



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Be it Remembered, that on this twenty seventh day of February, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Two, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of José Noriega and Roberto Livermore, for the place named "Las Pocitas," was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 77 and is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco Feb. 11th 1853.

In cause no. 77, José Noriega & Roberto Livermore, for the place named "Las Pocitas," the deposition of Guillermo Carter, a witness in behalf of the claimants, taken before Commissioner Hilario Hall, with documents marked N. 1, 2, 3. annexed thereto, was filed,

San Francisco Oct. 12th 1853.

Case no. 77 was called, submitted on briefs and taken under advisement by the Board.

San Francisco Feb. 14th 1854.

In the same cause Commissioner Thompson Campbell delivered the opinion of the Board confirming the claim; (Vide page 16 of this Transcript.)

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To the Board of Commissioners for ascertaining and
settling private land claims in the State of California.

Your petitioners José Noriega & Robert Livermore
of the state of California, respectfully represent to your
honorable board that they claim a certain tract of land
called Las Pocitas, containing two leagues, more or less,
situated in the county of — in said State of California;
that they claim the same in fee by virtue of a grant made
to themselves, under the authority of the Mexican Govern-
ment by John B. Alvarado, Governor of the department
of the Californias, bearing date the 10th day of April
1839 & approved by the Territorial diputation on the
22nd day of May 1840.

Your petitioners present herewith their original
grant of said land in the Spanish language together
with a translation of the same, & will make further
proof of title if required by the board.

Your petitioners pray your honorable board to
take into consideration their claim to said tract of land
& deem their title to be valid & confirm the same.

And your petitioners will ever pray

My name is Guillermo Castro, my age is forty four
years & I reside in the County of Contra Costa —

A paper is now shown me being Exhibit B filed
in this case & is here attached & marked H. H. No 1.
I am acquainted with the handwriting & signature of
Juan B. Alvarado, Manuel Jimenez, & Manuel Busta-
nane & their signatures on said paper I believe to
be genuine.

A paper is also shown me being Exhibit D filed
in this case & here attached & marked H. H. No 2. on
which the signature of said Alvarado & Jimenez, also
appear, & which I believe to be genuine.

I am acquainted with the handwriting & signatures
of Jose' L. Fernandez. A paper is shown me to which a
map is attached being Exhibit C filed in this case
which is here attached & marked H. H. No 3 — I
believe the signature of said Fernandez to be genuine.
& I also believe the hand writing on said map to be
that of said Fernandez.

I am acquainted with the tract of land called Las
Peceras situated in Contra Costa County. It has been


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occupied ever since the year 1835 by William Gulman
& Robert Salmon - It is now occupied by said Salmon
& Josi Noniga. They had a small house at
first & occupied with cattle; & cultivated the ground
having a garden, orchard & vineyard - Their occupa-
tion has continued to the present time.

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



Whereas Don José Noriega & Don Roberto Governor
have petitioned for their own benefit & that of their fam-
ilies, the place known by the name of Las Boitas, bound-
ed by the border of the hillside of Las Boitas which
is in the Willow Grove de la Agua as far as the
mountain range of Buenos Aires, & the hills of Las
Boitas, having previously complied with the require-
ments & restrictions in the matter, now in the
exercise of the authority given me vested, in the name of
the Mexican Nation, I have thought proper to grant
them said place declaring the same to be their property
by this letter patent, said concession is understood to be
in entire conformity with the laws, subject to the ap-
proval of the Govt Departmental Board of the In-
digenous Government & under the following conditions.

1. They may find it, without obstructing or way,
roads & trails, they shall enjoy it fully & exclusively
appropriating it to the use or culture they may deem
fit, but within a year they will build a house which
they will cause to be inhabited.
2. When the property shall be confirmed to them, they
shall exhibit the respective judge to give them judi-
cial possession by virtue of this patent, by whom the
boundaries shall be marked, at the limits of which,
besides the land marker he shall assume fruit tree
or else wild one of some usefulness.

3. The land of which donation is made is of two leagues little more or less, as the design annexed to the proceedings with its respective limits appertain: the Judge who shall give possession, will cause the same to be measured agreeably to ordinance, in marking the boundaries between the cases (subrente) which might result to the Nation for such uses as may be deemed convenient.

4. If they shall contravene to their conditions they shall lose their right to said land, which may be demanded by any other power.

I therefore command that holding these presents to be a firm & valid title, the same be entered in the proper book, & be returned to the interested parties for their own security & other purposes.

The concession made by his Honor the Governor
of the place called las Pachas del Valle to M^r
José Noniqa & Roberto Livermore is hereby approved.

And in conformity with this day's demand made
to the respective proceedings, the present is issued to
the parties Don José Noniqa & Don Roberto Livermore
in confirmation of the above mentioned grant.

"Los Pocitos"

The papers on file in this case show that
Opinion of the on the 10th day of April 1839, the petitioners obtained
Board of Censors from Governor Alvarado, a grant for a tract of land
called Los Pocitos, that on the 10th day of June A.D.
1840, the said grant was duly approved by the De-
partmental Assembly.

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There is no proof that any judicial measure
of the land was ever made.

It is proved by the deposition of Guillermo
Castro that the land in question was occupied over
since the year 1835 by William Culmar & Robert
Livermore, & that it is now occupied by said Liver-
more & José Noniaga. He further states that at first
they had a small house on it, & occupied it until they
cultivated the ground, having a garden, orchard &
vineyard.

The evidence shows a substantial compliance
with the conditions of the law. It is true that only one
of the grantees is proved to have lived on the place,
before & immediately after the grant, but taking the
residence on the land as proof, in connection with
the fact of cultivation for a long series of years, I
think the requirements of the law have been com-
plied with.

The identity of the land, is the most perplexing
question. The land granted is described in the grant
in the following words, to wit: Bounded by the
borders of the hillocke of Los Pocitos, which are on
the Willow Grove, de la Agua, as far as the mountain

range of Buenos Ayres, & the hills of La Plata -
The 3rd condition of the grant, designates the land as
being two leagues, a little more or less, as the design
annexed to the proceedings with its respective limits
explains, & provides for a substrate. That the map
here referred to was intended to be a part of the grant
is made manifest from the fact, that a certified copy
of the original accompanied the grant, & was deliv-
ered to the party for his security. The boundaries
as designated on the map do not, in very particu-
lar, answer to the call in the grant, but in the
main they correspond. I think it is apparent that
it was the design, to grant the land enclosed
within the limits as designated on the map.

The petitioners are therefore entitled to a confor-
mation of the claim, in conformity with the
boundaries as laid down on the map marked C. &
filed in the cause.



2^o When the ownership thereof is confirmed to them, they shall solicit the proper Judge to give them judicial possession by virtue of this title, by which shall be designated the boundaries of the same, on the limits of which will be placed besides the lands

3° - The land of which donation is made, is
of two leagues a little more or less, as is
explained by the map attached to the Expediente,

that on the 11th July 1834,

Guillermo Galván petitioned
Gov Tiqueroa for the tract
of land claimed. His petition
with Gov. Tiqueroa with the

to the laws which seem to
have characterized all his
proceedings with regard to
grants of land. referred to
the Ayuntamiento of the Pueblo
of San José and to the Revd
Father Brumster of the Mission
of San José. favorable re
ports having been received
from those persons, the Gov
ernor by a further order of

Dated August 8. 1834 and
the petition to be passed to
the Alcalde of the Capital
before whom the petition was
directed to appear and an

On the 28 Mayth 1839 the Governor Alvarado sends the petition to be referred to the Prefet that he may procure a report from the Administrator of the Mission of San José —

On the 2^d April 1839 the Administrator of the mission makes a favorable report and on the 10th April, 1839 the decree of concession was made and the expediente ordered to be reserved for the consideration of the most exalted plenipotential Junta —

On the 19th May 1840. The
Expediente was submitted
to the Junta on the 20th.
It was returned ^{to the Government} with a
report signed by the President
and Secretary of that body.
This document contains the
report of the Committee to
whom the Expediente was
referred, and the resolution
of approval adopted by
the Junta.

The title however or final docu-
ments, had previously issued
~~accorded~~ on the 10th day of
April 1839 and the usual
borrador or draft of it is
found in the Expediente.

The beginning of this Expediente
is undisputed.

It is found among the An-
cives, and it is mentioned
by its number, the name of
the tract and the names
of the grantees in Jimeno's
index.

It also appears by a cutted
extract from the Journals of

the assembly that in the record of their proceedings of May 22. 1840 the resolution of approving of this grant is duly recorded —

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The signatures to the title produced by the claimants are duly produced & there can be no question but that the genuineness of this grant is proved by the clearest as well as the best evidence which could be offered in support of any title issued by the former government of this country —

It is also shown that the grantee ^{and} has for a long series of years and even from a date prior to that of the grant been occupied Cultivated —

The claim is therefore undoubtedly valid and the decree of the Board confirming it must be affirmed —
