



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To the Honorable the United States Commissioners for ascertaining and settling private Land claims in California.

Station

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Maria Ignacia Borrego a resident of Los Angeles County, State of California represents. That she is owner in fee of the Ranch called "Los Feliz" granted to her by Manuel Micheltorena while Governor of California and having sufficient powers in the premises by and dated March 22nd 1843. Judicial possession by the proper Municipal authority was given her man said grant 29th day of March 1843. Your petitioner has fulfilled all the conditions of said grant. Which tract thus said is bounded on the North by the ranch of Julio Rodriguez, on the South by the river of the Pueblo of Los Angeles, on the East by the ranch of Juan Moreno and on the West by the Mountain and is more particularly described in said tract of judicial possession. It contains one & a half leagues of grazing land more or less according to the Diagram which accompanies the Expediente of said grant, and lies in the County aforesaid. There is no mining claim, it has not been surveyed by the U.S. Surveyor for California. Your petitioner relies on the following documents to prove said hire-with.

- 1st Copy of original grant marked A
- 2nd Copy of act of judicial possession marked B

These papers are accompanied by a Translation of the Grant marked 1. She will rely upon such other papers Evidence as may be necessary. And she prays that Your Superior Wisdom & sense of Justice may confirm her in the property & possession of said ranch.

On this day before Com. Hiram Knobles
came Abel Stearns a witness in behalf of the
Claimant Maria Ignacio Borrego petition No
416, & was duly sworn his evidence being given
in English.

The U. S. Associate Law Agent was present.

In answer to questions by Counsel for the Claimant
the witness testified as follows.

My name is Abel Stearns, my age is fifty
four years & I reside in the City of Los Angeles. I
have resided in California over twenty three years.

I am acquainted with the ~~dead~~ handwriting
& signatures of Manuel Micheltorma, Juan
Cristo Arco, Manuel Dominguez, Ignacio Coronel
& Jose Vicente Guerrero.

A paper is now shown me
supporting to be a grant to Maria Ignacio
Borrego of a tract of land called Feliz dated
22 March 1813, to which is attached a testimonial
of judicial possession dated in March 1813.

The signatures of the said several
persons appearing on said paper I believe to be
genuine. Said Dominguez was Alcalde at the date
of said possession & authorized to give on said
paper as he is anned & marked No. No. 201.

The land described in the foregoing
grant has been in the possession of the claimant
ever since the grant. It was occupied by
her deceased husband for many years before
the grant. He lived on the land with his family

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it did then about the year 1811 or 1812 & it
was afterwards granted to the Indian who
continues to occupy it to the present time.

The occupation of the land has
been by living on it, Cultivation & the keeping
of stock.



Whereas Dona Maria Ignacio
Borrego has asked for her personal benefit
and that of her family for the place known
by the name of "Los Felis". Located on the north
by Don Julio Borrego, by the South by the River
of the Pueblo, on the East by the ranch of the City in
Guam Morano, and on the West by the Mountain
the proceedings and legalistic investigations having
previously been gone through with as is directed by
the Laws and regulations. Exercising the authority
vested in me I have in the name of the Mexican
Nation concluded to grant the land aforesaid
declaring it to be her property by the present let-
ters subject to the approbation of the most Ex-
cellent Departmental and under the following
conditions.

1st. She may Enclose it without prejudice
to the cross roads and easements, She may farm
it freely and exclusively shooting & to the use
or cultivation that may most suit her, but within
one year she shall build a house and it shall
be inhabited.

2nd. She shall be subject to pay the ground
rent or assessment imposed if it should result
that the aforesaid land belongs to the borders
of the City of Los Angeles, when the measurement
of its lands is verified.

3rd. She shall request of the proper Judge
to give her judicial possession by virtue of this
dispatch whereby the boundaries shall be de-
fined, within the limits of which she shall
place in addition to this land marks some
straw or forest trees of some utility.

4th. The land of which grant is made is of one
league and a half of grazing land as is claimed
by the Diagram which accompanies the lease
to the Esquadrante. The Judge who shall grant has
session shall have it measured in conformity
with the ordinance leaving the surplus that re-
sults to the Nation for Ornamental and purposes.
5th. If she shall violate these conditions she
shall lose her right to the land and it shall be
disponible by another.

Wherefore I order that the
present serving her for a full account thereof
be taken in the corresponding book and it be
delivered to the party interested for his security
and further purposes.

Translation
of Act of
Divided
possession

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On the same day, month & year being on the place "Las Peñis" for the purpose of effecting the measurement & act of possession for Don Ignacio Verdugo of the said place of Peñis, although legalities of law having been first attended to & causing the Assistant Notary & the Cord Bearers to be present, I caused a cord to be measured of fifty varas, which was examined & recognised by me & having tied to its extremities two wooden handles & after an observation and calculation by my order the end was stretched from the corner of the River mouth (direction) North of one thousand one hundred & fifty varas were measured & reckoned from this place point (direction) East the end was stretched & six thousand & two hundred varas were measured & reckoned which ended at a "Mopaliza" (prickly pear tree) & it was marked as a boundary. From this place taking a Southern direction the end was stretched & five thousand varas were measured & reckoned which ended at a "Calva" (Kiln) which is out this place.

The cord was stretched in direction West & there were measured & reckoned seven thousand & one hundred varas which ended at the place of beginning.

Opinion

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The petitioner in this case based his claim on a grant issued to him by Governor Michilloroma, on the 22nd of March 1813, which grant is proved to be genuine. He further shows that judicial possession of the tract of land described in said grant was duly given to him on the 29th day of March A.D. 1813.

There is no proof that any approval was ever made by the Departmental Assembly and no Espadiente has been filed.

The 8th Condition of the grant refers to the map for a description of the land granted. No such map has been produced. It is doubtless to be found in the Espadiente and should have been filed. In many cases the party endangers his case by neglecting to file a true copy of the Espadiente, which generally contains a map, and is of essential aid in ascertaining the boundaries of the land claimed.

Wherever there is an Espadiente to be found a copy of it should be filed as it gives a more satisfactory history of all the proceedings in the case than can be derived from any other source.

The proof in this case shows a substantial and ample performance of the material conditions of the grant and the record of judicial measurement sufficiently describes the tract granted, so that its location may be ascertained.

A decree of confirmation will therefore be entered.



TO THE HON. ISAAC S. K. OGIER, JUDGE:

The Petitioner Pacificus Ord, a resident of said City, County, and State, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, who petitions in this behalf for the United States, and being present here in Court, in the name and behalf of the United States, represents as follows: That heretofore, to wit: on or about the 26th day of October — A. D. 1852, Maria Ignacio Verdugo, (or Berdugo)

presented a petition to the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the private land claims in the State of California, when sitting as a Board, claiming a tract of land called Los Felis, situated in the County of Los Angeles - State of California, which said petition is referred to for a description of the land claimed, a copy of which appears in the transcript hereafter referred to. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 28th day of February A. D. 1854, the said Commissioners confirmed, by final decision, the said claim of said petitioner. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 8th day of November A. D. 1854, a duly certified transcript of the proceedings and decision of the said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and evidence on which the said decision was founded, was filed in the Office of the Clerk of the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, and marked No. 416; reference to which it is prayed may be had and made part of this petition. That on or about the 28th day of September A. D. 1854, the Honorable Caleb Cushing, Attorney-General of the United States, received a duly certified duplicate of said transcript of the proceedings and decision of said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and

evidence on which said decision was founded. That thereafter, to wit:
~~on the 27th~~^{2nd} day of February A. D. 1855, the said
Attorney-General of the United States filed, or caused to be filed, in
behalf of the United States, a notice with the Clerk of said District
Court of the United States, that the appeal in said cause from the said
decision of the said Commissioners, in the District Court of the United
States for the Southern District of California, would be prosecuted by the
United States. Your petitioner further represents, that the land claimed,
as aforesaid, is situate in the Southern District of California, and within
the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court. Your petitioner further represents
and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said
Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for
many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified
transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said
cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all
and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimant,
presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further
denies that the said claimant has any valid right or title to said land claimed
as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

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And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said peti-
tion to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision con-
firming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

said claim should have been rejected by them. And the said claimant, having no valid right or title derived from the Spanish or Mexican Governments, to the land claimed as aforesaid, the lawful right and title in and to the said land was acquired by, and it now belongs to the United States, by virtue of conquest, and the Treaty of peace, friendship, limits and settlement, between the United States and the Republic of Mexico, made at the City of Guadalupe Hidalgo, February 2d, A. D. 1848.

Wherefore, the said Pacificus Ord, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, for and in behalf of the United States, by reason of the premises, and in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California," approved March 3d, A. D. 1851, and the laws and statutes in such case made and provided, prays that the said claimant, or his attorney may be served with a copy of this petition; and that this Honorable Court will review the said decision of said Commissioners, and reverse the same; and decide on the validity of the same, and decree the alleged title to be invalid: with costs and general relief.



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
