



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To The Hon'ble the Board of Commissioners
for Settling Private Land Claims in California.
The Petition of Ann McDonald
Aotemesia Pyall, Eliza Smith James Smith,
Heirs of Hiram Smith deceased respect-
fully shows.

That on the 21st September 1838
Juan B Alvarado Governor of California by
virtue of the Colonization Laws of the 18th of
August 1824 and the instructions of the
21st of November 1828 granted to Salvador
Vallejo a certain tract of land called Napa,
situate in the present County of Napa,
with the boundaries described in the grant
and accompanying map, which original
grant & map with the approval of
the deputation, and act of judicial
possession are filed in Claim No 495
in the Office of the Secretary of this Hon'ble
Board hereby referred to and prayed
to be taken as part of this petition.

That on the 18th of Sept 1847 said
Salvador sold & conveyed a certain portion
of said tract to Hiram Smith, father
of your Petitioner deceased as aforesaid,
which said portion of land is more
particularly described in the Deed
of conveyance a copy of which is
herewith submitted marked "B".

That they claim the lands described
in the foregoing described deed.

Your Petitioners further show that
said tract of land has been for some
fifteen years and is now in the quiet
and undisputed possession of your
petitioner and those under whom they
hold. That they know of no conflicting
claim.

That they rely for confirmation of
their claim upon the original title papers above
referred to, and upon such other and further proofs
as they may be advised are necessary.

Wherefore they pray confirmation of their title
to said land.

dead or living, whether he left any
children, and if so what are their names
and where they reside.

Ans. I know Hiram
Smith in his lifetime, I understood
he died near Fort Laramie about a
year ago last June as he was
returning from the Atlantic States with
cattle.

the wife of Thos P. Ogall, Elisa John
and James. They all live in the
Town of Sonoma in this State. His
wife has been dead several years.

Question by same. State what
you know of the location and occupation
of the land conveyed in said deed.

Ans. It is situated about four
miles from the town of Napa, in the County
of Napa. It was occupied by Smith
some years before his death, and has been
occupied by his Administrator up to the
present time. There were improve-
ments on the place. And further this
deponent saith not.

called "Napa" in Napa Valley, which was
granted to Salvador Vallejo in 1838.
The grantee first occupied it in 1838 or
1839; he built a house on it, & corrals,
had cattle and horses on it, and cultivated
portions of the land, since the Americans
took possession of the country he has
sold portions of it to various individuals.

1st Question. What are your
name age and place of residence?

Answer. My name is

Emile A. d' Kermecourt, my age is about
thirty seven years, and I reside in Napa
City in California.

2nd Question. What office
(if any) do you hold in Napa County -
and how long have you held such
office.

Answer. I hold the Office
of County Surveyor and have held it
since the month of April A.D. 1852.

3rd Question. Examine
the papers here presented and shown to
you marked "L" and also with the Initials
"A.S." heretofore filed in this case and
purporting to be a survey of a part of
the Napa Rancho and to be signed
by you, and state whether the same
was made and signed by you, and if
so what the same is?

Answer. I have exam-
ined the paper, it was written and

signed by me, it is a survey of a tract of land deeded by Salvador Vallejo to José W. Revere. The Survey was made by me and I run the lines as therein described. The plat on said paper is a correct representation of the Survey as actually made, with the lines and monuments correctly laid down.

4. Question, Do you know whether the tract of land represented on said plat is within the boundaries of the Juristic survey of the Napa tract as represented in Document marked "A" and filed in this case.

Answer, It is within the boundaries of the land described in said Document.

5th Question, When and in what capacity did you make the Survey of the land?

Answer, I made it on the twenty ninth day of August A.D. 1852 and in the capacity of County Surveyor as aforesaid, and reported it on the day after it was made.

de sitios que componen.

Whereas Don Salvador Vallejo has for his own personal benefit, and that of his family, petitioned for the land known by the name of Napa, within the boundaries of the map which accompanied his petition, the proper measures being previously taken as required by the Laws & regulations on the matter, using the powers which are conferred on me in the name of the Mexican Nation, I have granted him the aforesaid Land, declaring to him the ownership of it by these presents, said grant being understood to be in entire conformity with the Laws, subject to the approval, or disapproval of the Most Excellent Deputation, and under the following conditions.

1st Neither the grantee nor his heirs, may divide or alienate that which is granted to them, subject it to any tax, entail, pledge, mortgage or other encumbrance, even for pious purposes, or convey it in mortmain.

2nd He may enclose it without prejudice to the crossings, roads and servitudes, he will enjoy it freely and exclusively, making such use and cultivation of it as may best suit him.

3^d When the ownership is granted to him he will request the proper magistrate to give him the juridical possession in

virtue of this Patent, by whom its boundaries will be marked out and its bounds placed.

4^o The land of which donation is made is solely that described in the petition of the person interested, and marked out on the map and the magistrate who may put him in possession will advise this government of the number of square leagues it contains.

In consequence I order that this present serving him for a title, and being held as firm and valid, note be made of it in the Corresponding book and it be delivered to the person interested for his security and other convenient purposes.

In the rancho of Napa on the eighth day of the month of February eighteen hundred forty four; Present Captain Don Salvador Vallejo, and the neighbors to said lands; I caused to appear before me and those of my assistance, citizens Paulino Vasquez and Francisco Heijera measurers appointed whom I ordered to take a cordel of hemp and to measure off fifty varas with a vara measure of four Castilian palms, and in effect the said measurers, in my presence, measured off the aforesaid number of fifty varas on a cordel, twisted, and

well stretched, with a stamped Mexican
Castilian vara measure, which was
done faithfully and legally in the sight
and presence of the party interested and
neighbors; and in testimony I order it
to be recorded officially, and said measur-
ments to be proceeded to, as is ordered;
which I certif. also signing it with those
of my assistance.

Being in the fields and lands pertain-
ing to the Rancho of Napa, of the Captain
Don Salvador Vallejo this eighth day of February
Eighteen hundred forty four, I, the ^{1st}
Alcalde of this jurisdiction, acting in
virtue of my office with two assisting
witnesses for want of a Notary Public,
present Citizens Paulino Vasquez and
Francisco Heijesa, measurers appointed
by the party interested and coluidanted
I ordered them to proceed to the mea-
surement of four square leagues, which,
a little more or less, belong and pertain
to the Rancho aforesaid, according to the
title and map presented, in obedience
to which, having again measured
and examined the cordel, they commenced
said measurements, beginning at the

Arroyo de Napa, boundary of Nicolas Heigueras from which place following a southerly direction to the lower pass of the Arroyo de los Caminos, they measured one hundred and twenty Cordels of fifty veras each.

There the person interested raised a pile of stones as a sign for the landmark which he would place; from this point, continuing the measurement towards the N.W. along the Arroyo to the upper road which goes to Napa one hundred & thirty Cordels (six thousand varas) were counted and the party interested placed the cones, sounding mark in order to fix there also the respective bound.

Following the same Arroyo N.N.W. to the Upper road which goes to the Rancho of Sunth ninety two cordels (four thousand six hundred veras) were counted and not being able to pass forward because it is an impossible mountain range, it was estimated by eye, that there were two hundred cordels (ten thousand varas) to the boundary of Sunth, where he also placed another mark in order to fix another bound; and continuing towards the S.S.E. to the river of Napa, Sixty five cordels (three thousand two hundred and fifty veras.) were measured, where he placed as in the former points, the corresponding bounds,

Going down the same river course S.E. to the Arroyo de Napa, three hundred three and a half Cordels were measured (fifteen thousand one hundred and seventy five varas) he placed the mark for a bound, & following

the same Arroyo W. we came to the point where the measurement was commenced and they counted fifty two cordels (two thousand six hundred varas) so that considering as finished the measurement of the land included in the Rancho of Napa, there results a boundary of (forty seven thousand six hundred and twenty five varas) a little less than that which corresponds ~~with~~ to four square leagues; and the aforesaid measure declared that Captain Don Salvador Vallejo was informed of the lands which correspond to him, according to the title and map which are found at the head of this Expediente.

For all which and in sign of true possession and accustomed ceremonial, he pulled up grass & stones and threw to the four winds in manifestation of his legal and legitimate possession which he personally took,

In consequence I ordered that for greater clearness of the boundaries which have been described, he should form at his own cost and expense, bounds of masonry in height more than a vara, that in all time it may appear, let them be recognised and remain as limits & boundaries of his lands by the others, neighbors thereto and that said measurements were executed quietly and peaceably without contradiction of any person, he prayed for a testimony and I the aforesaid ^{17th} Alcalde with those of my assistance give it, that

all passed as has been said, and that said measurements have been executed to the best of the knowledge and understanding of the measurers, as they depased without craft or fraud or deceit against any person and for greater ~~extant~~ security and the ratification of the oath which they have made, they signed with me and those of my assistance to which I certify.

They also show that said grantee went into possession of the land in 1838, or 1839 and occupied the same, built a house, had horses & cattle on the place and cultivated the land.

This proof is sufficient to establish Valley's right to the land designated in his grant and enable him to transfer his title by conveyance to another.

The claimants have also given in evidence duly proved a deed of the premises claimed by them, being part of said Rancho of Aspa executed by said Valley to Hiram Smith on the 18th day of September 1843.


