



To the Honorable the Board of Commissioners for settling Private Land Claims in California

The Petition
of Joseph Maria Luciana Isabel and Delaria
Pope heirs of the late Julian Pope doth and respectfully
shows

That on the 30th September 1841 Manuel Jimino
acting Governor of California by authority of the
Laws of Mexico granted to said Julian Pope under
named a certain tract of land called Localloni
situate in the present County of Napa with the bounda-
ries described in the grant and act of judicial posses-
sion which original grant and act of possession with
the translation thereof are herewith set forth in Particular
B & C

That said grant contains two Squares leagues
of Land

Your Petitioners further show that said land
has been since the date of the grant and now is in the
possession and in disputed possession of your Petitioners

That there is no conflicting
claim that they rely for confirmation in said original
title papers and to be produced in the archives in the custo-
dy of the W. I. Governor General and upon such other and
further proofs as they may be advised on necessary
therefore they pray Confirmation
of their title to said land

In answer to questions by Lemire for the claimant
the witness testified as follows

My name is George C Yount my age is fifty eight
years and I reside in the County of Marquette

Years ago

- married with Julian Pope in his lifetime and with
his family He left five children named Joseph
Maria Luana Isabel and Melania I am
acquainted with the land granted to Julian Pope
he was living at my time when he got the grant
The place was called Coalloni

He went onto the
land immediately after the grant I think about
the year 1841, 1842, or 1843 I cannot state the
time. The land is separated from Marquette Valley
by the Mountain called Potowatomin less than
a mile from the time of the grant said Pope
built a house on the land and lived in it until
he died and dead stock

He continued to live in the
place until the time of his death which took
place within a year from his taking possession
as should think and the place has continued to
be occupied by his children to the present time
was present when judicial mission was
given of the place It was given to Julian Salazar
who was the widow of said Julian Pope and
was at the time in 1845 living in the place

Answer It is true sometime or fifteen years
since I have seen him write and perhaps longer
I can't state the particular occasion when I saw
him write but I think he was employed in some
of the offices about the Court House

I think I saw him Alvarado write last in 1846
when he was in Los Angeles

Hunt witness on behalf of the claimants in case No 719 in the Docket of said Board wherein Joseph Pope and others are claimants and the said witness being duly sworn on oath depposed in the English language as follows to wit

Question by the Attorney for the claimants
1 Question what is your name age and present residence
Answer My name is George C. Hunt my age 59
years my residence Napa County California
2 Question Are you acquainted with Joseph Pope
Lucina Gsame and Delavina Pope if yes whose
children are they

Answer I am acquainted with all of them they
are the children of William Pope and his wife
I have known both before they were married If you
ask his name

3 Question State what you know of their marriage

Answer I came to California from New York visiting
one time living I think in San Francisco afterwards they
came to this country as man and wife with their
children which I have named they lived at my
house and both told me they were married
4th Question Had they any other children besides
those you have named

Answer There was no child born with certainty
before or after the Fathers death it died there are
two only living children

5 Question Did Guillermo Alias William Pope hold
any land during his lifetime if yes where and
what

Answer He held land in the Valley where his son
Joseph now lives He had a son before Warren
by some Indian name which I cannot remember

in Napa County. He got his grant I think from Alvarado. He occupied it with his scatto &c. He built a house small and put it in cultivation. Died soon after he went into the place and I do not think there was much cultivation before his death. His family remained there after his death and continued to occupy and carry on the farm and are still living there.

6th Dustin Did you assist at the San Joaquin judicial session? was given

Officed to by Law Agent as leading Answer I did as one of the interested

7th Dustin Look at the paper you show me Marched B.I.C. P.L. Filed in this case March 2nd 1853 and say if your signature on the document is genuine

Answer This is my signature. Wrote it and the other parties signed it in my presence

8th Dustin State the boundaries of that tract and how you measured it

Answer It was measured with a rope I think 50 chains long began at a large branch at the lower end of the valley and measured up the base of beyond the highest trunk of the tree west. It is bounded by hills or mimitins all round it. It contains two leagues as we measure here or less

9th Dustin Look at the paper you show me Marched Exhibit 2 to I question of George G. Hunt and say if your signature on the document is genuine

Answer This is my signature. Was present and saw Elias Bennett and Julian Bennett make their respective marks with they acknowledged the execution of it in my presence before William A. Hutchins who also signed his name in my presence

Cross Examined by the Law Agent

1. Dustin Have you ever seen any grant of the land to Juan Pope if yes when and you first heard

Answer I saw a paper which he told me was his grant from Alvarado which he showed me when I first came up I cannot read Spanish

and only know what the paper was from what he told me It was at my house before he came into the land I do not remember who was from but I cannot remember the time tho I know it was some years before the war

3 Qustm Do you know when he first got the grant if yes how do you know

Answer shortly after he first came to my house he looked around and selected this land another went away he told me he was going to Wyoming and if they would give him a grant he would get his family and settle down for life he came back with his family and showed me the paper and told me it was the grant and that he got it at Wyoming and then went after his family in the Southern part of this state I do not remember the year

3 Qustm What is the shape of the land you gave Mendicale possession of
Answer It is a very narrow valley with a stream running through it which leads up to a mountain called Lone Wolf or the farm The shape is irregular it is narrow at the upper end of the Valley and wide in the middle It is larger length wise of the Valley than across It think there is one little hill in close on the river I am not positive

4th Qustm Is it bounded all sides by the crest of the mountains

Answer It is bounded thus in all sides except in the North East I think there is a mountain there not including the high Mountain in the Snow
3 Qustm Do you know the name of the Ranch

Answer I do it is the North fork of the stream passing through the Ranch and forms its principal fence where near the lower end of the Ranch

6 Qustm Who caused the measuring up when you went to give Mendicale possession

Answer I do not now recollect I was along a some of the witnesses but cannot remember who caused it
7th Qustm Do you know that any measurement

was made with the rope
 Answer You then measured it
 8th Question was any part of the line measured along the Aump See or you what part of it
 Answer There was a gap and little hills between the two streams we measured across the Valley and across the Aump from hill to hill clear across the Valley on the South side the hills come very close to the Aump See we measured on the South side from the creek along about the middle of the South line I do not know him much of the line

9th Question How far is it from the foot to the top of the Mountains in the South side of the Ranch

Answer I should say from a half a mile to a mile the hills are rather steep

10th Question How high are the Mountains on the North side

Answer I should say a mile or more my rough Mountains

11th Question How and the boundary on the South side be the crest of the Mountain when the line was measured along the Aump See

Answer The Aump See runs close along the edge of the Mountain in that side

12th Question What is the character of the crest of the Mountains on the west South and East sides of the Ranch

Answer On the West side it is timbered with Pine and Redwood on the South they are covered with grass and timber on the East side they are very rough rugged Mountains hard to get through The lines we run so as to include the Valley they one run in a straight line in places another with off sets to show the shape of the mountain

13th Question When did you commence the measurement and in what direction did you run and how far in that direction

Answer We commenced on the East side near the Aump See and run mostly we can measure at the foot of the hills I do not know him far we ran the first course

14th Question Did you ascend the mountains in your measurement If yes at what point

Answer I think we did not ascend the mountain to the best of my recollection we came round so as to embrace the Valley running round the base of the mountains

15th Question Who kept the account of the measurement

Answer I believe the Alcalde himself he may have had some one to help it for him

16th Question Did you establish any land marks

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Answer I do not recollect distinctly I think they marked some trees at the time and I think they had a hatchet along I am not positive

Re-examined by the Attorney for claimants
Question How long after Helmi Pope obtained the grant was it that he moved into the place

Answer He went into the place and went to work immediately after he came up. He was called William as well as Helmy

Question Do you think the paper you submitted
you is the same Pope showed you from Mandua
B. S. C. P. L.

Objected to by the Law Agent excluding
Answer I think it is the same

Cross examined again by the Law Agent

Question Did you take the paper in your hand when he showed it to you if you for what purpose did you do so

Answer I think I did hold it in particular
nothing more than to look at it

Question What enables you to state positively
that it is the same paper

Objected to by claimants counsel as assuming
a declaration not made by the witness

Answer I do not swear positively to the fact I
said I thought it is the same paper







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The petition of claimants sets up a grant from Manuel Jimeno acting Governor to John Pope of a place in Napa County called Locaollomi containing two square leagues, dated September 30th 1841.

The facts exhibited and clearly proved and about which there is no controversy are as follows.

On the 3rd September 1841, Pope applied by petition to M.G. Vallejo Director of Colonization for the premises in question.

M.G. Vallejo made an order referring it to Salvador Vallejo Commandant of that frontier for information. Salvador Vallejo reported the land vacant & public domain & that there was no objection to it being granted to applicant. Thereupon M.G. Vallejo gave permission to Pope to occupy, he to solicit thereafter the customary title from the departmental government.

These orders with the report of Salvador Vallejo were presented to Jimeno who on the 30th Sept. executed the grant to Pope of the place described containing two leagues, the grant containing the usual conditions.

At the time the grant was

Made Pope was residing with Gount in Napa valley and Gount testifies that he put up a house immediately on the place & moved there with his stock. The place has been occupied ever since by his family.

Within about one year after the grant Pope died leaving his surviving widow Maria Juliana Salazar and several children, one of which children has since deceased and those surviving are the same named in the return as appears by the testimony of Gount.

The widow Salazar early in Sept. 1845 made a formal application to Jose de La Rosa 1st Alcalde of Sonoma for a measurement & judicial possession which was ordered and the Alcalde with proper officers of the vicinage surveyed & set apart the lands with proper boundaries all of which was made matter of record on the 8th Sept. 1845. The description and boundaries of the property are fully set out in the Alcalde's return. and apart from the paper the fact of the measurement & judicial possession is proved by Gount who was one of the witnesses & assistants of the Alcalde.

Subsequently the widow Salazar contracted matrimony with Elias Barnett and there being some question about the

rights of the widow & her husband in the premises, Barnett & the widow on the 1st of January 1834 quitclaimed to the children, (the same named in the Petition) all their right to & interest in the premises.

The execution of the grant is proved by Abel Stearns, of Barnett & wife's deed, by Grant. all the other facts by the original documents & Grant's testimony.

There is no issue raised in the case, no question as to the genuineness of the grant, or as to performance of conditions and it clearly appears that claimants are entitled to the entire premises.

By reference to the decree it will be perceived that the Commission adjudged that "Joseph Pope and the other heirs at law of John Pope deceased" are entitled to the premises, and the same are confirmed to them in the same general terms.

The Petition is filed by the five children & heirs of John Pope, Grant testifies that they are the only surviving children the widow & her husband released to them children by name, as appears by the testimony. It appears then that they are the sole claimants and have a complete right to the entirety.

The record shows the names of the five children to be Joseph Pope, Maria Kilbourn, Licciana Lemon, Isabel ~~Pope~~ and

Delatina Pope. - It is suggested that the
decree of Confirmation should be made to the
parties by name, "children and heirs of the
said Father Pope deceased" so that the
Patent might run directly to them.

The claimants
therefore ask that the decree of commissioners
be affirmed with an amendment introducing
the names of the claimants as the parties to
whom Confirmation is made.

The present appellee appears by the testimony of W^m Gout to be the heir of the original grantee - A deed is produced and duly proved from the widow of Pope & her husband by which all the right title and interest of the latter are conveyed to the appellee -

No objection whatever to this claim is urged on the part of the U. S. It was admitted apparently without hesitation by the Board and I see no reason
