



and concluded by the claimants. Case submitted  
and taken under advisement by the Board.

the opinion of the Board concerning the claim;

To the Honorable Commissioners  
to Settle private land Claims of California.

The petitioners Josefa Palomares widow and her Agustin Palomares, Francisco Palomares and Victorino Palomares children of Francisco Guerrero Palomares deceased respectfully show. That on the 30<sup>th</sup> day of November A.D. 1836 Nicolas Gutierrez Governor ad interim of California by virtue of authority in him vested, granted to the said Francisco Guerrero Palomares a "Quinte" or lot of land near the Mission of Dolores in the County of San Francisco 400 varas Square, with the boundaries described in the title and map, a copy of which original title papers and map is submitted, here with marked A with a translation marked B.

The petitioners also submit herewith a plot of the said tract of land made on the 24<sup>th</sup> day of December A.D. 1850 by the Deputy County Surveyor of San Francisco County. The Petitioners further show that the said Francisco Guerrero died on the 13<sup>th</sup> day of July A.D. 1836 leaving the petitioners his widow and heirs that the said Guerrero from the year 1836 to the time of his death was, and his widow and children now are in the quiet peaceful and undisputed possession of the said tract of land. That it has not been surveyed by the Surveyor General of the U.S. but that it has been surveyed by the County Surveyor of San Francisco, as aforesaid, and its boundaries marked out. Its limits are well defined, the tract being surrounded by a fence. That they know of no conflicting claim. That they rely for confirmation upon the original papers copies of which are submitted herewith, upon the minutes and records in the office of the Surveyor General and upon such other and further proofs as they may be advised are necessary.

Wherefore they pray the Commissioners to confirm them the aforesaid tract of land.

Deposition of Wilson one of the Commissioners for ascertain-  
ing and Setting private Land Claims  
in California Came Guinecido Flores  
a witness produced on behalf of the  
Claimants Josefa Palomares et al. His

No. 229, on the Docket of said Com-  
missioners and after being duly sworn tes-  
tified as follows.

The Law Agent of the United States was  
duly notified and attended. The witness  
testimony was taken in the Spanish  
language and interpreted by Geo. Tishus  
Secretary.

Questions of Claimant  
1st Question. What is your name  
age and place of residence?

Answer - My name  
is Guinecido Flores, my age  
is 55 years. I reside in Santa  
Barbara. I have lived in  
California 19 years.

2<sup>nd</sup> Question. Do you know the signatures of Jose Figueroa, Francisco Guimaraes, Nicolas Gutierrez and Gerardo Flores. if so say if these signatures to the documents before you are genuine if the papers and map are genuine, and originals executed at the time of their dates, and if document marked "A" filed as Exhibit in claim No 229 in the Office of the Secretary of the Commissioners are correct copies of these originals?

Answer. I know the signatures of Jose Figueroa, Francisco Guimaraes & Nicolas Gutierrez these signatures to the documents before me are genuine. the signature of Gerardo Flores is my own and was signed at the time the papers & map are genuine & executed at the time they purport to be. and Exhibit "A" is a true copy of these originals.

3<sup>rd</sup> Question. What do you know about the possession of this piece of land.

Answer. Immediately after the grant was made to Guimaraes he occupied the land for a period of 8 years and continued to occupy it till his death which took place in Aug. 1851. His widow now occupies it. The children of Guimaraes are Jose Augustin, Francisco & Victorino all minors. His widow is named Pasqua. The land is surrounded by a fence. I was Administrator of the Mission of Dolores in 1836 when I signed this original paper he never took possession of the land in 1836, it was covered with bushes. (monte). when he took possession he cleared it off and fenced it in.

The documentary evidence in this case shows an application for the grant made by Francisco Lummo on the 28th day of October 1836, according to the Governor for a report submitted by the Administrator of the Mission of San Francisco, the favourable report of that Officer and the grant of the land in accordance with the petition. No approval of the grant appears to have been obtained. The concession is dated November 30, 1836, and is signed by the olas bearing the Governor.

The land solicited is described in the petition for the grant as four hundred varas square, in a marshy place which forms a plain N.N.W. of the mission from the place where the water springs from the north to south. East and west to the road to Greda Bains according to the map which is attached to the petition and grant. The map has also four lines drawn upon it evidently intended to indicate the land solicited. There are unfortunately however no objects named which constitute boundaries at this boundary and no distances from any one point to another given either on the map or in the description and there is no scale of distances found on the map. I have no doubt of the approximate right of the party to the land within the lines marked on the map, but I do not think

the map or the description contained in the grant or the petition on which it was made contain contained by other evidence sufficient words of description to enable us to describe it in a decree or a Surveyor to run the lines according to any lines of the grant. The case does not however rest on this alone. The witness Flores testifies that immediately after the grant was made he and his master occupied the land for a garden and continued to occupy it until his death which took place in July 1831. He took possession of the land in 1830, it was covered with bushes and he cleared it off and fenced it in. It is still surrounded by a fence and his widow now occupies it. The land thus fenced in and cultivated as a garden is described by the witness as the land covered by the grant and his cultivation and fence continued from that time to the present to mark its extent and boundaries. This agreement the premises no fact from the surrounding lands and may well serve as the descriptive limits of the premises in a deed of confirmation.

The widow and children of the deceased grantee we think are entitled to retain the premises thus granted to and occupied by him and advised will be treated accordingly.

In this case as aforesaid the proofs and allegations it is aforesaid by the Commission that the claim of the petitioner Josefa Palomares, the widow and the heirs at law of Francisco Guinero deceased is valid and the same is hereby confirmed to the widow and heirs of said deceased to hold the said premises and the improvements to which they were legally entitled as widow and heirs respectively at the time of the death of said deceased.

The land of which confirmation is hereby made is situated in San Francisco County near the Mission Dolores being four hundred varas square in a marshy place which forms a plain N.N.W of the mission from the place where the water springs from the north to south East and West to the road to Yerba Buena according to the map of the same attached to the original grant of said land to said Francisco Guinero which as we perceive this case the land hereby confirmed being the same which was occupied by said Guinero from the year 1836 until his death and by his family since his deceased and which was cleared and fenced in by him about the time last mentioned and has been cultivated as a garden since that time. The land hereby confirmed embraces only the premises thus enclosed and cultivated by said Guinero and is bounded on its exterior boundaries to the line of the fence erected by him at the time above specified.
