

That immediately  
after said Grant was made to said Fitch and  
Geronimo Polomans took possession of said tract  
of land but were interrupted in their impre-  
vements by the operations of the war and the  
occupation of the land by the military forces  
of the United States.

That on the 14th day of  
January A.D. 1849 the said Harry D. Fitch  
died at San Diego in California and that on  
the 24th day of July A.D. 1851 the said Francisco  
Geronimo Polomans died at San Francisco  
California leaving the Petitioners their heirs

and the  
Petitioners further show that the survey  
of land has not been Surveyed by the Com-  
mon General of the United States but that the

land is definite in quantity and its locality  
is fully described in the title papers, and will know  
that they have no conflicting claim that  
they only for confirmation of title upon the original  
papers copies of which are submitted herewith

the Records and Minutes in the offices in charge  
of the Surveyor and upon such other and further  
proofs as they may be advised or necessary  
whereupon they may the commissioners confirm the same after  
said tract of land



 is to the knowledge of your Excellency with due respect  
 the Government of the State representation that  
 said District theretofore being a place in which  
 may take the road of the Province of San Francisco  
 very inconvenient which up to this time has not  
 and return it to be occupied by any person  
 the Government and an array which is almost  
 to decide after the arrival of said place being  
 Grand Pacific proper for the establishment of  
 machine for a mill and other  
 parts to form some streams and the greater part  
 (and with thickets and bushes) of land  
 as you by letters will be informed by the maps  
 said land being (two and about square leagues  
 a little more less)

Bounded on the south by  
 the Ranchos of brothers Francisco de Haro and  
 Jose de Jesus who own the E. & S.E. half the Mission of  
 San Francisco. East by Yuba River and  
 north and west by the line of the sea shore  
 whereupon said Indians have been returning  
 that they have no intention of injury to any  
 person who may bear this time taking such  
 measures to it or also may have already ob-  
 tained the corresponding title from such authority  
 should only receive the sum of two thousand  
 pesos which there may be in said Army in  
 order to establish fair machine and then  
 to make compensation with him who may prove  
 to be the owner and if the persons representing  
 an account to your Excellency's dignity they will  
 accept even the common laws of the country  
 Yuba River although they are not named for  
 civil uses their usual persons will be compensated  
 by the grant of land and there also without  
 not being injured by any other person who may  
 obtain any other part in the ownership of the said land

and as there is but a small extent of good land  
but a great deal of the thicket and land

therefore

they earnestly pray you Excellency to have the  
goodness to grant them that which they solicit  
as you may find it convenient they being but  
ispid with your Excellency's decision making  
what is necessary & putting this memorandum  
before you at the sealed which contains

- 1 They may enter it without prejudice to the crossings roads and sanctuaries and enjoy it fully and exclusively applying it to such uses and with caution as may best suit them
- 2 They shall request the proper magistrate to give them judicial possession in virtue of this title by whom the boundaries will be marked out with the proper bonds
- 3 The land of which duration is made them is half a square league as shown by the map which goes with the title until the magistrate who may give the possession will cause it to be measured in virtue conformity with the ordinance in virtue of the regulation this intimated shall pursue


