



Petition.

Pico de Castro widow of the late H^r Simeon Castro. Mariano Castro first, Mariano Castro second, Maria Antonia Castro, Jose Antonio Castro. From Pico Castro, Leandro Castro and Juan B Castro and Juana Castro, children & heirs of the said late H^r Simeon Castro, give notice that they claim a tract of land in said State, by virtue of a title and title derived from the Spanish & Mexican Governments. The said tract of land is of Eighty Hectares or thereabouts in quantity and in extent & known under the several names of the Bolsa, the Bolsa and the Mono Capo. A portion of said tract was granted in the year 1825 to said H^r Simon Castro by H^r Luis Arguello then Governor of the Province of Upper California and furnished possession thereof given. A further portion was granted to said H^r Simon Castro on the 24th May 1836, by Dr Mariano Chico Political Chief of said California as a further portion on the 20th December 1836, by H^r Juan B Alvarado Political Chief ad interim and who confirmed & the quantity & extent thereof designated by a decree dated 3rd September 1834, issued by Dr Mariano Melchorro de la Governor of the Department of the California.

The original documents attesting these several concessions and confirmations, with translations of the same are herewith presented & may be taken as a part of this petition. Said H^r Simon Castro died on the day of.

Manuel Larios a witness in behalf of the
Claimants. Mario Antonio Rio de Castrelo
petition Robt, and was duly sworn his voice
being interpreted by the Secy.

The U.S. Associate Law Agent was present.

In answer to questions by Counsel for the
Claimants, thot witness testified as follows.

My name is Manuel Larios, my age
is fifty four years & I reside at San Juan Ban
tista in the County of Monterey.

I was acquainted with the late
Simón Castro who is dead. I knew him all
my life time. He died many years ago. He left
at his decease a widow named María Anto-
nio Rio & several children all of whose names
I do not recollect. I remember that among them
were two named Manuel one Juan & another
María Antonia.

I am acquainted with the
Ranchas called Bolsa del Moro Coto & Bolsa
huera & Cañada de San Miguel. Simón
Castro put cattle on the ranchos in his lifetime
& since his death his children have occupied
it with cattle & the children have built a house
in the Cañada.

The three places before named
are separate portions of one rancho. The Moro
Coto has been occupied from the year 1825

In 1826 Simion Castro Caught Bolsa
Almendro & occupied it & during the time of
Govr Micheltorena at Puebla was occupied
by the father from the time of his arrival the
whole has been in the occupation of the claimant
to the present time.

Quesst. What is your homage & place of residence
Ans. My name is Juan B Alvarado, my age is
forty three years, and my residence is Contra
Casta County California.

Quesst. Are you acquainted with the Ranchos
Bolsa del Moro Cojo, Bolsa Nueve and Cunada
de San Miguel and if so state what you
know about the occupation of these places.

Ans - I am acquainted with the said places
The Moro Cojo was the property of Simion Castro
and has been occupied by him for many, five
years and upwards. Bolsa Nueve was afterwards
granted to Simion Castro it adjoins Moro
Cojo & has been occupied by the said Castro during

his life for about fourteen years and at his death by his family to this time. The place Canada de San Miguel adjoins the other places. This place was granted by the Mexican Govr of California in 1837 to the said Cashier who has occupied it ever since or his family. This property was cultivated and kept up & resided on by the said Cashier during his life and by his family since.

Ques. Are the heirs of Simon Cashier the persons who are named as claimants in this petition.
Ans. The petitioners in this case are the only heirs of said Cashier.

Ques. Please examine the documents you have shown to you and make exhibit who the parties are. And if you are acquainted with the hand writing of the parties whose names are written thereon, please say if they are genuine.

Ans. I have examined the said documents & exhibits. I am acquainted with the handwriting of all the persons whose names are signed to it, excepting Ignacio Gomez de Alvarado and Jose Maria Arrieta, and with that exception I know their signatures to be genuine.

This day before Commissioner R. H. Thompson came Miguel Castro, a witness in behalf of Claimants Ma. A. Pico de Castro et al. Question which was being sworn his oral answer being in Spanish was interpreted by the Secretary as follows.

Present Alvarado Atty. & U. S. Atty. Law Agent.

Witness says his name is Miguel Castro aged thirty seven years, Resided San Juan Bautista, Monterey Co. Cal.

Question by Claimants Atty.

Do you know the Rancho called Bolson Rana and Moro Caño. If so state how long you have known it. Where it is situated and in whose possession it has been during the time you have known it.

Answer

I knew said Rancho and had known it since my boy hood. say some 1827. it is situated about 8 leagues in a northwesterly direction from Monterey and on the Sea Coast. whom I just knew it Simon Castro was living on it with his family and continued to live there until his death since which time his family have continued to occupy and live on it. Simon Castro died some years before the American occupation of the Country. He had two small houses on it. I cannot remember when the first house was built. He had also cattle horses and mals on it and some land in cultivation.

Question by Some.

Describes particularly the boundaries of said

Rancho, mentioning the natural objects and the adjoining Ranches, which form such boundaries.

Answer.

On the South it is bounded by the Espinosa and Coopers Ranches, on the East on the Ranches of Saaguan Gomis and the Alveires, on the North the Rancho of Saaguan Soto, Calicos Larmaras, and the Rancho of Non Named known as Colorado and the Rancho of the Valladas, and on the West the Salbach and the Esturias.

Inquisition by Same.

State if you know the names of any particular points or places contained within the limits of said Rancho.

Answer.

Bofa de Moro Cojo, Bofa huua and the Canada de San Miguel are all places contained within said limits.

This day before Commissioner R. Aug
Thompson came Alvaro Gomez, a witness
on behalf of Claimant Mr. Pedro Castro Esq
Petition No. 606, and being sworn his evidence
being given in Spanish was interpreted by the
Secretary as follows.

Present Claimants Atty & U. S. Asst Law Offt.

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Witness states his name is Américo Go-
mez his age 25 years and residence Monterey
Calif.

Questions by Claimants Atty.

Do you know the Rancho called Boba
huco and more or less. If so state how long
you have known it, whence it is situated, who
has occupied it and the nature & value of the
improvements and cultivation of the land?

Answer.

I know said Rancho and have known
it ever since I came to California in the
year 1856. It is situated on the Sea Coast
and forms a peninsula between the Estuary
and the Sea and lies between Monterey, Santa
Cruz and San Juan Bautista on the left
of the road coming from Monterey. Simeon
Castro occupied it when I first knew it, and
continued to do until his death since which
time it has been occupied by his widow and
children. Simeon Castro died prior to the
month of October in the year 1842. They had
a house up of brick of poles when I first knew
it, in which the family lived, they afterwards
built another house of adobe. They had also

small houses on the land maintained by the Indians labours in their Employment. They had also Cows and Stocks of cattle and horses.

They also had some of the land in cultivation I do not know the precise extent but sufficient for the support of the Establishment.

Question - Look at the traced copy of the map filed in the Registry in this case and state whether you recognise the boundaries described therein and the points designated and if so describe said boundaries & points.

Answer. I recognise said map as a correct delineation of said Rancho and also the places and points theron designated. It is bounded by on the North by an Estuary which separates it from the Rancho of the Vallejos. On the East by the Ocean. On the South by another Estuary which separates it from the land of Tom Leopold and by the Ranch of Espinosa. On the East by the Rancho of my father Joaquin Gomez and that of Nicholas Alvarado. On the north East it adjoins the Ranches of Soto and David Ruiz John, known in the Country as "Colorado." Among the well known points contained in said Rancho are "La Balza del Moro Cojo" "La Boja de la Muerte" La Timblaadrá "La Cañada de San Iniguo", Chamiseo" &c.

Question by same. Are you well acquainted with the lands contained in said boundaries, if so state how much land in Tom Espinosa is contained in them.

Answer. I am perfectly familiar with said lands have been over them many times. The whole quantity contained within its limits including all the Puntas (points) is about Eight square Yards.

That he shall comply with the regulations which may be established by the ordinances to be provided for the distribution of unappropriated lands, and that in the mean time he the grantee nor his heirs shall have authority to divide nor alienate the land which is granted them, nor impled tail, bond, mortgage or other encumbrance thereon, although it should be for a just purpose, nor convey the same by will.

2nd. He shall have authority to fence it with a partition to the crossings, roads and paths of way, he shall enjoy the same freely and exclusively, making such adequate improvements thereon as he may deem best.

3rd. He shall solicit from the Captain judge that the judicial possession thereof be given to him in virtue of this decree by whom the boundaries shall be fixed, and at the limits of which independently of the monuments some just boundary stones shall be placed.

4th. The land of which the grant is made is a title more than one square legua in extent as appears from the declaration of the witness which was taken for that purpose. The Judge who shall give possession thereof shall cause it to be made measured as provided for by law, and should there be an excess it

Shall accrue to the Nation for such uses as it may deem best.

3rd. Should he have comply with those conditions he shall lose his title to the Lands and be made subject to adjudication by another person.

site is composed of one lagoon and several corals

on the north, another Estuary which is
bounded by the Rancho of Corporal
Francisco Gómez and at no time has afford-

therefore the Bolsa is bounded by the two Estuaries and has an entrance only on the part of the East and a pass on the north. It has a ~~green~~ "green" covered with willows and Palos, and to the East some low hills covered with Oak and thicker in the center there is a small Indian grove, which with difficulty is entered in consequence of its being adjoined to a ravine, into the end of the Bolsa, which is to the part of the West there is a hill covered with a thicket, where cattle can conceal themselves, there are about three flocks of arable land depending on the seasons. It has a lake which lasts all the year with other springs that are up. The stock consists of 115 head of cattle, 20 horses of oslow and band.

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Opinion

The claimants are provided by the testimony of Juan B Alvarado to be the husband and only heir of Simón Castro deceased to whom they also the land described in the petition was granted and under whom they claim the title as his legal representatives.

The property in question appears to have been granted to said deceased in three separate portions. The first called "El Moro Coto" stated to contain about two square leagues of land was granted for the purpose of placing his cattle thereon to said deceased by Governor Arguello on the 14th of February 1825 under whose order he was put into possession on the 9th day of March following. The second grant bears date May 14th 1826 & is signed by Governor Mariano Chico. This grant covers a portion of the premises claimed a title third that one square league in extent and known by the name of "Bolsa Huera". The third grant was made by Governor Alvarado on the 21st day of November 1837. This grant covers the land which has between the lands covered by the other grants and the boundaries of Joaquín Tok, Joaquín Gómez, Nicóles Alvarado and Salvador Espinoza. The application was for a provisional grant of the land for a watering place for the cattle of the grantee, and the grant is made in

accordance with the petition.

The title papers above

mention'd duly substantiated upon a Cedula in approbat by the Assembly has been obtained as to the first and third grant and with the exception of the act of putting the grants into possession under the first grant without a survey or description of the boundaries. In description of the lands granted or fence of the limits, lines or monuments by official act is shown. The condition of the title has such as is above mentioned at the time of the death of said Castro, the grantee. Soon after this event the widow forwarded to the Governor the title papers relative to the Estate, accompanied by a petition in behalf of his legal representation describing the land and alleging their occupancy and improvement of the same and soliciting a grant of the land covered by the former Concessions, being Eight Spanish Hectares to them as their legal property. On the 5th day of September 1844, Governor Micheltreher made a grant in accordance with this petition, and caused it to be delivered to the widow along with the previous grants to the widow, retaining a copy of her petition for the Archives. This grant covers all the land comprised in the three tracts before granted to the deceased the boundaries of which they were well and truly described. The testimony filed in the case shows that the three tracts as they were severally granted to said Castro, had been occupied by him, and that he lived upon and cultivated portions of the land until his death after which his widow and children continued to do the same.

We have instituted here by Critical Enquiry
as to any affectio or forfeiture of the title
of said Castro in the premises at the time of his
death. If he was the owner it descended to those
claimants as his legal representatives. If
his title was not good the government had the
right to dispossess of it and the claimants right
must then be tested under the grant of the entire
premises made to them by Governor Micheltimo
in September 1844.

This title would seem to es-
tablish a good equitable interest in the premises
The widow and children of the
deceased Simon Castro, on the land after his
death & then continued occupant of and improvement
of the place as shown by the testimonies are
sufficient to satisfy the requirements of the
negotiations then in force on the subject of col-
onization. The only question which pres-
ents any difficulty in the case is that of loca-
tion. The land described in the grant by which
it is known is the same which was described in
the other grants, which with their maps are to
find to form description and the same which
was occupied by said deceased. The first grant
to said Castro covers the land known as the
"Bolsa" called "El Moro Oyo". The second
covers the land known by the name of Bolsa
Huera adjoining the former. The term Bolsa
which signifies a house or sea hire also de-
signates a portion of land assuming the shape
of a purse or bag. This application of the term
was not unusual in this Country and is often
seen on the map which is attached to the Espe-
ciata of which a traced copy is filed in the
case shows that the term was aptly applied
in the case before us. The two portions of

land thus described were two peninsulas surrounded on all sides excepting the East by water. The grants were evidently taken and to cover the land contained in both of these peninsulas and of any question could have arisen as to the boundary on the side where they connect with the main land this question is disposed of by the terms of the third grant. The land described in the third grant is located on the East side of the two Bolas and commences the East line of said land, whatever may be its precise location. This third grant describes the land granted by assignation of the surrounding Ranchas and is not only itself clearly defined but also by its description obviates all difficulty as to the other portions of the entire premises claimed.

By the aid of the map above mentioned in connection with the descriptions given in the title papers, and the testimony of the witnesses on the subject of the location and the acceptance of the premises at the time the last grant was made, we think there can be no doubt as to the premises granted and how bounded or surrounding the land accordingly -

And your petitioner further represents, and insists that the said decree of said Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed, and set aside, for many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said Certified transcript of said Cause, now on appeal from said Commissioners to this Honorable Court.

And the said attorney denies all and singular each and every allegation in the said petition of said Claimants to said Commissioners of said date. And he further denies that any grants for said land were ever made as alleged in said petition. And he denies further that the said Claimants have shown any or sufficient evidence of the validity of the said claim.

And your petitioner further represents that the said claim is invalid, and the said decree erroneous, on the following grounds.
1. That the said alleged grants of Arguello, Chico, and Alvarado, ^{and Micheltorena,} were made in violation of the 4th article of the Colonization Law

of Mexico of the 18th of August AD 1824,
in this; that the land granted, as alleged
by Claimants, was and is within ten leagues
of the Sea Coast; and there is no evidence
shown by Claimants, that the Supreme
General Executive Power of Mexico, previously
approved of the Colonization of the public
lands in Upper California, lying within
ten leagues of the Sea Coast. And it is
