



Anno Domini One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Two, before
the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in
the State of California, sitting as a Board in the City of San
Francisco, in the State aforesaid, in the United States of America,
the following Proceedings were had, to wit:

The Petition of Emigdio Vajar,
for the place named
"Boca de la Playa",
was presented, and ordered to be filed and docketed with No. 482, and
is as follows, to wit;

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To the Honorable The United States Commissioners for Ascertaining and Settling Private Land Claims in California

Petition

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Your petitioner Domingo Vigar resident of the County of Los Angeles & State of California respectfully represents that he claims to be owner in fee simple of the place called "Boca de la Playa" situated in said County and containing one and a half leagues of grazing land more or less. Said place was granted to petitioner by Pio Pico while Governor of California and vested with ample power in the premises by and of grant in full dated the 7th of May AD 1846 and petitioner was put in judicial possession thereof by the proper authority on the 19th of April AD 1847. That from and ever since the date of said grant the petitioner has occupied said place with cattle and permanent improvements and has made it the residence of his family fulfilling all the conditions of said grant. In said grant & act of judicial possession said place is bounded on the North by the Marsh which is also granted to him, on the East by the boundary lines of the Ranchos of Juan Postu and Felipe Cardos on the South by the Sea Coast and on the west by the first hills of the Canada at the mouth of the Sea Coast and lies not far from the Ex. M. H. of San Juan Capistrano. It has not been surveyed by the United States Surveyor General for California. There is no interfering claim. Your petitioner relies in support of his claim upon the following documents Evidence and herewith.

1st Copy of the original grant marked "A"
2d Copy of Act of Judicial Possession marked "B"
Accompanied by a true Translation of said grant marked C. And he will rely upon such other documentary Evidence and parol Evidence as may be necessary. And he prays Your Honorable Board to confirm him in his claim and as speedily as possible.

In answer to questions by Counsel for the claim
ant the witness testified as follows.

My name is Abel Stearns my age is fifty
four years & I reside in Los Angeles.

A paper is now shown me purporting
to be a grant to Emigdio Vigar dated 1st of May
1815 to which is attached a testimonial of judicial
possession dated 19th of April 1847. The signatures
of Pio Pico, Jose Matias Moreno, Julian Chavis
Leonardo Cota & Jose Ma. Herrera appearing
on said paper I believe to be genuine I am acquainted
with their signatures. Said Chavis was an
acting Alcalde at the date of said judicial posse-
ssion. Said paper is hereto annexed marked A.A.
No 1.

I know the place called Boca de la
Plaza. It is in this country near the Mission of San
Juan Capistrano. In August 1846, I was at the
house of said Vigar on the place. He had a house
there in which he resided & had cattle & horses. The
house appears to have been built sometime before
I think it must have been there two or three years
perhaps more. It was an Adobehouse & he had
also corrales. He continues to occupy it to the present
time.





mencionado declarandole la propiedad de

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Felipe Carrillo, entre San Mateo y las

 se ataron a sus extremos unos bancos de
 madera, y prebia observacion y circulo por
 mi disposicion se tiro el primer cordel
 rumbo Este y se midieron y contaron
 Seis mil quinientas varas que rema-
 taron en el segundo decacho, lindero de
 Dr. Felipe Camillo donde se mando
 poner una mojonera. Suego de este pun-
 to se tiro el segundo cordel con direccion
 al Norte treinta grados al Este y se
 midieron y contaron cinco mil varas que
 remataron en la punta de una loma don-
 de se haya una mojonera lindero de
 Dr. Juan Kotter y de D. Felipe Camillo.
 En seguida de este mismo punto y con
 direccion al Norte cuarenta grados al
 Oeste, se midieron y contaron cinco mil
 varas que remataron en una cuchilla
 alta que da vista para la Cañada de la
 mina vieja, donde tambien se mando
 poner una mojonera. De este lugar
 y para concluir la remision de este sitio

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Whereas the Citizen Emigdio Vigar has petitioned for his personal benefit and that of his family for the land known by the name of the "Boca de la Playa" in the jurisdiction of San Juan Capistrano, exercising the powers imposed upon me by the Superior Government. I have concluded in name of the Mexican Nation by decree of this day to grant to the said Vigar the land aforesaid declaring it his property by the present letters, acting in conformity with the law of 18th of August 1824 and the regulation of the 1st of November 1828 reserved for the approval of the N.E. Departmental Assembly and under the following conditions.

1st. He may enclose it without prejudice to the crossings, roads and easements he may farm freely and exclusively devoting it to the use or culture that may better suit him.

2nd. He shall ask of the proper Judge to give him the judicial possession in virtue of this Dispatch, whereby the boundaries shall be designated with the corresponding land marks.

3d. The land of which grant is made is surely that which the Diagram shows and bounded on the North by the marsh ("Cinco") which is also granted. On the East by the boundary lines of the Rancho of Don Juan Foster and those of the place granted to Don Felipe Cardo between San Matto and the Pulgas. On the South by the sea coast and on the West by the first hills of the Canada of the mouth of the sea coast. The Judge who shall give the possession shall have it measured agreeably to ordinance, in sight of the Diagram with previous notice to the neighbors and he shall note the number of leagues of grazing land it comprises.

Wherefore I order that the present title being held firm and valid account thereof be taken in the corresponding Book and be delivered

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to the party interested for his protection and
further ends.

B. Whereas Octavio Emingdo Vilar has
solicited for his personal benefit and for the
benefit of his family, the tract of land known
by the name of "Boca al la Playa", in the In-
diction of San Juan Capistrano, in the exercise of
the authority with which I am Empowered by the
Supreme Government in the name of the Mexican
Nation, I have Concluded by a Decr. of this
day to grant to the said Vilar the said tract of
land hereby Declaring unto him the ownership
thereof acting in Conformity with the Law of the
18th of August 1824 and the Regulation of the
21st of November 1825 Subject to the approval
of the most Excellent Departmental Assembly
And under the following conditions -

1st. He may Enclose it without Prejudice to
the Crossings Roads Highways and Servitudes he
Shall Enjoy it freely and Exclusively appropriating
it to the use and Cultivation that he may deem most
2d. He shall Soltit of the proper Indago the
Imperial possession by virtue of this Dispatch
by whom the Commandant of the said Disposition
by the corresponding landmarks.

3d. The land of which Concession is hereby
made is only that which the state designates and
is bounded on the W. by "La Crincha", which is
also Embraced in the grant on the E. by the Compa-
nies of the Rancho of Don Juan Foster and
the place granted to Don Felipe Carrillo between
San Matto and Las Pulgas, on the S. by the
Beach and on the N. by the first huis of the
canada al la Boca "al la Playa". Having
previously told the aforesaid Land Holders
the Indago who gives the possession shall cause it
to be Measured according to law with reference
to the state and specify in his Official Return
the number of "Setios de canada mayor" in
Entrances, Therefore foras that the

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present title being true form and binding an
entry thereof be made in the corresponding Book
and that this be delivered to the interested party for
his security and other purposes.

At the City of Los Angeles on the 19th day
of the month of April 1847, in attention to the sole
Station of Don Omiglio Vigar that the said
real possession of the place called "Boca de la
Playa" Situate within the Jurisdiction of San
Juan Capistrano, belongin to him of which he
presented the respective title issued by the Supreme
Government under date of May 7th 1846, I passed
to the place with assiting witnesses and proceeded
to give the said possession in entire Conformity
with the aforesaid title. (or let me and the assis-
ting witnesses repeat and let the said possession
proceed to be given &c. Thus I Julian Chaois
Signed. Registered at the Alfarious Plantamiento
and acting as Alcalde 2^d, by the inhibition of the
Alcalde, decreed ordered and Seigned, with the
assiting witnesses, according to Law. Seign
Julian Chaois (Signed) Leonardo Castro
Cota, as the witness (Signed) Jose Ina Her-
nandez, as the witness. In continuation of
serve the aforesaid land holders with an offi-
cial notice, informing them that the object for
which I was going to the place of the "Boca
de La Playa" was to measure it and put in

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possession thereof. Since Don Emigdio began
and has much as the aforesaid adjoining land
holders (coincidentes) accorded thus assent
thereto without manifesting any objection & noted
it in my return thereof which I authenticated
and signed with the assisting witness according
to law. (Signed) Julian Chavis, Segundo
asstg witness Leonardo Coto (Segundo), asstg
witness Jose M^a Herrera. In continuation
of the proceedings and being now at the place of
the "Boca de la Playa" I appointed two cordel
bearers, who were Miguel Berdugo and Acacio
Rodriguez to whom I made known the object of
this appointment the duties of which they agreed
to discharge faithfully and loyally thus they assen-
ted and will now sign their names not knowing fully
how to write and I signed it with the assisting
witnesses according to law. Signed Julian Chavis
(Signed) asstg wit. Leonardo Coto, Segundo
asstg with Jaso M^a Herrera. In continuation
and being at the "Boca de la Playa" at the foot
of the hill which is at the edge of the Beach and
being present the assisting witnesses and cordel
bearers, I ordered to lay a simple cordel of
one hundred varas at either extremity of which
was fastened a wooden stake and after having
fixed upon a place of departure the first cor-
del was stretched by my direction towards the
East, and there were measured and counted 7500
varas to the second "Pishicho", the boundary of
Don Felipe Carillo where a land mark was
ordained to be placed thence the cordel was stretched
to the N. 30° E, and there were measured and
counted 5000 varas which terminated at the point
of a hill where third ordained mark a boundary of
Don Juan Pastor and Don Felipe Carillo, being
N 45° W, there were measured and counted 5000
varas which terminated at the top of a high hill
which looks towards the Old Mission (Mission
Vieja,) whose a land mark was also ordained
to be placed thence and to conclude the measurement

of the said Sitio the last Corral was strucked
towards the S. 70° W. and there were measured and
counted 8200 varas which terminated at the
place of beginning and the interested party being
content therewith I pronounced the possession
given in the name of the Mexican Nation and the
Laws with which the proceedings were concluded
and signed by me and the assisting witness, accord-
ing to law, saying, Julian Chaves, signed
asstg witness Leonardo Coto, signed, Assg
wth Jose Maria Herrera. August 20th
1847. Let a certified copy of the present return
be given to the party for his safety and security.

I, Thus Julian Chaves, Mayor de Ciudad
Rigidor of the Illustrisimo Ayuntamiento and
acting as 2^d Alcalde by the intimation of the 2nd
Alcalde, proper, named ordered and signed
it with the assisting witness, according to law

Herrera - This was made in the respective
Book and the said authenticated copy delivered to



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Opinion

The petitioner has given in Evidence
fully authenticated a grant of the land
claimed made to him by Governor Pio Pico
auth^r 1st May of 1846. By the deposition
of Abel Stevens it is proved that he had an
adobe house on the land the same year that the
grant was made in which he resided and that
he has continued to live on the place to the pres-
ent time. The land so granted and descri-
bed by a Specification of the exterior limits
the exterior premises within the boundaries being
conceded. A judicial measurement was not
necessary in order to define the location or limits
of the land granted. Such measurement how-
ever was obtained in April 1847 and appears
to have been made in accordance with the lines designated
in the grant. A description according to the
terms used in either of them would be sufficient
to identify the land and segregate it in satisfac-
tion of the grant, without recurring into the
validity of the judicial Survey made in 1821 if the
claimant is entitled to a confirmation and a
decre^r will be entered accordingly.



TO THE HON. ISAAC S. K. OGIER, JUDGE:

The Petitioner of Pacificus Ord, a resident of said City, County, and State, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, who petitions in this behalf for the United States, and being present here in Court, in the name and behalf of the United States, represents as follows: That heretofore, to wit: on or about the 12th day of November A. D. 1852, Emigdio Vcjar,

presented a petition to the Commissioners to ascertain and settle the private land claims in the State of California, when sitting as a Board, claiming a tract of land called Boca de la Playa — situated in the County of Los Angeles State of California, which said petition is referred to for a description of the land claimed, a copy of which appears in the transcript hereafter referred to. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 14th day of ~~March~~ A. D. 1854, the said Commissioners confirmed, by final decision, the said claim of said petitioner. That thereafter, to wit: on or about the 8th day of November A. D. 1854, a duly certified transcript of the proceedings and decision of the said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and evidence on which the said decision was founded, was filed in the Office of the Clerk of the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, and marked No. 482; reference to which it is prayed may be had and made part of this petition. That on or about the 12th day of October A. D. 1854, the Honorable Caleb Cushing, Attorney-General of the United States, received a duly certified duplicate of said transcript of the proceedings and decision of said Commissioners in said cause, and the papers and

evidence on which said decision was founded. That thereafter, to wit: on the 27th day of February A. D. 1855, the said Attorney-General of the United States filed, or caused to be filed, in behalf of the United States, a notice with the Clerk of said District Court of the United States, that the appeal in said cause from the said decision of the said Commissioners, in the District Court of the United States for the Southern District of California, would be prosecuted by the United States. Your petitioner further represents, that the land claimed, as aforesaid, is situate in the Southern District of California, and within the jurisdiction of this Honorable Court. Your petitioner further represents and insists, that the said claim is invalid; and the said decision of said Commissioners is erroneous, and ought to be reviewed, reversed and set aside, for many errors and imperfections of law and evidence, apparent in said certified transcript of the proceedings and decisions of said Commissioners in said cause, filed and appealed from as aforesaid. And your petitioner denies all and singular, each and every allegation in the said petition of said claimant, presented as aforesaid to said Commissioners. And your petitioner further denies that the said claimant has any valid right or title to said land claimed as aforesaid, or any part thereof.

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And no sufficient proof having been made of the allegations in said petition to said Commissioners, or in support of the said claim, no decision confirming the same should have been made by said Commissioners; but the

said claim should have been rejected by them. And the said claimant, having no valid right or title derived from the Spanish or Mexican Governments, to the land claimed as aforesaid, the lawful right and title in and to the said land was acquired by, and it now belongs to the United States, by virtue of conquest, and the Treaty of peace, friendship, limits and settlement, between the United States and the Republic of Mexico, made at the City of Guadalupe Hidalgo, February 2d, A. D. 1848.

Wherefore, the said Pacificus Ord, Attorney of the United States for the Southern District of California, for and in behalf of the United States, by reason of the premises, and in pursuance of the Act of Congress, entitled "An Act to ascertain and settle the Private Land Claims in the State of California;" approved March 3d, A. D. 1851, and the laws and statutes in such case made and provided, prays that the said claimant, or his attorney may be served with a copy of this petition; and that this Honorable Court will review the said decision of said Commissioners, and reverse the same; and decide on the validity of the same, and decree the alleged title to be invalid: with costs and general relief.
