



of the claimant in Case no. 582, taken before
Commissioner Peter Solt on the 4th April 1854,
was filed as evidence in this case in accordance
with the stipulation annexed thereto:

3 Petition

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To the Honorable the Board of Land Commissioners
of the United States for the Settlement of Private Land
Claims in California

Your petitioner Johnson Hull of the County of
Napa respectfully represents that on and before
the nineteenth day of January A.D. 1852 Salva-
door Valley was the lawful owner of a tract of
Land situated in said County of Napa containing
sixty seven square leagues known as Salvador's Rancho.
This his title to the same was derived by grant made
him by Juan B. Alvarez from Constitutional
Government of the Department of California on the 2nd
day of June A.D. 1837 which said grant is described
as follows, That tract of land situated in the County
of Napa known and described as the Rancho de
Napa a situate between Napa Creek and adjoin-
ing the lands of Nicolas Higuera on the South
and on the North by the lands of George Gorri con-
taining sixty seven leagues or six thousand six hundred
and six acres annexed thereto and a

Deed on
the said nineteenth day of January aforesaid the
said Salvador Valley sold and conveyed to your
Petitioner his bounded and fully answered and made
specification of said land by deed of that date a copy
of which is annexed marked B. which said premises
so as aforesaid conveyed to your petitioner and par-
ticularly described as follows Commencing at a point
on the bottom line of the public road where
the eastern line of D.W. Stiles touches the public
line there running with said line north 32°
06' west 68 chains and 6 links to a stake lying
north 35° 19' East 105 chains and fifty links to a
stake on the bank of Napa River thence following
the meanders of said River to a point where the west
line of Laguna River as land borders said River
then along said line of River south thirty six
chains and thirty five links to a stake

Then a South
58° 20' west 25 chains and 80 links to an oak
tree standing on the side of the river South 120° 40'
East to a stake on the line of the public road
an thence following said line south 84° 20'
west 40 chains and 60 links to the place of begin-
ning and your petitioner for the sum of three thousand

Said lands have been duly and accurately
surveyed and that he has ever since been in quiet
possession of the same except such parcels thereof
as he has conveyed by two separate deeds to John
Bloke and Benjamin McLemore one hundred and
acres each and own continues the same year
written further shows that there is another claim
and said lands to the knowledge of you petitioner
wherefore pray that his title thereto may be confirmed

County in California

I know you as you a summer by occupation
and am you acquainted with the Ranch in
Napa County called the Napa Ranch and with
its boundaries. The same Ranch granted to Sal
vador Vallejo and Amatius Callisto Sanchez
Rancho if you desire the boundaries

Answer I am a summer by occupation I am
acquainted with the Ranch named and know its
boundaries have surveyed them

It is bounded on
the South by the Army of Napa and a straight
line running from the Army to the Army
los Canos to the lower pass of the River las Canas

on the west by the Río Los Cazadores on the north by a range line from the upper part of the Chumos called Yermita pass to the south and on line of range point touches the mountain and also of Yermita south line to the River Rapa and on the east by San Rapa River which is sometimes called the Río de los Cazadores to its junction with the Arroyo de Rapa or arroyo such I trust have you examined the descriptions of the lands claimed in the following cases on the docket of the Board of the United States Land Commission to wit Number 577 in which Benjamin McComb is claimant number 579 in which Johnson Hull is claimant number 582 in which John Love is claimant and number 583 in which William Kilby is claimant

If your state whether the lines of land herein respectively described are or are not embraced within the limits of the original grant or the Rancho de Rapa granted to Salvador Vallejo the boundaries of which you have described in the foregoing answer him

Answer have examined the papers in each of the cases named I am well acquainted with the respective claims in each case have perused them and find them all to be embraced within the original grant to Salvador Vallejo called the Rancho de Rapa



Johnson Howell vs The United States

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The land claimed is proved to have been Raulio
Cada Mapa and sometimes Salvadore Raulio set
out in Napa County the present claimant having
his title to the portion described in his state-
ment by deed of conveyance from Salvador Valley
and wife executed January 19th 1852 a duly
certified copy of which is given in evidence.

By the
proofs in the case and certain documentary evi-
dence filed in cause No 495, and admitted by
the stipulation it is shown that a grant of the
Raulio was made to said Valley by General
varado on the 21st day of December 1838 bearing
date of the approval of the Departmental assembly
on the 23rd of the same month.

The judicial
possession was given under the grant February
8th 1844 that the grant went into the possession
of the land in 1838 or 1839 and remained the same
until Valley had cut down his Santa Clara
and cultivation the land.

The right of the present
claimant's grantee is thus established and he is

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
