





Be it Remembered, that on this *twenty eighth day of December*, Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-~~Two~~, before the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America, the following Proceedings were had, to wit;

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The Petition of *Todoro Gonzales* for the Place named "*Rincon de la Punta del Monte*," was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 502, and is as follows, to wit;

To the Honorable the U. S. Land Commissioners for
the ascertaining & settling of private land claims in California.

The petitioner of Federico Gonzalez, a citizen of Cal-
ifornia respectfully sheweth unto your Hon. body, that
on the 9th of September U. S. 1836, he made & presented
his petition in writing to the Governor of California, soli-
citing for the benefit of himself & of his family, the grant
of a piece of land, called the Rancho de la punta del Norte
a description of which will be given hereafter.

Petition.

That Nicolas Gutierrez, then Governor of said Cal-
ifornia, referred the whole subject to the Ayuntamiento
of Monterey, to the Administrator of the Mission de Sal-
edad, & to the Just Alcade of Monterey, to decide whether the
land, prayed for, was free & liable to be granted, & whether
the petitioner possessed the necessary qualities, to be com-
plid with in his petition.

That all said reports being made in favor of your
petitioner, said Governor Gutierrez on the 20th day of Sep-
tember 1836 by virtue of the authority vested in him as
Constitutional Governor of California, declared your peti-
tioner the owner of said land, & ordered the proper docu-
ments, constituting title to be executed & delivered to
the same.

That such formal grant issued on the same day,
to wit, on the 20th Sept. 1836 & was confirmed & approved
by the Departmental Assembly, then in session.

And your petitioner further saith, that on the 11th
of December 1840 he obtained from the proper author-
ities juridic possession of all the lands so granted to
him as aforesaid.

And your petitioner further saith, that all the
documents relating to this subject, as petition, reference,
reports, the Governor's concession, together with a copy
of the original grant & map are on file in the archives

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of California, now in possession of the U. S. Surveyor General for the state of California, & that certified copies of all of them are herewith submitted & prayed to be made a part of this petition, but that the original grant, ^{papers} & the documents of juridic possession are in the hands of your petitioner & ready to be brought in evidence, whenever required.

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And your petitioner further saith, that the lands so granted to him are described as follows.

They are known as Rancho de la punta del monte. They contain about seven Spanish square leagues; they are situated in the present County of Monterey. They are bounded by the lands of Francisco Soto, of Juan Malvarin, & according to the documents of juridic possession more particularly described as follows: commencing at a large oak tree between the two houses near the Mission de Soledad running E. N. E. towards the Sanco situate at the entrance of the Canada 182 cords of 50 varas each, thence following the same direction to the Alamo 40 cords of 50 varas each, being the Canada which forms the boundary line with the land of Juan Malvarin, thence E. S. E. to the land of Francisco Soto 104 cords of 50 varas each, & thence from the Alamo at the entrance of the Canada 40 cords of 50 varas inside said Canada, thence leaving said Canada & running W. S. W. to the punta del monte, 138 cords thence E. S. E. back to the place of beginning.

And your petitioner further saith, that he has been in the quiet & peaceable possession of said lands since the time of obtaining said grant, exercising at all times full & undisputed ownership over the whole of the same, & is not aware of the existence of any title paramount or superior to his own.

He therefore claims to be the lawful owner of the

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lands above described & prays, that your Honorable body
in consideration of the premises will conform and
validate his claim & title thereto.

I, Teodoro Gonzalez a resident of this port de Monterey
 both, with due respect; before your Excellency, do say: that
 in consequence of my being established in this town, married, &
 the owner of some cattle, I solicited & obtained the grant of
 the place called Los Laureles, situated on the Coast of Car-
 mele, for the purpose of pasturing my cattle & dedicating
 myself to my former profession of an agriculturist, but
 unfortunately the sterility of the land & the scarcity of its
 pasturage place me under the necessity of soliciting another
 tract of land more adapted to my profession & to farming
 purposes, unavailing in case, that it be granted to me, the
 one which I at present possess, on account of the fruitlessness
 & damages sustained thereon by my cattle & agricultural
 labours. With this foundation, which I will prove should
 it be required, I request that your Excellency after taking the
 information & proofs which you may deem necessary, would
 be pleased to grant me in absolute ownership, the place
 called Rincon de la punta del Monte, situated between
 the Mission of La Soledad & the rancho of the Tomjones,
 bounded by the river of Monterey, which land, although
 it has in part been granted to Felipe Aguilera, he has
 not obtained the corresponding confirmation from the
 Most Excellent Deputation, nor consequently has
 the necessary title been given to him. As I know of
 my own knowledge that Felipe Aguilera has no known
 property, nor the possibility of obtaining any, on ac-
 count of his dissipated conduct which has reduced
 him to the class of a simple laborer, & on the other

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hand, as he has no wife nor children, I consider that I have the right to request that I be preferred in having said land granted to me, which he is about obtaining subreptitiously, as I am ready to prove by good witnesses either administratively or judicially as may be required & to the tenor of this petition, therefore, I request that your Excellency, after hearing the opinion of the Most Excellent Deputation, would be pleased to take the necessary proceedings with respect to said petition, admit the proofs which I offer, & give me the preference by granting me the before mentioned land, the length of which from North to South consists of three & a half leagues & its breadth of two leagues, as appears by the accompanying plot, & that you would order the title of ownership to be made out for me, as a favor which I request of your Excellency in Monterey on the eight of September, eighteen hundred & thirty one - Teodoro Gonzalez. Monterey, September ninth, eighteen hundred & thirty one - In conformity with the laws & regulations on the subject, the Ayuntamiento of this Capital will report, whether the party interested in this memorial be possessed of the necessary requirements to be attended to in regard to his petition, whether the land asked for, be comprised within the twenty boundary leagues, & the ten leagues from the sea coast, mentioned in the law of the 18th of August 1824, whether it be irri-gable subject to the seasons or calculated for watering, & pasturing, cattle, if it belong to the ownership of any private person, Mission, corporation or town, with all the rest which they may deem necessary to illustrate the matter. nor alienate the land granted to them, impose ground rent, entail, mortgages or any other burden although it may be for pious purposes, nor transfer it in mortmain.

2^d He may fence it in without prejudice to the crossings, roads & privileges, destining it to the use & cultivation which may best suit him, but within one year at furthest he shall build a house & it must be occupied & inhabited.

3^d He shall request the respective Justice to give him judicial possession in virtue of this title, said Justice will designate the boundaries, at the limits whereof he shall besides placing the land marks, plant some fruit trees or wild ones of some utility.

4th The land whereof donation is made consists of four square leagues (sitios de ganado mayor para aparceria) by the plot which accompanies the expediente. The Justice who gives possession, will cause it to be measured according to law, paying the surplus which may result to the Nation for the necessary uses.

5th If he transgress these conditions he shall forfeit his right to the land & it may be denounced by another.

I consequently command that these presents serving him for a title, & being held as valid, a record thereof be made in the proper book, & this be delivered to the party interested for his security & further ends.

Opinion of the Board by Comr R. Aug. Thompson.

The petition in this case presents a claim for a tract of land called Rincon de la Punta del Monte situated in the present County of Monterey containing seven leagues of land; It goes on however & describes the land by meter & bounds as set out in the act of judicial possession showing the quantity to be much less, & the grant itself is for but four leagues. This case presents some peculiarities which it may be proper to relate — The original petition for the grant was made by the grantee, & present claimant Teodoro Gonzalez, on the 8th of September 1836, & after making the customary inquiries & investigations, a decree of concession was entered, & the grant or title in form was made out & signed by the Governor Nicolas Pizarro, & the Secretary on the 20th of September 1836. No further step appears to have been taken in the matter until the 22^d day of May 1840, on which the expediente was presented to the Departmental Junta for its approval, & on the 26th of the same month the grant was duly approved by that body. It also appears from a certificate of Manuel Jimenez, Secretary of the Departmental Government of the Californias, dated the 4th of June 1840, that a complete copy of the whole expediente or record of proceedings in relation to the grant, including those of the Departmental Junta, approving it, accompanied by the original title were at that time taken out by the party interested. From this certificate it seems that the grant although duly executed by the Governor & countersigned by the

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Secretary in 1836 was never delivered to the party until after the approval of the Departmental Order in 1840. This circumstance becomes important from the fact, that the occupation & cultivation required by the Mexican colonization laws is only proven from that period. The grant contains the usual conditions requiring him to build a house within a year, which must be inhabited. As it is very clear that the grant would confer no legal rights upon the grantee, he cannot be presumed to have known the conditions upon which it was made, until it was delivered to him, it follows as a necessary consequence that the year within which the performance of these conditions was required must date from the period of delivery. This, the certificate of the Secretary shows, proves to have been on the 4th day of June 1840. The deposition of Don Abrego taken on the 23^d of March 1853, proves that he has known the land claimed for the preceding twelve years, that during all of that period it had been in the exclusive occupation & possession of the claimant; that he had during the same time lived upon it, cultivated and otherwise improved it, & had used it for grazing purposes. This evidence shows according to the former decisions of the board, a substantial compliance with the terms & conditions of the grant. With regard to the extent of the land claimed there seems to be a singular discrepancy between the petition, the grant, & the act of judicial possession. The first, sets out the claim as containing seven leagues of land & then goes on & describes it by miles & bounds as set forth in the act of judicial possession from which it would seem that the quantity actually measured off to the party was but about two leagues, while the grant itself

is for four. This discrepancy however will present no obstacle to a confirmation within the boundaries described in the judicial possession, the measurements showing that it does not exceed the quantity called for by the grant. The land claimed is described with sufficient accuracy to enable the Surveyor to locate & identify it. There is a slight mistake made by the officer giving the possession, by running the course in the last call of the survey. This is a mistake frequently made by more skillful & experienced surveyors, than those who usually act in that capacity in making judicial measurements in California. It is however readily corrected by reference to the object called for, & the other lines of the survey. An original document in Spanish dated Monterey May 31, 1849 purporting to be an assignment or conveyance by Esteban Munras & wife to the claimant, of a tract of land extending from the Punta del Monte de la Solidar, to the first house built by said Munras, & which he purchased in 1842 of Francisco Solo is attached to the testimonio or certified copy of the original expediente filed in the case. The genuineness of the signatures to this document has been proven, but no translation has been furnished nor is there any evidence, corroborating it in any manner with the case. It has therefore not been considered as entitled to any weight in the determination of the claim. The petition sets forth a claim to a specific tract of land which is described by well defined miles & bounds; to that tract of land so described, the evidence in our opinion shows that the claimant is entitled to a confirmation, & a decree will be entered accordingly.

The land of which confirmation is made, is known by the name of Rincon de la Punta del Monte, situated in the County of Monterey, being the same which has been held & occupied by the claimant from the year 1841 to the time of filing his petition before the board, & is bounded as follows. Beginning at an oak tree situated between the two houses & running E by N. E. towards the Sance one hundred & eighty two cords of fifty varas each; & from said Sance situated at the entrance of the Cañada, continuing the same course forty cords of fifty varas each to the Alamo; thence E by S. E. one hundred & four cords of fifty varas each to the boundary line of the land of Francisco Soló. Thence from the above Alamo situated at the entrance of the Cañada, forty eight cords of fifty varas, inside of the same, & one hundred & thirty eight outside running West by S. W. to the Punta del Monte. Thence W by N. W. one hundred & twelve cords of fifty varas each to the oak tree the point of beginning the same being of the extent shown by the judicial measurement, to which together with the original grant filed in the case, reference may be had for a more particular description.



On 8. Sept. 1836 appellee solicited for the land known as Rincon de la Punta del Monte. In this petition it is stated that ~~the~~ land a portion of the land had been previously granted to one Felipe Aguilera, but that his title not having been made complete he (the petitioner) prayed that a paper title should be made to him. The reason assigned to induce the Government to give the preference asked for, was the alleged misconduct of Aguilera which had reduced him to the position of a simple laborer, and his consequently inability to comply with the policy of the laws colonization law. This petition was referred to the ayuntamiento of Monterey for information on various points, & among them, they were charged with the duty of ascertaining if the land solicited for belonged to any private person. The report from that body was favorable to the purport of the petition, and refers specifically to

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the position of Aquilari relation
to the land. From their inves-
tigation of the point, "it re-
sulted, to me then our lan-
guage that Felipe Aquila ask-
ed for it (the land) previously, but
that this mandante does not
possess the means of extracting
it in conformity with the require-
ment of the law on the subject,
and that consequently the Political
chief is authorizing to give gran-
ting it." On receipt of this Report
the Govern. a C. Gutierrez issued
a grant ^{to} appellee dated 20 Sep.
1836 and ^{it} received the approval
of the Departmental Assembly
on 22 May 1840. Subsequent
to such approval, on 9 June
1840 as appears by the testimony
the grant was delivered to the
appellee, and shortly thereafter
he was placed in possession of the premises.
The genuineness of all these doc-
uments, is established by the tes-
timony. The objection made
by the Sri. Atty. U. S. to this docu-
mentary title is, that the land
was not the subject of grant, it
having been previously granted
to Felipe Aquila. In proof of this,
reference is made to the petition of

the

the grantee. The reply is, that the
 fact stated in the petition is clearly
 a mistake. By the investigations
 made by the Mexican
 Functionaries, to whom the
 subject was referred, it was
 ascertained no grant had is-
 sued to a given person, that he
 had merely solicited the land.
 It also appears he was deemed
 an unfit person to receive a grant
 by reason of his inability to study
 the land in conformity to law,
 and the whole matter was
 referred to the direction of
 the Political Chief. Until
 the grant issued it was his
 peculiar province to collect
 information and act upon it
 in the presence of grants, & the
 issue of grants. In the exer-
 cise of his discretion he refused
 to grant to the first applicant
 and did to the second. No title
 passed to the first applicant by
 his application. Every thing
 was in fieri, and the Govern-
 ment exercised a discretion and
 power vested in him by the law
 in selecting the applicant whom
 he thought most able to carry
 out the policy of the law. His
 act was enforced by the De-

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- Parliamentary assembly - We do not therefore consider the objection tenable which is made to the document, title on the ground above mentioned. The grant was not delivered to the appellee until 1840 - At this time his rights and obligations under it commenced from the date of the delivery, on inquiry as to his performance of conditions and substantial compliance with the Mexican colonization laws, were commenced from that date. - And the testimony establishes that for twelve years preceding to 23 March 1853 and during all that period the land had been in the exclusive possession & occupancy of appellee. That he had during that time built upon, cultivated and otherwise improved it and had used it for grazing purposes. Such acts establish a substantial compliance with the law. The grant describes the land granted as the land described in the map which accompanies the Expediente known as the Punta del Monte de la Solidaridad, and a claim annexed declares its extent to consist of four square leagues, and reserves the Solrante. The act of Judicial possession establishes the fact, that the quantity called for within the metes &

 is about ten leagues. The petitioners, for
 a claim for ^{the} tract of land called the
 Rancho de la Puente del Monte and de-
 -scribes it by ^{well defined} notes & bounds - and ^{the} pos-

 the appellee - To this land we concede
 the claim to be valid. The decision
