Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Three, before
the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in
the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San
Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America,
the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of Andres Pico, ~~for land at the Mission Dolores~~,
~~for the place named~~
~~Land at the Mission Dolores~~,
was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 612, and
is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were
had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco December 5' 1854,
Case No 612, Andres Pico for land at the Mission
Dolores, was ordered to be placed at the foot of
the 3^d class cases on the Trial Docket.

San Francisco December 19' 1854.
Case No. 612 was submitted under the Rule of
21st March 1854.

San Francisco January 23' 1855.
In the same case Commissioner R. A. Thompson
delivered the opinion of the Board rejecting the
claim.

ascertaining and settling of Private Land Claims
in the State of California

Your Petitioner Andrews
Pico a Native and resident of the State of
California respectfully Showeth unto your
Hon Board that he is the legal Owner of a
tract of Land herein after described and for
further explanation alights

That one Jose Pinedero

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Santosan on the 10th day of February 1846 did
convey a grant of said Land from the Govern-
ment of California and Conveyed the same to
Donquin Cardo by deed dated the 6th of
April 1846.

That your petitioner in aforesaid
consideration paid said said Land of Donquin
Cardo by deed dated the 8th day of January
1853.

And your petitioner further saith that the
original grant as given as the conveyance above
mentioneth are in his hands and ready to be
exhibited in evidence whenever required.

That said Land is situated in the
Mission of Dolores and County of San Francisco
and known and described as follows: commen-
ting at a point on the road which leads from
the Mission of Dolores to the Pueblo of San
Jose in the gap or hollow about one quarter of
a mile south of the Mission Church and which
said point is formed by the junction crossing of
a small creek and the pueblo road, thence
running along the eastern line of said road
from hundred Spanish Varas South Easterly
thence at right angles North Easterly four hundred
varas, thence at right angles to said
line North Easterly four hundred varas
thence to the place of beginning.

And your petitioner
further saith that he is not aware of the
existence of any title paramount in superior
to his own - wherefore he claims to be the
legal Owner of said Land and prays that your Hon
Board will confirm and record the same.

have I Jose Recendeeo Santillan, Curato and
Priest of the Mission de Dolores Solee and granted
and by these presents do I sell and grant to
Joaquin Leonellos a resident of the Presidio of
Santa Barbara a piece of Land of four hundred
acres Vistas Seque, situated on the road which
leads from the Mission of Dolores to the Pueblo
de San Jose, said Land lying on the other side
of the Creek or river and on the left side of
said road; and I hereby transfer him all my
right title and interest which I have in said
piece of land.

In consideration of twelve tamed horses
received to my wife and nine dollars fifteen, and
and which I declare to be a just and legitimate
recompence, or perhaps even more - I hereby renounce and
give it to him in the manner agreed by said
"Vista Vieja" - at the same time I hereby renounce





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Pio Pico, first member of the Assembly of the Department of the California, and Commissioner by law, for the administration of the Government of the same.

Whereas, the Priest, Don Prudencio Santillan has solicited for his personal benefit, all the vacant lands acknowledged as belonging to the Mission of Dolores, as well as all the houses pertaining to the settlements of said Mission, which might have been abandoned; by virtue of the power conferred upon me, in the name of the Mexican Nation, I have thought proper to grant, as by these presents, I do grant, to the aforesaid Priest Don Prudencio Santillan, the ownership of all the houses pertaining to the settlements, which have been, or are at present, acknowledged as belonging to the Mission of Dolores, and all the vacant lands which have been and are at present, acknowledged as belonging to the same Mission of Dolores; under the following conditions:

1^o. The grantee shall enjoy freely and exclusively the houses, and lands granted to him; but he shall pay, as a compensation for the said grant, all the debts which may appear to the present day, against the Mission of Dolores.

2^o. He shall petition the respective judge of the judicial population, in virtue of his patent, of all the lands and houses granted to him; and in the meantime the population which he has of said houses and lands, may

same as legal, in his capacity of administrator, appointed
as such, by the Prelate of the Museum, of the College of our
Lady of Guadalupe of Zacatecas, for the temporal matters
of the said Museum of Dolores.

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3^o. The land of which donation is made, consists of three
square leagues (tres sitios de gamma maya) more or less.
The Judge who shall give the possession, shall have it
measured, and fix the boundaries with the customary
land marks, being understood that the said lands
is bounded on the North by Herba-Buenas, on the North
West by the Preciosos of San Francisco, on the West by the
lands of Don Francisco Hinojosa, on the South by a portion
of the Ranch of the Sanchez, and on the East by the
Bay of San Francisco.

4^o. The grantee, and in his default his heirs and
successors, shall respect the property which some
persons possess in virtue of good titles, as well of the
lands, as of the houses of the settlement, occupied
within the limits of the Museum of Dolores, and which
are hereby acknowledged.

5^a. In this grant, there are expressly received the House
of the Priest (Casa Cural) and the Church of Dolores,
as belonging to the Bishop see in this Diocese.
Consequently I command that the present
title, being held as firm and valid, it be entered
in the respective book, and be delivered to the
party concerned for his security and other ends.

I know the three signatures threats to be genuine and this document marked "B.P.S" and filed as an exhibit to my deposition is an exact copy of said document "A.P.S"

3^o Question - When was said document "A.P.S" executed and signed by the persons above named?

Answer - At the time of its date April 6. 1846

1^o Question - In whose hand writing is the body of the document "A.P.S" before referred to by you?

2^o Question - At what place in Santa Barbara was said document signed?

Answer - It was in a house used for a Court house. (Friggada.)

3^o Question - Who were present at the time of signing said document?

Answer. Joaquin Canillo. Padre Santillan and Esteban Ortega were there present, and

I do not now recollect whether others were present or not.

4th Question. How long had you known said Santillan, when you saw him execute said document?

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Answer. I think I first knew him in 1844 at the Mission of Santa Barbara.

5th Question - When you signed said document as a witness did you know any thing about the terms of the sale?

Answer. The document was read at the time, I think by Joaquin Cossillo in my hearing, and I understood then the terms and meaning of said document.

6th Question. About how long was said Padre Santillan in Santa Barbara on the visit in which he signed said document?

Answer. I do not know. He staid at the Mission, and I knew nothing of his coming or going.

7th Question. How often did you see him while he was there on that occasion?

Answer. Have not now any recollection of seeing him at any other time than that when he signed said paper, but may have seen him on other occasions during said visit.

8th Question. Was you acquainted with Rodriguez de Poli - if yes, was he either present at the signing of said document, or about Santa Barbara at that time?

9th Question. Answer. I know said de Poli. He was not object to this in 1846. he came there in 1850 claimant cannot 9th Question. Was not said de Poli in Santa Barbara to your knowledge before said

document was signed?

Answer. Have already said he came in 1850 to Santa Barbara and that is the first I knew of his ever being there.

10th Question - Did said Santillan and said de Poli go together to Santa Barbara in 1850, if yes, at what time did you first see them there in that year?

Answer. The said de Poli came to Santa Barbara in 1850 with my brother Don Pablo dela Guerra, after the adjournment of the Legislature, and I saw nothing of said Santillan about there at that time according to my present recollection.



Santillan conveyed the lands in question, as being a portion of the grant made to him by the Mexican Government after 10 Feb 1846, of the lands of the Exclusion of Dolores.

The Land Commissioners, as the reason for rejecting the claim, say that although the claimant produced "Transfer by proper legal conveyance from said Santillan to him, no grant from the government is produced, nor is there any evidence in the case showing that such a grant as that described in the claimant's petition was ever made"

The original grant by the superior authorities to Santillan of the 10 Feb 1846, for the whole tract, of which this is a part, is the foundation of the claim of Mr. Bolton, Claim No. Manuscript No 81, in which case the original grant was presented & proved. The validity of that grant has been passed upon both by the commissioners, the Court, and the claim confirmed.

The present claim is for a portion of the land so originally granted, which had been sold by the grantee to the assignee of the present claimant, before the title of the tract was sold to Barron. The claimant in Case No 81, therefore the original title being approved & there being no objection to the conveyances now adduced in this case, the confirmation of this claim would seem to follow as a matter of course.
