





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Be it Remembered, that on this ninth day of February —, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Three, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

The Petition of James Watson
for the Place named
San Benito
was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 562 and
is as follows, to wit;

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To the Board of Commissioners for Ascertaining
and Setting Private Land Claims in the State of
California.

Petition

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I, the petitioner Dennis Trotter of Monterey
County, California, especially represent that I
claim a certain tract of land called San Benito
lying and being in the said County of Monterey
and bounded as follows. On the west by the low
hills which divide the Spur from San Linares, which
hills are a boundary in that direction towards the
west by the mountains of San Antonio, towards
the north by the Range of San Bernardo and towards
the south by the Cañon (a side) of the small stream
in the place called San Lucas of the extent of
an area half square leagues as appears by the
map accompanying the title. I, the petitioner alleges
and shews that the above described tract of
land was granted by Genl B Alvarado Governor
of California to Francisco Garcia, on the 5th of April
1842. That judicial possession was given of the
land of Sanchez as aforsaid to the said Garcia
on the 6th of October 1843, according to the limits
and boundaries as set forth in the said act of
judicial possession, a copy of which original grant
and act of judicial possession with translations
are herewith presented marked B.D.C.

I, the petitioner alleges and shews, that
I acquired the said tract of land called San Benito
by purchase from the said Francisco Garcia
of the date of October 16th 1851, a copy of which
land of Sanchez is herewith submitted marked
H. The premises considered I, the petitioner pray
that his title to said tract of land called San
Benito may be confirmed and declared to be valid,
and general relief, as nearly made.

Senor Presidente of the Justicia

I. Francisco Garcia a Mexican by birth and
 a resident of this Department before your Justice
 with due respect and as the law may best allow
 me to make known, that having a numerous family
 to provide for which I have been frequently hard
 pushed and not finding any better way to provide
 for the same than dedicating myself to agriculture
 and the raising of cattle, I request that you would
 be pleased to take measures to grant me the land
 situated in the vicinity of San Antonio Anumba
 the names of San Benito and San Lucas, the
 latter part thereof being vacant and the former
 belonging to Maria Pineda widow of the late Robert
 Cantara both neophytes of the said Mission the
 right to which has been granted me by the said
 widow as appears by the accompanying document
 drawn out with her by the Ranchero of San Medina
 on the South by the Ranchero of San Mariano Solor
 on the West by the mountains of San Antonio
 and on the East by the mountains of San Juanzo
 as appears by the plot which I am accompanying.
 In consideration of the premises I request that
 you could be pleased to grant me the ownership
 of said land taking into consideration the loss
 which I am continually suffering in my stock etc
 for having the number of five hundred head of
 cattle, I am exposed to lose them on account of not
 having a proper place. I hope to receive this
 favor, reciting that I do not act in malice &
 that which is necessary etc.

The Administration of the Establishment of San Antonio has up to this time watched the land called by Maria Prisca to the party interested belonging to her and whether she has the right to demand and of the place known by the name of San Lucas is unoccupied and whatever else be may think necessary.

In compliance with your superior command wherein you ask for information respecting the lands of San Benito and San Lucas I must say to you that San Benito belongs to the widow Prisca an Indian (Acapulca) of this Mission. which widow assured me in the presence of her son and of his step son who are satisfied therewith that they have had the right San Lucas belongs to this Mission it is moreover true and so I shall. It is subject to the Establishment which cannot occupy it.

This present document certifies that the right which I have to the land called San Benito a rancho which belongs to the Mission of San Antonio consisting of one square league (in the state of Guanajuato). as appears by the writings which I will exhibit at the proper time granted to me by the Superior Government

of this Department for my Benefit I have annexed
making thereof, a brief Explan and voluntary
seminar in favor of City in Province Sonora
provided that the ownership thereof appertains
to him. I make this condition that if this
does not take place that I do not by any means
renounce my right to the same & carry my will
that this document although Extra judicial
shall leave out the free and validity of a public
instrument for such record etc in order that
at all times by virtue thereof, the Competent
Judges & Tribunals to whose jurisdiction I submit
myself may compel its fulfillment naming
in my own name and in the name of my son
Jose Contrera a minor of Eight years of age
the usual another Donardo Contrera who appears
to sign this document in account of being emancipa-
ted and Separately provided for all the causes
which in this case may favor or aid the general
law of right in assuming witness of this
my testimony, others as Jose Rosas and Jacinto
Rambo who do not sign not knowing how to do
it, at city in Province Sonora signing in
my name and at my request.

by the name of San Benito, bounded on the
East by the mountains which divide the land of
San Lorenzo, on the West by the mountains of
San Antonio, on the South by the limits of the
Cinal situated in the place called San Lucas
and on the North by the Rancho of San Benito
Let the corresponding title be made out at this
Expediente be forwarded to the First Executive
Department Santa for its approval. Hon
Juan B Alvarado Constitutional Governor of the
Department of the California and thus Command
Acre and sign below I give testimony

I am P Alvarado Constituted Governor
of the Department of the California.

Whereas Citizen Francisco Garcia
a Mexican by birth has obtained the ownership
of the land called San Benito with the express
consent of the former owner as appears in the
Estimate, I have ordered to him said right
in the name of the Mexican Nation and granted
unto him in addition to said place the land now
possessed as far as boundary in the East by the long
hills which divide the place of San Bruno, which
I shall send him as a complement in that direction
on the East he should receive by the mountains
of San Martinis, in the North by the Rancho of
San Bernardo, and in the South by the boundaries
of the estate situated in the place called San
Lucas subject to the approval of the most Excellent
Departmental Assembly, and to the following
conditions.

1st. He shall not impose any kind of tax or
fee, mortgage, or any other burden on the land
as adjudicated to him except for public purposes, nor
transfer it in mortmain.

2d. He may fence it without prejudice to the
crossings Highways & Bridges. He shall occupy
it fully and exclusively, destroying all the old
cultivation which may exist thereon, but
within a twelve month he shall leave a house and
it must be inhabited.

3d. He shall request the respective Justice
to give him judicial possession in virtue of
this Title and said magistrate will cause to do
the boundaries at the limits whereof he shall
reside placing the land marks plant some
fruit trees or vines and of some utility.

lot. The Guard value of Muntin is now one
of one and a half Spanish Reales (in the time
of general Major) as appears by the plot which
accompanies the respective Complaints. The Justice
who gives possession will cause it to be measured
according to law having the Survey which may
be sent to the Nation for the necessary test.

Sd. If he transgresses these conditions he shall
forfeit his right to the land and it may be ac-
quired by another.

I consequently command that
this be done as soon and valid, a copy
thereof be made in the respective book and it
be delivered to the party interested for his security,
and further Ens. Given in Muntin on the fifth
of April Eighteen hundred and fifty two.



Opinion

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The defendant in this case represents in his petition that on Francisco Garcia on the 5th day of April AD 1833 obtained from Governor Alvarado a grant for a tract of land known by the name of "San Panito", containing one thousand four hundred and twenty acres.

It is further alleged in said petition that on the 6th day of April AD 1833 judicial possession of the said premises was duly and formally given to the said Garcia by the proper officer, and the petitioner also alleges, that he received said tract of land by purchase from the said Francisco Garcia and that on the 16th day of October AD 1837, a deed of conveyance was duly executed by the said Garcia and wife to the petitioner.

In support of the foregoing allegations and averments, the petitioner has placed on file the original grant by Governor Alvarado to the said Francisco Garcia, also the original decree of judicial possession together with the deed of conveyance executed by the said Garcia and wife to the petitioner. The foregoing documents and title papers are all properly proved and authenticated.

There is no proof that any approval was ever made by the Legislative Assembly. The affidavit of Domingo Solano which is in full as evidence in the cause proves inhabitancy and cultivation of the tract claimed by the original grantee.

TO THE HON. ISAAC S. K. OGIER, JUDGE:

The Petition of ^{Cameron E. Thom} ~~Pacificus Ord~~, a resident of said City, County, and State, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, who petitions in this behalf for the United States, and being present here in Court, in the name and behalf of the United States, represents as follows: That heretofore, to wit: on or about the 9th day of February - A. D. 1853, James Watson

presented a petition to the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the private land claims in the State of California, when sitting as a Board, claiming a tract of land called San Benito,

in the County of Monterey State of California, which said petition is referred to for a description of the land claimed, a copy of which appears in the transcript hereafter referred to. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 17th day of January A. D. 1854, the said Commissioners confirmed, by final decision, the said claim of said petitioner. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 16th day of September A. D. 1854, a duly certified transcript of the proceedings and decision of the said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and evidence on which the said decision was founded, was filed in the Office of the Clerk of the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, and marked No. 562; reference to which it is prayed may be had and made part of this petition. That on or about the 30th day of August A. D. 1854, the Honorable Caleb Cushing, Attorney-General of the United States, received a duly certified duplicate of said transcript of the proceedings and decision of said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and

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evidence on which said decision was founded. That thereafter, to wit: on the 10th day of January A. D. 1855, the said Attorney-General of the United States filed, or caused to be filed, in behalf of the United States, a notice with the Clerk of said District Court of the United States, that the appeal in said cause from the said decision of the said Commissioners, in the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, would be prosecuted by the United States. Your petitioner further represents, that the land claimed, as aforesaid, is situate in the Southern District of California, and within the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court. Your petitioner further represents and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimant, presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further denies that the said claimant has any valid right or title to said land claimed as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said petition to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision confirming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

said claim should have been rejected by them. And the said claimant, having no valid right or title derived from the Spanish or Mexican Governments, to the land claimed as aforesaid, the lawful right and title in and to the said land was acquired by, and it now belongs to the United States, by virtue of conquest, and the Treaty of peace, friendship, limits and settlement, between the United States and the Republic of Mexico, made at the City of Guadalupe Hidalgo, February 2d, A. D. 1848.
