



Petition

Your Petitioner Francisco Arce a citizen
and a native of California respectfully
showeth

That he claims to be the owner of
the tract of land known as "Santa Isabel"
situate in the county of San Luis Obispo
and bounded and described as follows
viz: On the North by "San Miguel"
On the south by "La Ascension", on the
East by the place known as "La Estrella"
and on the West by the range of hills
lying to the west of the main road lead-
ing from "La Ascension" to San Miguel
containing four square Leagues.

That your petitioner claims said land
under and by virtue of a grant thereof, made
to your petitioner on the twelfth day of
May A.D. 1844, by Manuel Micheltorena
then Governor of Alta California and duly
empowered to make the same.

That on the 15th day of June A.D. 1846,
the said grant was duly confirmed by the
Departmental Assembly of California.

That the said grant and a translation
of the same are herewith filed.

That the Expediente of said titles containing the
original petitions of your petitioner to
Gov Micheltorena. The reference by the latter,
the various reports to him, the dising of
the tract, the decree, and a copy of the grant,
are on file in the archives of the former
Government of California now in the
possession of the Surveyor General of
the W.S. for Cal, and that fac simile
copies of the same, duly certified by him
with translations thereof are herewith filed.

That a similarly certified copy of the
Records of the said Departmental Assembly
showing said approval and a translation
of the same, all also herewith filed.

Your Petitioner therefore prays Your Honorable Board to confirm his said claim and title to said tract of land.

That your petitioner has been in quiet and exclusive possession of said tract of land, ever since the date of said grant, and that he knows of no claim conflicting with his own.



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Excellent Sir Governor!

I, Juan^o Arce, a Native of this
Department, before Your Honor with due
respect and as best may tend to the purpose
represent; That desiring to devote my
self to the honorable occupation of agriculture
and breed of cattle, which is of so vital an
importance in this country, as well for its
usefulness to myself as for the public good,

I solicit you to be pleased to grant me
the ownership of a location which is positively
vacant in the environs of the establishment
of San Miguel, Known by the name of Santa Isabel
which I claim in due form, bordering to the
North on San Miguel, to the South on the
location called La Ascension, to the West
on the high lands which are situated on the
other side of the high way and to the East
on the location called La Estrella, in extent
your square leagues (sitios de ganado mayor)
a little more or less, as is shown in the
sketch which I duly annex hereto.

Therefore I pray your humbly to accede
to my petition, whereby I expect to receive
favor.

The land solicited in the present petition is one of those that formally were given by the Mission of S^r M^{ig}el; there belongs with three thousand vines (cepas de vina) which actually exist with a stream and pastures, and I believe it would be convenient to retain it for the maintenance of the reduced Missions, their cattle, and inhabitants; except the superior opinion of the Governor of the Department.

To the Secretary of State:

Now I have three petitions in this instance to be granted the land called Santa Isabel bordered as therein expressed. By the report of the R. Fathers of San Antonio results that there on said land still exist some vines (cepas de vina) belonging to the establishment of San Miguel, and through His Reverence gives to understand that it would be convenient to retain those plants and the whole location solicited, in favor of the

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same Establishment, yet this Prefectura is, of opinion, founded in truth, that the said site is vacant without produced, of which the said establishment has other lands sufficient, and that the mentioned vines (cepas) are in a state of daily destruction on account of their total abandonment.

Don Francisco Arce ought to be preferred to the concession of this services and good circumstances (conduct) wherefore if this Prefectura has already given a report to the Government in favor of Don Ezequiel Soberanes, it did so because it did not know that Dr. Arce had solicited before him. From what is represented you will with your usual dissemination, report what you believe most just.

Excellent Sir Governor;

The solicitation of Don Francisco Arce is one year old, and consequently is prior to that of Dr. Marcales and that of Dr. Soberanes, and though in the petition of this last one, I have already manifested the reasons why his solicitation should not be attended to, I repeat in regard to the persons and merits of Dr. Marcales and Dr. Arce as H.E. knows them well. You can please to favor him, whom you shall consider to be most meritorious.

Manuel Micheltorenus, presented themselves
the Captain of the Port Don Pedro Narvaez
and Don Horacio Aree, in order to agree on
the differences that occurred on reason
of both having both solicited one and the
same land, and having heard the
grounds and allegations of each other:
His Excellency determined and the interes-
ted parties agreed to divide it, retaining
the part of the Pass of Robles for Dr
Narvaez, and that of Sta. Ysabel for

In Arce, the River of San Miguel being the principal boundary which divide the location as the respective sketches show, the pretenders remaining obliged to pay the amount that may be appraised of the improvements and other plantations which may be found on it.

And for due testimony hereof this Excellency the interested parties and the Secretary of State set their hands,

The Citizen Manuel Michel Torena Brigadier General in the Mexican Army, Adjutant General of the Plaza Mayor of the same, Governor Commander General and Inspector of the Department of both California's.

Whereas Don Francisco Arce has solicited for his personal benefit the locations known by the name of Sta. Isabel, bordering on the land called La Ascension, on the River of San Miguel, which intersects lies between the said location and on the high lands that lies (looks) to the East, after having previously taken the necessary action I and made the necessary investigations, according to the requirements of clauses and regulations - in exercise of the powers vested in me in the name of the Mexican Nation, I have concluded to grant him the said land, declaring in this prospect by the present letters patent, and under the following conditions:

1st He shall not have the power to sell, alienate or mortgage it, nor subject it to rent, entail or any other incumbrance
 2nd He may fence it without prejudicing the crossings, roads or servitudes; he will enjoy it freely and exclusively, appropriating

in tolerance or culture that best may suit him, but within one year at most he will build a house to be inhabited.

3. He will solicit of the respective judge to give him judicial possession in virtue of this document, by whom the boundaries are to be marked, on the extremities of which he will put besides the land marks some fruit trees or wild ones of some utility.

4. The land granted is four square leagues (sitios de ganado Mayor), a little more or less, as the respective sketch shows.

The judge who shall give the possession will cause it to be measured conformable to ordinance, leaving the surplus that may result to the Nation for convenient purposes.

5. If he should violate these conditions he will lose his right to the lands and may be denounced by any other party.

Consequently I order that these presents serving him as a title deed and being held as firm and valid, it be entered in the respective books, and delivered to the interested party for his security and other purposes,

Whereas Don Francisco
 Free has claimed for his personal
 benefit and that of his family the location
 known by the name of Sta Isabell, bordering
 upon the tract of land called la ascen-

 having previously taken the necessary action

 him the land mentioned, subject to the
 approbation of the Excellent Departmental
 Assembly and under the following
 conditions.

1st. He shall not have the power to
 sell, alienate or mortgage it, nor sub-
 ject it to debt, entail, bind or any
 other circumstance.

2^d. He may fence it without prejudice
 to the crossings, roads and servitudes;
 he will enjoy it freely and exclusively, ap-
 propriating it to the use or culture of that
 best man suit him, but within
 a year he will build a house to be
 inhabited.

3rd. He will solicit of the respective
 judge to give him judicial posse-
 sion in virtue of this document,
 by whom the boundaries are to be
 marked, on the extremities of which
 he will put besides the land marks,
 some fruit trees or wild ones of some
 utility.

4th The land granted is four square leagues (*sitios de gunados mayor*) a little more or less, as is exhibited in the respective sketch. The Judge who shall give the possession will cause it to be measured conformably to ordinance, leaving the surplus that may result to the Nation for convenient purposes.

5th If he should violate these conditions he will lose his right to the land and may be denounced by another party.

Consequently I order that these presents serving him as a title-deed and being held as firm and valid, be entered in the respective book and delivered to the interested party for his security and other purposes.

Francisco Arez v. "Santa Isobel"
The United States 4 Leagues

The Petitioner in this case claims
by virtue of a grant issued by Governor
Micheltorena, and bearing date the 13th day
of May A.D. 1844. The papers on
file show that said Grant was approved by
the Departmental Assembly on the 15th day of
July A.D. 1846. The signatures of Governor
Micheltorena and Manuel Jimeno are both
proved to be in their handwriting.
It is proved by the deposition of Manuel

Castro, that the place called Santa Isabel was, in the year 1845 in the possession of the claimant who had servants and cattle upon it and cultivated it. This is all the evidence in regard to the inhabitation of the land adduced by the claimant. There is no proof that any judicial measurement was even made of the premises. The grant has all the usual conditions one of which requires that he shall build a house within a year and that it shall be inhabited.

The proof does not show anything from which a compliance of this condition could be inferred.

He had servants it seems on the place, but there is nothing to show that he ever lived there himself, indeed the contrary is plainly indicated. Besides the grant is for a specific quantity of land to be located within certain exterior boundaries referred to in the grant, and designated on the map which accompanied the claimants petition to the Government. The party was required to apply to the proper officer for the judicial measurement of the four leagues granted him, and the judge who might make the measurement was enjoined to leave the surplus to the nation. It does not appear that the party in interest ever made any such application for judicial possession or measurement, neither does it appear that any measurement was ever made during the existence of the Mexican Government, we have so repeatedly expressed our views on this question that we deem it only necessary in the present instance to state the facts and announce the conclusion.

It is clear then that no ~~judicial~~ segregation of the four leagues granted was ever made by authority of the Mexican Government, and this commission has no power to make it now. The claim in this case as well for want of equity in the performance of conditions, as for want of identity and location is deemed

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To be invalid. A Decree in conformity with
the opinion will be entered.


