



To the Hon the Board of Commissioners for settling private
Land claims in California

The petition of James M Hardin respectfully Shows
That on the 21st of Sep. 1838 Juan B Alvarado Governor
of California by virtue of the Laws of Mexico granted
to Salvador Vallejo a certain tract of land
called Napa Station in the present County of Napa
with the boundaries described in the grant and
accompanying map, which original grant & map
with the approval of the Departmental Assembly
and act of Successional possession, with the transcript
of the same are filed in claim No 495 in the Office
of the Secretary of this Board, hereby referred to and
prayed to be taken as part of this Petition

That on the 3rd March 1847 said Salvador Vallejo
conveyed to John Gregsby a certain portion of said
tract of Land, more particularly described in the
Deed of Conveyance a certified copy of which
of which is herewith submitted marked B

That on the 16th of August 1850 said Gregsby sold and
conveyed said portion of Land to your petitioner as set
forth in the Deed of Conveyance, a certified copy is
herewith submitted marked C

That said portion of Land contains One hundred acres
(100) acres

Your petitioner further Shows, that on the 25th Sept.
1847 said Vallejo sold and conveyed to John Gregsby
a certain other portion of said tract of land, more
particularly described in the Deed of Conveyance
a certified copy of which is herewith submitted
marked D

That on the 27th Aug 1848 said Gregsby sold & convey
ed to James Harbin a certain part of said portion
more particularly described in the Deed of Convey
ance, a certified copy of which is herewith subm
itted marked E

That on the 22nd January 1851 said James Harbin
sold and conveyed to your petitioner said part of
said portion of Land as set forth in the Deed of
Conveyance, a certified copy of which is herewith
submitted marked F

Your petitioner further Shows, that said part of said
portion of Land contains One hundred and Sixty
(160) acres, more or less.

Your petitioner further Shows that on the 9th April

1847 said Gregsby and Mahoola his wife sold and conveyed to John Tracy above named, a certain Other part of said portion of Land (conveyed to him by said Salvador as aforesaid) more particularly described in the Deed of Conveyance a certified copy of which is herewith submitted marked C That on the 16th of August 1850 said Tracy sold and conveyed to your petitioner said portion of Land as set forth in the Deed of Conveyance a certified copy of which is herewith submitted marked D That said portion contains Three Hundred & Twenty (320) acres of Land.

Your petitioner further shows, That on the 16th of June 1851 said Salvador sold and conveyed to Herman Mohler a certain Other portion of said tract more particularly described in the Deed of Conveyance, a certified copy of which is herewith submitted marked E That said portion contains Three Hundred & Twenty (320) acres of Land.

That on the 20th Dec 1851 said Salvador sold and conveyed to said Mohler the remaining portion of said tract, as set forth in the Deed of Conveyance, a certified copy of which is herewith submitted marked F That on the 20th of March 1852 said Mohler sold and conveyed to Otto H Funk all the interest he had in said tract as aforesaid, which is more fully shown in the Deed of Conveyance a certified copy of which is herewith submitted marked G That on the 2^d August 1852 said Funk sold and conveyed to your petitioner a certain portion of said interest in said tract of land more particularly described in the Deed of Conveyance, a certified copy of which is herewith submitted marked H That said portion contains One hundred and Eight (108) acres.

Your petitioner further shows that the several portions of Land above set forth, have been for some fifteen years and now are in the quiet and undisputed possession of your petitioner and those under whom he holds. That he knows of no conflicting claim.


March 5th 1853 That he relies for confirmation of his said claims upon the Oregon title papers above referred to & upon such other and further proofs as he may be advised are necessary. Wherefore he prays confirmation of his said titles to said Land.



Aug 21st 1850

This Indenture made and concluded this Sixteenth day of August in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and Fifty between John Gray of Sonoma County State of California of the first part, and John M Harbin of Napa County California of the second part. Witnesseth; That the said party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of Three Thousand Six hundred and fifty dollars to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is here by acknowledged, hath this day bargained and sold, and by these presents doth hereby grant his gain and sell unto the said party of the second part his heirs and assigns forever three cutumbracts or parcels of Land, situated and being in Napa County State of California, described as follows Tract No. 1 Commencing at a point near the western line of the tract of Land sold by Salvador Vallejo to John Gregsby, where there is a large Spring of water thence running two hundred and twenty yards south and two hundred and twenty yards North of said Spring, so as to make the breadth of said tract Four hundred and forty yards along said Gregsby's western line and thence running with the said breadth of Four hundred and forty yards in a westerly direction towards the mountains so as to inclose said Spring, and to contain one hundred acres of Land, reserving a strip of twenty yards in width along the said line of Gregsby for a publick Road, but which strip is not to be inclosed in the said one hundred acres nor to form any part thereof. 





Opinion

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The Land claimed in this case is alleged to be a part of the Rancho Called Napa originally granted to Salvador Vallejo, from whom through several mesne Conveyances, the present claimant derives title.

By a deposition made by the advocate Sue Aguirre and the attorney for the claimant, the testimony given in Case No 495 which relates to the same original grant, is to be used as evidence in this case. By this testimony proof is made of the original grant to Salvador Vallejo by Governor Alvarado bearing date December 21, 1838. The approval thereof by the Departmental Assembly on the 23rd day of the same month, and the giving of a receipt of possession of the premises to the grantee February 8, 1844. It also shows that said grantee went into possession of the land in 1838 or 1839 and occupied the same, built a house had horses and cattle on the place and cultivated the same. This proof is sufficient to establish Vallejo's right to the land granted in his name, and to authorize him to transfer his right to it by conveyance.

The present claimant alleges title himself to four separate parcels of the same embraced in said grant to Vallejo, comprising in the whole six hundred and eighty eight acres. The mesne Conveyances in regard to each of which are given in evidence.

The first tract contains one hundred acres and was conveyed by Salvador Vallejo to John Loring by deed dated March 23rd 1847 and by said Loring to James Starlein, the present claimant by deed dated August 16, 1850.

The second tract contains one hundred and sixty acres and was conveyed by Salvador Vallejo to John Loring by on the 25th day of September 1847 and by said Loring by wife to James Starlein on the 17th day of 1848 under by Salvador James Starlein and wife to James Starlein the claimant on the 22nd January 1851. In the decree of conveyance last mentioned an error is

found in the description of the property, and a new
Deed of Conveyance Executed by the same parties

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
