall be considered as filed and taken in this case.

By the depositions and documentary evidence filed in this cause it is shown that on the 30th of September A.D. 1841 a Grant for the place called "Cabeza de Santa Rosa" was made by Manuel Moreno acting Governor to one Maria Ygnacia Lopez and that on the 31<sup>st</sup> day of December A.D. 1841 she did possess of the same lands, given to the grantee, and the limits and boundaries thereof marked and defined, and it is also shown that the original grantee as early as the year 1837 or 1838 entered upon said place, built a large adobe house, cultivated two or three hundred acres of the land and continued to live there until her death which happened after the Americans had taken possession of the country.
