



To the Honorable the U.S. Commissioners to Ascertain and Settle the Indian Land Claims in California -

The petition of Asi Santos Bimisa a resident of the County of Sonoma and a citizen of the United States respectfully Shows to your Honorable Board that on the 31st day of May 1844 I again Capitulo Second Justice of the Peace of the Pueblo of Sonoma upon the petition of the said Bimisa previously referred made to the said Bimisa in writing and in the manner required by law a grant of a lot of land of two hundred varas wide by three hundred varas long lying at the East of Sonoma and being situated bounded and described as in the said grant is particularly set forth.

Your petition says that by the terms of said grant the property of the said land was vested in him and that he is equitably entitled to the confirmation thereof by the Government of the United States he having fully performed all the conditions by him under said grant to be done and performed.

Your petitioner prays that the copy of said grant and the translation of the same hereto annexed may be taken as a part of this petition.

Wherefore Your petitioner prays your Honorable Board to confirm his said title and to direct that a patent be issued to him accordingly by the proper authority and Your petitioner &c.

Question by Mr Tracy attorney for the
Claimant -

Answer -

What are your name age and
place of residence? -

Answer -

My name is Julio Camillo my
age is twenty eight years and I reside at
Sonoma in California -

Question -

Look on the paper now presented
to you purporting to be a grant of land
by Isaacum Camillo to José Bantas
Pimpisa marked Exhibit "A" annexed to
the deposition of Martin E Cook heretofore
filed in this Case and state whether you
know the persons whose names are subscribed
thereto as witnesses and if so whether they are
now living or not? -

Answer -

I have examined said paper.
I know the persons whose signatures are
appended as witnesses. Jesus Maria Gallegos
& Pasano Pimpisa They are both dead.

Question -

Do you know Isaacum Camillo
and are you acquainted with his hand writing -

Answer -

I know him, I know his hand
writing. I have seen him write and sign

his name frequently.

4 Question -

Look in the paper presented to you being the same mentioned in the second interrogatory and state whether the signature affixing therin as his, is the true and genuine Signature of said Joaquin Canali?

Answer.

I have Examined it, it is his true and genuine Signature. The signatures on the back of said paper is also his signature -

5 Question -

Do you know a lot of ground at the east of Sonoma formerly occupied as a vineyard claimed by Josi Bemysa?

Answer -

I know the lot.

6 Question -

Was you acquainted with that lot in the month of March 1844?

Answer.

I was.

7 Question -

In what condition was the lot at that time in regard to any remains of the vineyard and of the fence?

Answer.

There were thro' the ruins of a fence - a brush fence which was then visible about two hundred varas in front by three hundred in depth. There were likewise some stumps of grape vines here and there on the lot?

8 Question -

Do you know of Josi Bemysa doing any work or in regard to the lot, or of his building a house on it after the thirteenth of March 1844? if you state all you know

of March 1845? If you state all you know
about it?

Answer.

I saw him lay the foundation
of a house at said fort and saw him raise
the walls about two feet and a half above
the ground. They were of stone and intended
to build an adobe house on this wall.
11 Question.

At what time did you see him
doing this work?

Answer.

In the Month of August 1845.

11 Question.

Was that work suspended? if so for
what cause?

Answer.

He commenced gathering
the timber and preparing to make the adobes
until the time and I saw nothing of it
afterwards. The house was never finished. The
Revolution of the Bear Flag Clinic, and
nothing further was done with it.

11 Question.

Do you know what became of
said Bonfisa in that revolution and in the
war following it? —

Answer.

He was taken prisoner at
Sopoma and when I arrived at Sacramento
I was also made prisoner and there we
understood that Fremont was in the Revolution
12 Question.

What became of Bonfisa after
he escaped from prison?

Answer.

Known at that time. He went to his Rancho
known at that time by the name of Mallaemus.

13. Justim -

Was Bonyisa permitted to return to Sonoma during the war?

Answer.

I do not know.

14. Justim -

Do you know whether the father of said Bonyisa was killed near Sonoma by the Americans in Frimmt time?

Answer.

He was killed at San Rafael during Frimmt time, about a mile and a half from the Mission of San Rafael.

15. Justim.

Do you know whether the house and improvements of said Asisi Bonyisa in the Rancho of Mallacaus were destroyed by the Americans during this time?

Answer.

I did not see it, but I understood that they were.

16. Justim -

Does anyone live on that lot first above mentioned at Sonoma at this time? If yes, who?

Answer.

William Boggs lives on it at this time. He went in to occupy it two or three years ago. I am not certain of the time.

17. Justim -

Do you know whether or not he holds adversely to said Bonyisa?

Answer -

I do not know.

Julio Carrillo.

This Deposition was given in the Spanish
Language. Mr Fisher Secretary of the Board
acting as Interpreter.

Mr Chamberlain Attorney,

Law Agent was present but declined asking
the witness any questions on the ground that
the Case as presented in the petition and in the
alleged title does not fall within the Jurisdiction
of the Board of Immigration agreeably
to the fourteenth Section of the law of March 3rd
1851 Creating the Board and defining its powers
and duties -



Whereas Jose Santos Bonifacia
a Mexican citizen by birth has solicited
for his personal benefit a lot (Solar) situated
to the East of the said Pueblo and
occupied with a vineyard which is entirely
abandoned for the purpose of building a
house thereon and at the same time to culti-
vate the said vineyard.

The investigation having been had according to the
Proclamations and Regulations upon the subject
I have concluded to grant to him the said
lot and under the following conditions -

First - Within one year he shall build
a house or at least the whole lot (Solar)
comprehended in the said vineyard shall be
enclosed.

Second. The lot referred to is that which
the said vineyard actually occupies and
it is 200 varas wide by 300 varas long, for
which grant he has paid the established
fee to the Municipality, note being taken
thereof in the proper book and the present
document delivered to the interested party
for its safe keeping and the security of this
grant.

The statement in this cause asks a confirmation of a grant issued to him on the 30th day of March 1811 by Jose Quintero a Justice of the Peace of said Pueblo for a lot represented as lying on the East of said Town and is two hundred varas wide and three hundred varas long.

The above description is all that is given to enable the Commissioner to determine the boundaries or locality of the lot intended to be granted.

Jacob P. Pease testifies that he knows the lot but gives no description of it more satisfactory than that given in the grant.

The evidences of the grant are that the grantee buried a horse on the lot or at least had the same buried within one year from the date of the grant.

The testimony goes to show that the grantee in the year 1811 raised the foundation of a house on the lot about two feet high and then abandoned it for the time on account of the unusually rainy season setting in. And was afterwards taken prisoner in the Bear Flag War and after being released from imprisonment instead of returning to the lot and re-erecting completing his improvements he went onto another place owned by him and as far as we are informed has never returned to the place since.

The description of the lot intended to be conveyed as set forth in the

grant is entirely to vague and indefinite to enable this Board to ham its health or in any way to fix its boundaries, neither is there any proof of performance of the conditions of the grant.

It is therefore the opinion of the Board that the claim is invalid and should be rejected. And a decree will be entered accordingly -


