

Your Petitioner Salvador Vallejo and his wife Doña María de la Luz Cárdenas Vallejo of Sonoma in the State of California respectfully represent to your Honorable Board that they claim in the right of the said Doña María de la Luz Cárdenas a certain tract or parcel of land in Napa Valley in said State of California -

cho de Napa. originally granted by the  
Mexican authorities in California to  
Salvador Vallo -

The said Salvador Vallo  
now resides on said land with his family -  
2<sup>nd</sup> Question by same -

State what you know in regard  
to the occupation and cultivation of said Rancho  
de Napa by the said Salvador Vallo.

Answer.

As early as the year 1834 the said Salva-  
dor Vallo was living in said Rancho he  
married about the year 1838 or '39, and took

his family to reside there and has continued to reside there ever since - He had a large adobe house about 100 yards front roofed with shingles in which he lived and several other adobe houses corrals and large herds of cattle and horses and large flocks in pasture.

State if you know the limits of the tract called Frances & Talupo and the quantity of land embraced within them -

Answer.

It is situated on the west side of Napo river between Frances and the lands of Mr. Gomt and contains twenty five hundred or three acres and is all under fence and in cultivation R. H. Vallejo.






