



IN THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

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Be it Remembered, that on this second day of April ~ Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-two, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of The Heirs of Jose Higuera, ~
for the Place named
"Elano del Abrevadero," ~
was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 149 and
is as follows, to wit;

Upon which Petition the following subsequent Proceedings were had in their chronological order, to wit;

San Francisco, November 21st, 1854.
Case no. 149, Antonio Higuera et al: for the place
named "Elano del Abrevadero," on motion of the counsel
for the claimants, with the consent of the W. S. Law Agent,
was ordered to be placed at the foot of the 3rd class cases,
on the Trial Docket.

San Francisco December 12th 1854.
Case no. 149 was submitted under the Rule of March
21st 1854, and taken under advisement by the Board.

San Francisco December 19th 1854.
In the same case Commissioner Alpheus Felch delivered
the opinion of the Board rejecting the claim;
(Vide page 5 of this Transcript.)
and the following order was made, to wit;

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To The Hon the Board of Land Commis-
sioners To ascertain and settle the private
Land Claims in the State of California.

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Petition

The petition of Antonio, Fulgencio, Dolores,
Valentin, Mariano, Josefa, Encarnacion, Ful-
gencio, Rita, Refugio, and Agustino
Heignera states,

That about the 1st day of January A.D.
1822 Dado Vicente de Sola Governor of the
Province of California in the exercise of
powers in him vested and by virtue of the
laws then and there in force granted
to Jose Heignera (father of these petitioners)
a tract of land called Rancho del Abrevadero
situated in what is now known as the
County of Santa Clara and state of California
bounded and described Dovith "on the
North by the Southern boundary or line of
the Mission of San José (now the Southern
boundary of the rancho belonging to Fulgencio
Heignera) on the East by the Cerro (mountain)
on the South by a line which is now
the present northern boundary line of the
rancho of José María Alviña, thence along
the Arroyo (Creek) de la Penitencia and by
the Estero on shore of the Bay of San
Francisco, which Estero is the western
boundary of said land."

That in the year 1845 or thereabout
the said Grantee Jose Heignera died
intestate,

That Fulgencio Heignera, Valentin Heignera,
Mariano Heignera, and Florencio Heignera,
are the Sons and Antonio Heignera, Dolores
Heignera, Josefa Heignera, Encarnacion
Heignera, Micaela Heignera, Rita Heignera

Refugio Heyneral, and Agustina Heyneral
are the said Sons and daughters are the legitimate
children and heirs of said José Heyneral
deceased.

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That the said tract of land contains the quantity of two Leagues more or less, being the whole parcel of land comprised within the boundaries aforesaid.

That the said Grantee and said Petitioners were and have been in the continued and uninterrupted possession of the land aforesaid since the date of said grant.

That the espediente of said Land has been lost or misplaced, and the petitioners do not know of its existence or whereabouts.

That there is no evidence existing in the Archives.

That said Land has not been surveyed by the Surveyor General.

That there is no known interfering claim.

That these the said petitioners for the support of the claim herein mentioned, rely upon all such proof as may be pertinent to said claim.

These petitioners pray that this Hon Board will hear such evidence as may support this claim, and decree a confirmation thereof.



thereof be denied.


