



Petition

To the Honorable Commissioners to settle Private
Land Claims in California.

The petitioner Mariano G. Vallejo respectfully represents
That on the 9th day of May A.D. 1836 Mariano Chico
Governor of California by virtue of authority in him
vested, granted to Nicolas Siquenca the tract of land
Known by the Name of "Entre Napa" or "Napa Abajo" in
in the present County of Napa containing a little more
than One Square League as described in the little papers
all which is shown by the Specimen & translation of
which is submitted herewith marked "A" and the origi-
nal title or patente, a translation of which is submit-
ted herewith marked B

That the said grant was effectuates duly opposed by
the proper authority, and the protest given in due form
a translation of which is herewith submitted
marked "C"

That on the 7th day of November A.D. 1848 the said
Nicolas Siquenca sold and conveyed to the petitioner
a part of the aforesaid tract of Land being three hun-
dred Varas On each Side, as is more particularly desor-
ibed in the Deed of Conveyance, a translation of
which is herewith Submitted marked "D"

And the petitioner further represents that the said
Siquenca since the petitioner have been for more than
Sixteen Years and Three the petitioner now is in the
quiet and undisputed possession and occupation
of the aforesaid tract of Land.

That he knows of no conflicting claim.

That he relies for Confirmation of title upon the
original papers, translations of which are submitted
herewith, upon the records and minutes in the
Archives of the former government; and upon such
other and further proofs as he may be advised
are necessary.

Wherefore he prays the Commissioners to confirm to
him the aforesaid tract of Land.

My Name is Jose de la Rosa; My age is 61 years
Reside in Sonoma and have resided there over 21
years. I know the Rancho called "Entre Napa" it
is in Napa Valley and was granted to Nicolas
Higuera in 1834. He gave first occupancy this
Rancho in 1834; he built a house on it and corral
had cattle and horses on it and cultivated a
portion of the land, he continued to occupy it until
his death; he died in 1853; before his death he sold
parts of it to Joseph Thompson and others.

I know the Signatures of Mariano Chico, Francesco
de Castillo Negrete, Salvacion Valley, Cayetano
Ibarra, Apolonario Merada, Nicols P. Leese; their
Signatures to the papers before me marked No 1
(in claim No 337 of same witness) are genuine

Nicolas Higuera, settler on this frontier, before your Excellency, in the manner provided by law requires; that sometime ago he removed the stock which he had in San Francisco on the other side of the port to this Pueblo of Sonoma, for the purpose of establishing himself here with his family, and having need of a private Land for cultivation and for his subsistence, and being such land which is marked out in the map adjoined, which comprises one square league in the place of Napa.

Wherefore he prays your Excellency to be pleased to grant this request with your accustomed benignity, for which he will be entirely gratified.

In conformity, the laws relating to the matter the Ayuntamiento of San Francisco will report if the petitioner possesses the requisites provided in the Law of August 28th 1834 to entitle his petition to be attended to; if the Land asked for belongs to any private person, Mission or Pueblo; if it is irrigable, dependent on the seasons or pasture Land and what may be its extent.

These examinations being finished, this will be passed to the Major-domo of the Ex-mission of San Francisco in order that he may report what he may deem convenient Son Nicolas Gutierrez, Secy. Col. of Cavalry in the permanent Army, Commandant General Inspector and Political Chief of Upper California, thus Ordained Decreed and Signed, of which I certify

alone can report upon the matter being the administer

The Administration of San Francisco de Asis in an
Official Note of the 16th of the present Month sends
me the two Expedientes made by Citizens Ygnacio
Pacheco and Nicolas Yguez to report as follows in
his said Office (Comunicacion) and in Order to
facilitate their advancement I will say that the lances
asked for are not occupied by the Natives of this
Pueblo, nor by the Stock or Cattle under my charge
in the former have been Rancho established in comm
on, and the latter occupy the place of Loscol to the
Shores of Languitos where they trouble no one by
their location; with respect to the persons who petition
they possess the requisites to entitle them to be attended
to, since the Lances are not included in the twenty
border leagues, but are in the 10 littoral, which are
referred to in the Decree of August 18th 1834 according
to the report of the Ilustres Ayuntamientos of
San Francisco de Asis. The three aforesaid annexed
documents I have the honor to send herewith to Your
Excellency for the Ends which may please you.

Having seen the petition at the beginning of this Expediente, the Report of the Ayuntamientos of San Francisco those of the Administrators of the Missions of San Francisco de Asis and San Francisco Solano, with all else presented and deemed proper to be seen. In conformity with what is provided in the Laws and Regulations on the matter, Nicolas Higuera is declared Owner in fee of the Land known by the name of "Entre Nubes" as explained by the map which goes with the Expediente.

Whereas citizen Nicolas Stegues a Mexican
of Upper California by birth, has, for his own personal benefit and
that of his family, petitioned for a little more than one
square league in the place known by the name of Napa.
The proper measures and examinations being previously
made as requested by Señor don Regulatón on the
matter, using the powers which are conferred on me
and in the name of the Mexican Nation, I have granted
him the aforesaid land, declaring to him the ownership of
it by these presents, subject to the approval of the Most
Excellent Deputation, and under the following conditions, viz:

1^o He shall submit to those conditions, which shall be
established by the Regulation which is to be formed
in the distribution of Vacant lands, and in the mean
time neither the grantee nor his heirs can divide or alienate
that which is granted to them, subject it to any
lien, encumbrance, pledge, mortgage, or other encumbrance
even for pecuniary purposes or convey it in Mortmain —
2^o He may enclose it without prejudice to the crossings
roads and trails, and enjoy it freely and exclusively,
making such use and collection of it as may best
suit him, but within one year at furthest he shall
build a house where it shall be inhabited.

3^o He shall request the proper Magistrate to give him
for decree possession in virtue of this title by whom
the boundaries shall be marked out in the limits of
which, besides the boundaries, he shall place some fruit
or forest trees of some utility —

4^o The land of which donation is made is a little more
than one square league, as shown by map, which goes
in the Expediente. The Magistrate who may give the
possession, will cause it to be measured agreeably
with the Ordinance leaving to the Notary for its con-
venient uses, the scruples which may result —

5th If he contravene these conditions he shall lose his right
to the lance, and it will be denounceable by another person
In consequence I order that this present serving
him for a title and being held as firm and valid, Note
be made of it in the proper book and it be delivered
to the person interested for his security and other purpo-
ses.

To the Justice of the Peace of the Frontier
 I citizen Nicolas Higuera residente of this jurisdiction
 owner of the Rancho of "Napa-abajo" as I may best
 proceed in Law, before you appear and say: That as
 appears by the title which I present with the necessary
 solemnity and oath, I have in my said Rancho a little
 more than one square league, within the boundaries
 mentioned in said title, and as it is necessary for me
 that it should in all times appear where they reach to
 and whether they prejudice me or injure any one of
 my neighbors, you will be pleased to order that, pre-
 viously taking the necessary examinations of survey
 notes and examination, and the colonantes being
 summoned, the measurement of my lands be proceeded
 to for which purpose I appoint, for this time and when
 the time may arrive, as measurer, citizen Rafael
 Navarez, resident of this jurisdiction, shall be in this
 matter of measurements, and let any other person who
 may be interested, appoint another measurer on his
 part, and having done so, let those whom they may
 appoint and the aforesaid Rafael Navarez, by
 me appointed, appear, accept and take the oath
 and in conformity with it let the said measurements
 be proceeded to. Wherefore I pray you that admitt-
 ing this document, you will be pleased to order
 that what I have agreed be done: And being made
 these titles be returned to me with the origi-
 nal records which may be made for the security
 of my rights. This petition which else may be
 necessary.

 In the Pueblo of Sonoma on the 10th day of the month
 of January 1842 before me, citizen Salvador Vallejo
 Military Commandant and Magistrate of this jurisdic-
 tion, this petition was read, and being seen I admitted
 it, with the document mentioned, and I order that, sum-
 moning the colonantes, information be taken of con-
 tify, notes and examination of said lands at which
 I am ready to assist personally. I thus proceeded
 to read and sign with these of my assistance

 he has lived on this frontier, and knows that the lands

owner of said lances, and citizens Cayetano Juarez
and Apolinaro Illempes, the colonantes and neighbors
I proceeded to see and examine the lances of said Ran-
cho, and interpreter Cleopatra Montenegro on horseback
in company with all the parties and witness referred
to. I ordered the last named to point out to me the
the places, terminations and boundaries of them accor-
ding to the signs which they have declared in their dep-
ositions, and in compliance they left the way to the
